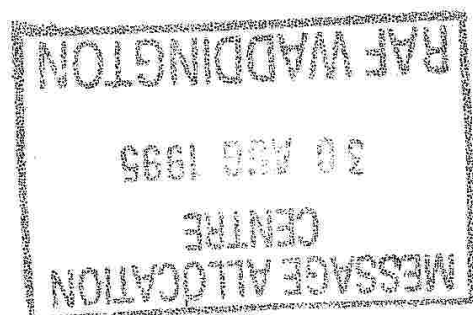

REPORT OF UFO SIGHTING

Date: Friday, 25 August 1995.

Section 40 said that she was travelling in a car being driven by her daughter, with her two grandchildren. As they were approaching Latimer from Chorley Wood her daughter noticed some lights above the car. Section 40 thought that they may be reflections of spotlights from a disco and they stopped the car to see if they could hear the music. It was completely silent.

Section 40 made out a disc in the sky with a number of vivid green lights around the sides and she was completely mystified. As they drove off along a country lane towards Chesham, about 5 or 6 miles away, they could see the object apparently following them. When the car slowed the object appeared to slow as well, but on one occasion it appeared to come alongside. At this point she estimates that it may have been about 100 metres away but she was not able to give an estimate of its size. They stopped the car to have a better look and two beams of light seemed to appear from beneath the object towards the ground. They drove off again and it was still visible as they entered the residential area of Chesham, although it subsequently disappeared.

Section 40 said she had been plucking up courage to tell someone about what she saw and that was why it had taken several weeks to do so. She seemed to be somewhat embarrassed and feared that she would be dismissed as a crackpot. I think she genuinely believes that she saw something inexplicable that night.

At this time we were standing at the first floor rear window of [Section 40] Landon, Essex.

Although this object was visible with the naked eye it could only clearly be identified through binoculars, standard pair of binoculars borrowed from informants were used.
