**SUBJECT:** Sighting of Unidentified Flying Object

1. I report with reference to the attached teleprinter message with regard to the action to be taken following reported sightings of unidentified flying objects.

2. At 2120hrs. on Wednesday, 31st August, 1988 Section 40 who both resides and works as a farmer at Section 40 Nr. Lichfield, was working in a field at the farm when he observed what he described as the following:-

3. Either three or four bright white lights which were close together and remained on. The lights were observed coming from the direction of Hopwas Woods and when almost overhead of the observer, stopped and remained stationary, momentarily, at an estimated height of 400 feet. The lights then moved away towards the direction of Botany Bay, Whittington, which is located on the A51 trunk road linking Lichfield and Tamworth.

4. Section 40 described the object upon which the lights were carried as flat and possibly rounded, of a very bright colour. It made no noise and there was no apparent odour. The object was described as being larger than a helicopter.

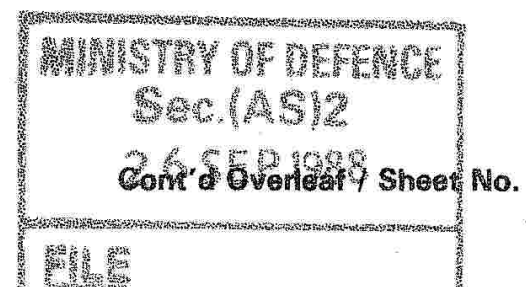
5. Approximately ten minutes following this sighting, Section 40 saw what he described as a set of red and white flashing lights approaching from the same direction as outlined in respect of the first object. These lights approached and went overhead of the observer, moving away in the same direction as previously stated. The observer is unable to give any indication as to either size or shape of the object on which the lights were carried. He states that no noise or odour was apparent and that the object was flying higher than that of his first sighting. The second set of lights moved at a faster pace than the first. Section 40 observed the sightings with naked eyes.

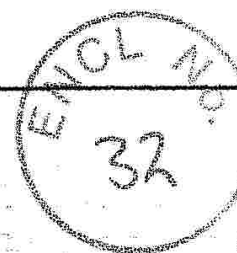
6. The objects were first sighted approximately three quarters of a mile away from the observer at a point over Hopwas Woods, near to the television mast located near to the A51 at Packington.

7. The objects were described as moving towards, overhead and away from the observer at one height and in a straight line.

8. In respect of the prevailing meteorological conditions, it was a fine, clear evening, with no cloud or haze.

9. The following objects are located in the close proximity of the sighting:- (a) Television mast. (b) High voltage overhead railway cables. (c) Telephone lines. (d) River Tame.

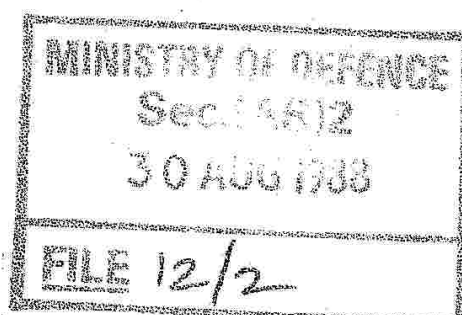
