A State	tower, according to Maia's statement to newsmen upon landing, informed him that there was no traffic in the area at the time. After the initial
	sighting, the plane's occupants reportedly continued to watch the objects until the sireraft was about one minute from touchdown in Luendz; at that point they (the objects) vanished.
	The description of the objects as reported in the local press was admittedly tyague, and several witnesses including Commandant Maia explained this by the high speed, manuverability, and distance from the plane, of what they
	caw. Maia's only other reported ections was that he ned indeed seen "two lights at the side of my aircraft." Cther unattributed observations
	were that the objects radiated an orange glow, and that they continually manuvered in swift dives and climbs while accompanying the plane.
	As a sequal to this story, the local press reported on December 13, that TAP Headquarters in Liebon and issued a statement on the incident. Citing the company's "promountary investigation based on the captain's report,"

FAA To Send Tapes, Records To Washington ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP): - Federal Aviation Administration officials say they will send on to Washington their radar tapes and records from an inquiry into a Japan Air Lines pilot's report that a UFO followed his plane over Alaska.

Because of public interest in the case, the agency interviewed the pilot, Kenji Terauchi, a second time Friday, said FAA spokesman

Paul Steucke.

Terauchi told investigators three lights started following his Boeing 747 cargo jet Nov. 17 just after it crossed into Alaska from Canada, and stayed with him for 55 minutes.

He said two of the lights were about eight feet across, while the third appeared to be part of a darkened globe with a diameter of perhaps two aircraft carriers placed end-to-end, Steucke said.

The pilot said the large unidentified flying object registered on his cockpit weather radar. But images on military radar screens at the time were dismissed as ``clutter,'' and a blip that showed up on FAA screens was considered a coincidental ''split image'' of the aircraft, Steucke said.

A JAL spokeswoman said Terauchi was on a flight to Europe and

Flight 1628, with a crew of three, left Iceland on Nov. 17 with a load of wine bound for Tokyo from Paris. Terauchi and his crew picked up the plane in Iceland for the Polar leg of the flight to

The sky was clear as the jet, cruising at 525 knots, crossed into Alaska from Canada just northeast of Fort Yukon at 35,000 feet. Terauchi said he then saw the wavering lights eight miles in front of his aircraft.

_} The pilot reported the lights were yellow, amber and green, Steucke said, but not red, the international color for aircraft beacons.

"'His main concern was trying to determine whether he was overtaking another aircraft, " Steucke said. He said the pilot reported he dimmed cockpit lights to ensure he was not seeing a reflection.

NASA STATION PICKS UP UFO SIGNALS

From July, 1962, to February, 1966, Geof Gray-Cobb was the control tower operator at the South African Deep Space Instrumentation Facility. He had been sent to South Africa by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) as a public relations consultant, but, when his technical expertise became apparent, he was assigned to scientific duties. He is now the editor of the Vancouver (British Columbia, Canada) Week. For nearly four years, in Johannesburg, Gray-Cobb tracked the U.S. Ranger and Mariner probes to the moon, Venus, and Mars. Clearly, his qualifications are impressive.

At 2:18 p.m., October 22, 1965, Gray-Cobb and his scientific colleagues were tracking Mariner 4 when they became involved in an incident that resembles science fiction, but is a

well-documented and singularly spectacular UFO drama with cover-up overtones.

"Signal strength rising," Willem Pretorius, the receiver operator, said, opening the curtain on Act I of the drama.

"Can't," an unidentified voice on the station hotline responded, "not unless the

bird's [Mariner 4] coming back."

Gray-Cobb swung into action, requesting a voice report from each crew member. All reported nothing out of the ordinary and Gray-Cobb switched on the trans-Atlantic microphone button.

"Track -- this is DSIF 51," he said. "Report signal strength rising."

"Keep us advised," answered his Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) counterpart in Cali-"I'll wake an engineer. He'll take a look at the T/M data. Keep it coming."

"Meanwhile," Gray-Cobb wrote in the October 6, 1974, edition of The Seattle (Wash.) Times, "Willem was quietly going out of his tree with disbelief. His signal-strength-indicator meter was hitting the back stop, hard. I could hear the clicks of the needle from across the room.... Great green sweeps of electrons were painting a Dali landscape on the little scope.... The pen was leaping the full width of the paper, drawing peaks and valleys of red in regular pulses."

Jaapie Breytenback was at the telemetry racks.

"Lost data," he said. "Circuits won't take it."
"Computer's having a hairy," stated engineer John Dinham. "Program won't handle whatever we're getting."

"For God's sake, turn the wick down," instructed Marius de Beer, the assistant station

manager. "The Ampex's [tape recorders) are overloading."

"For a while there it was a three-ring circus," Gray-Cobb reported. "All available data agreed that raw radio energy was pouring down from the sky, right into the middle of our dish, and it was coming hot and heavy -- in an unlikely succession of blips and dashes. Willem switched in an audio circuit. A roaring, squeaking, ticking sound filled the... control center."

Despite the early morning hour more than haif a world away, JPL was no longer asleep. "You've got a radio-frequency source in your beam," the U.S. operator remarked, "and

it ain't Mariner, no sirree."

"We figured that," Gray-Cobb responded. "Reckes we've got a UFO up there."

"You sure got something, buddy. You want to keep these reports coming. The brass are interested. Oh -- and tell us if you see anything, eh?"

Then, at 2:26, everything suddenly returned to normal. Later that afternoon, JPL again instructed the facility to scan the skies. Once more, the "radio source" was picked up.

"For 20 minutes, the receiver fell in and out of lock as we traced the shape of the phantom transmitter up... in the... sky....," Gray-Cobb continued. "Results? The source was an almost perfect circle, two degrees in diameter. Range unknown. Data unintelligible to our gear. The audio circuits produced a hiss, click and whine which resolved into audible 'patterns' at intervals."

Then "the pulses of energy from our transmitter had cleared the sky, almost as if our few watts of power had been interpreted by something (or someone?) as a hostile move."

Early that same December, Gray-Cobb was again on duty at the same time as his JPL counterpart.

"What happened to our UFO?" he asked.

"Wait one," the JPL operator responded. "I'll take a look at the log." Pause. "Funny -- someone's taken out the pages for that morning...."

Gray-Cobb said that "no one else who ran the United States console seemed to recall

our UFO episode whenever I queried [about] it."

The following month -- January, 1966 -- Gray-Cobb decided to replay the October 22 tapes. He borrowed a key from Tom Klew, the control storeman, and entered the storeroom.

"October's packages were on the right, third shelf up, 18th-19th-20th-21st... 23rd-24th," Gray-Cobb stated. "All neat parcels, lined up tidily, but with a gaping hole where October 22's data should have been. Tom knew nothing about it. He was worried he'd be in trouble as he alone was responsible for the data store. He and I went to see Doug Hogg, the station manager."

"The data package for October 22 is missing from the store," Tom reported.

"I know," Doug responded.

"But it shouldn't be," Gray-Cobb interjected. "That package was important."
"So I gathered," Doug said. "How important, I don't know. But extremely important to the two gentlemen who brought me an authorization from NASA to take it away on October 25."



"FLYING SAUCERS"? THEY'RE A MYTHI Villen Lyustiberg, APH Science Commentator

In the last 20 years publication of literature on "unidentified flying objects" has advanced to one of the first places in the world. This problem is dealt with by numerous associations and clubs.

Are these "flying saucers" just imagination or reality? Thousands of recorded statements by cye-witnesses

Are these "flying saucers" just imagination or reality? Thousands of recorded statements by cye-witnesses seem to show that "there must be something in it". But let us try to look at all these materials from a different of thand; So, as the ountineed utported of the "saucer" theory say almost every time, you can draw your own conclusions, while we give you.

"Facts Only"

Kenneth Arnold, an American pilot, is the "godfather" of flying saucers. It was he who noticed in 1947 nine shining discs flying in formation at the speed of about 3,000 km an hour.

The next encounter with saucers had a tragio outcome. In January 1948, an immenso flying saucer appeared over the Nox US Air Base. Pursuing it Captain Thomas Manthell perished. The last thing he reported from an altitude of 9,000 metres was that he saw an object and was going to approach it.

This story found extensive response. Many considered it to be a stern warning of unknown envoys from other planets to leave them alone. There was a great deal of a talk acout the mysterious death of the pilot. It was received as undoubted proof of the existence of mighty forces still unknown to us.

But the results of a thorough investigation by US authorities received much less publicity. The mysterious "saucer" proved to be nothing out a thin-walled plastic balloon made by US Naval Forces under the secret "Skyhawk Operation" project.

Such balloons could rise to an altitude of 30,000 metres. Meanwhile, Thomas Manthell pursuing it, forgot that he had no oxygen apparatus on board his oraft.

We know of stories about encounters and even hand-tohand fights with pilots of craft landing from other planets. They were shot at, but without success.

A saucer out down a tree on the Amazon River shore and disappeared in the turbid stream. It was never rebovered. Another saucer glided over the earth like an injured bird and almost orashed before the eyes of witnesses. But "having spit out" several pieces of metal, it levelled out its course and flow off. Delivered to the police, the metal proved to be ordinary tin.

An abandoned silvery diso was found in the deep rockooal seams in Norwegian coal mines on Spitzbergen. It was
pieroed and marked by micrometeor impacts and bore all traces
of having performed a long space voyage. It was sent for analysis to the Pentagon and disappeared there.

Nothing but a squoer put out of commission a high-voltage power transmission line in 1965 and thus plunged several large American cities into derkness for six hours.

But the most thrilling masterpiece of this sort was probably the "Interview with a Man from Venus" published at the close of 1967 by the West German Stern magazine. This materialized blue-eyed "superman", a version of Nietzsche's "blond beast", proved to be a secret service agent of the Pentagon. He was 190 cm tall, spoke excellent English (it was English indeed!) and could breathe freely in our atmosphere without any devices. His modest fibre suitease contained en unusual silvery suit, flexible like silk and so hard that a diamond drill broke off it.

The man from Venus said that he could walk freely in such a suit over the surface of the hottest stars, ignoring all powerful gravitational fields.

Maybe theso "faots" will do?

How Can They Be Studied?

It is easier to ask this question, than to answer it. These flying saucers -- they are like Our Lady: they appear to those who believe in them. And they persistently fail to show themselves to air observation posts, meteorologists and astronomers, i.e. precisely to those who can give us accurate information and trustworthy descriptions of a flying object.

Experiments that do not repeat themselves, or the chance appearance of a phenomenon always either handroop the possibility of investigation considerably or exclude it altogether.

Nowhere in the world is there EVFN ONE trustworthy storeoscopic photograph making it possible to trace from two points simultaneously the outlines of a solid flying object clearly. All photographs that exist have been made with single-lens cameras and always leave a margin for doubt.

A series of such photographs amazingly resembles a straw hat with a black silk ribbon, thrown into the air. Others undoubtedly prove to be internegatives obtained from two combined slides, for instance, that of a landscape and that of a strangely designed craft drawn on white paper. Modern photographing techniques allow photographs to be produced which no expert will ever prove to be counterfeit. They are real. But they do not show strangers from space; they show quite ordinary earthly objects unexpectedly foreshortened—pots, pans, plastic toys, and the like.

Are there photographs which evoke no doubts whatsoever? Yes, there are. They always show shining objects of a circular or oval shape with vague outlines. Most likely these photographs show ball lightning. Incidentally, the nature of the latter has not been fully elucidated yet either, due to the vagueness of the place and time of its formation. However, no one eyer thought of ascribing a cosmic origin to it.

Even with a superficial analysis, mysterious flares on clouds proved to be reflections of electric welding, warning lights of airplanes in the area of airports, or distant summer lightning. And the Hovember 1967 "saucer" over Sofia proved to be a high-altitude NATO reconnaissance balloon.

Among the most serious works devoted to an investigation of the problem, there are two which ought to be mentioned. One of them is the hook "Flying Saucers" by Donald Menzel who explains almost all cases of their appearance by disturbances in the Earth's or Sun's atmosphere. Our planet travels in the upper layers of the Sun's atmosphere where clots of high-temperature plasma are moving freely.

The other is a book by Frank Edwards. It is a collection of statements, notes and records of eye-witness testimony classified into several sections. True, Edwards often qualifies his source as a witness who did not wish to have his name mentioned, but who may be fully trusted, or that the trustworthiness of the witness is confirmed by numerous of his countrymen, but he cannot mention his name so far for a number of reasons. That's not very convincing, is it?

For Whom Is It Not a Myth?

They are those for whom science is a business. Taking advantage of the lively interest of people for everything that is strange and unusual, numerous lecturers in the West appear before audiences with reports and stories, invite eye-witnesses to such lectures, and demonstrate photographs and slides. Most of these lecturers are nothing but ordinary quecks. True, there are people who are sincerely convinced in the truth of what they are talking about. They strive to draw the interest of the public to certain phenomena but, we

are sorry to say, there is more harm than use in that.

The Americans Lesly, and Adamski are the most outright frauds among them. Using their "good friendly relations" with strangers from other planets, the enterprising businessmen "visited" Mars, the Moon and Venus, learned from our cosmic neighbours to treat by simple and accessible methods such diseases as cancer, glaucoma, hypertension and others which afflict the human race. Their lectures, motion-pictures, books and medical practice have brought them many hundred thousand dollars out of the pockets of trusting listeners and patients already.

We may trace a clearly defined regularity in the appearance of large numbers of flying saucers. And, strange as it might seem, this regularity is closely connected with earthly events.

The first "oycle" of four years began in 1947. The number of saucers always grows sharply on the eve of presidential elections in the USA. This is difficult to explain. Maybe people on other planets lay bets as to who will win in the next elections — the republicans or the demograts. Perhaps, these saucers appear in order to divert the voters! thoughts from the again non-rulfilled presidential programme and promises to make the country a "great" and "prospering" society.

There is enother cycle. True, it is not determined by time. Saucers flooded the earth's atmosphere in 1951, in the months when the American troops were waging a ruthless, annihilating war against the Korean People's Democratic Republic.

The next invasion of saucers was in 1965-1966, when 35 American advisers in South Vietnam were quickly replaced by half-a-million-strong army equipped with the latest arms and intending to rout the National-Liberation Front within two weeks and when the President of the United States of America, without declaring war and in violation the constitution of his own country, gave the order that the peaceful population of North Vietnam be subjected to orutal bombings.

In short, when newspaper circulation drops, when readers get tired of conomics and politics and when they are to be diverted from "irrelevant" questions, the Western businessmen resort to three reliable, "always fresh" sensations: Flying Saucers, the Sea Sarpent (sometimes it is substituted by the Loch Mesa Lake monster), and the Snow Man.

It is much nicer to read about mysterious oraft from Venus than to think of the future, of the wage freeze, of growing prices or unemployment. Statesmen in imperialist countries resort to this "information" quite deliberately. For them the flying saucers are not a myth, but a well-camourlaged means for misinforming the people. And nothing but that.

As a scientific advisor to the Center for UFO Studies in Illinois, headed by Dr. J. Allen Hynek, I have been studying aircrew reports of unusual aerial phenomenon for many years. The Center routinely sends me copies of the reports of Satellite Re-entry, bright fireball or other atmospheric phenomena for my study and computer analyses. Today I received a particularly interesting case from Swissair of a sighting which took place on June 16, 1981 at 1220 Z by your flight 197 crew (Peking to Bombay) over Kunming, P. R. China. I have called our North American Air Defense Command in Colorado and they have no record of there having been a man-made satellite re-entry at that time and place. I am writing to you for some further assistance in the hope you will be willing to cooperate. I seek further information on this sighting by Capt. H. Vogt, F/O J. Barbezat, and S/O E. Schmid and I have enclosed two special pilot reporting forms for this purpose.

Would you be so kind as to ask at least two of these three gentlemen to complete these forms and return them directly to me? Of course all information provided will be kept confidential as my interest is scientific. We believe that it will be through the dedicated collaboration and support of persons such as yourself and aircrews that we will someday uncover the core identity of these strange phenomena. If we should uncover some definitive answer to the sighting of 16, 6,81 be assured that I will let you know about it. My sincere thanks for your help.





In the Villa of General Teran, State of Nuevo-Lecn, on the fifteenth day of February of nineteen hundred sixty seven, a releven o'clock. Prof. Ernesto TORRES Malagón appeared before the Presidente Municipal, Ing. Plutarco Prof. Torres is a teacherin the Federal Rural School Elías CALLES Sáenz. of the Ejido Las Anacuitas, Sección Victoria, of the municipality of General Teran and said that on arriving to work on Tuesday, February 7, the neighbors alarmed informed him that about 10:30 of that day they heard two or three explosions and suddenly they saw descending a sphere of indefinite size with direction to the West, covered by smoke and some signs of fire, which fell in the land belonging to the Ejido about 1,500 meters from the center of town, on seeing it they decided to go towards the place where the object fell but they could not reach the location due to the fact that the said object smelled strongly of gunpowder, so they decided to return to their place of origin. Next, Mr. Reyes PERALES Pérez, on Sunday 12 accidentally found the object first seen, which consisted of a metal sphere, of some unknown metal, of indefinite color, about thirty kilos in weight and about sixty centimeters in diameter. On advise from the Professor the following persons went to the location of the object: CC. Prof. Ruben GARZA Rodríguez, Secretary of the Ayuntamiento (City Hall), Mr. Genaro RODRIGUEZ Ramirez, Second Municipal Commandant and Prof. Leopoldo DIAZ Alejandro, Chief of the Traffic Department of that town, who agreed thoroughly with what the neighbor and the teacher had reported, and furthermore they could investigate that the sphere touched the branches of a tree on falling and that it was lying on a beehive. In order to transport it into town, it was rolled about forty meters to reach a road where it was loaded on a wagon and taken into town where three small screws were removed. Neighbors also informed that other particles of the object continued flying and that another one fell in a pasture nearby which is a private property and they have been unable to locate it. The man who found the sphere, it should be explained, gave the information very laconically and appeared somewhat selfish in giving information in this respect. The sphere, on falling, made a loud noise, a sort of humming noise.

This memorandum was written as proof and is signed by those who intervened and wished to do so. We agree-----

Thank you for your letter of 28 November 1989 enclosing a letter from your constituent Mr R Tarr of 589 Gloucester Road, Bristol on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).

I think it would be helpful if I first of all explain that the Ministry of Defence's sole interest with the UFO phenomenon is to establish whether or nor reported sightings of UFOs present a threat to the defence and security of the United Kingdom using a judgement based on military expertise and an analysis of the available information. Unless it is judged that a sighting does present a threat, and I would like to confirm that this has not been the case so far, no further attempt is made to investigate whatever might have been seen.

Although we believe that the vast majority of reported sightings can adequately and rationally be explained in terms of known phenomena, I hope Mr Tarr will understand that as we do not attempt to identify or investigate any sightings beyond the point of establishing whether or not it poses a threat, the vast majority of sightings which are passed to us, remain by definition, unidentified. Mr Tarr may be assured that there is no cover up or conspiracy of silence on the issue of UFO sightings.

Moving now to Mr Tarr's request for information, I would like to confirm that, as is the case in all Government Departments, Ministry of Defence files are subject to the Public Records Act. There is no UK equivalent to the US Freedom of Information Act. Although the Public Records Act does not allow for the release of material "en bloc" before the thirty year point, any related material over this age is available to the public from the Public Records Office at Kew. The material currently available in the Public Records Offices does not include UFO reports themselves since, as Viscount Long stated in the House of Lords in April 1982, prior to 1967 the Ministry of Defence maintained a policy

of destroying UFO reports after five years but reports since then have been preserved.

I hope that you will find this helpful.
