As I looked over Leeds I saw a very bright light in the sky, it appeared to be over the city centre area. The light had a pinkish blue tinge to it, very similar to an ultra violet light, it flashed on and off approximately five times. There were no other lights near to or with the white light. I continued to drive along the road and the light, which originally had been moving from right to left, appeared to turn and move along the side of me until it was behind my car. The light was at a height which I would say was the same as aircraft which I have previously seen in the area. I have never seen a light like this before.
