At 5.35 pm on Thursday 8th December 1988 I was driving my Talbot Samba motor car reg. no. **Section 40** along the M621 motorway. I was on the eastbound carriageway driving from the direction of the M62 towards Leeds. I was at the junction before the A58. I could see clearly through my windscreen right over Leeds. As I looked over Leeds I saw a very bright light in the sky, it appeared to be over the city centre area. The light had a pinkish ^{blue} tinge to it, very similar to an ultra violet light, it flashed on and off approximately five times. There were no other lights near to or with the white light. I continued to drive along the road and the light, which originally had been moving from right to left, appeared to turn and move along the side of me until it was behind my car. The light was at a height which I would say was the same as aircraft which I have previously seen in the area. I have never seen a light like this before. I would say that I saw the light for a period of approximately one minute. My first thought that it was an aeroplane but the speed it moved at and the quick change of direction made me feel that it was not. About four minutes later, I saw an aeroplane but the light on this was much smaller and had a red flashing light with it. I did not hear any noise from what I saw, but I was driving at the time and this would prevent me from hearing any sounds outside the car. The
