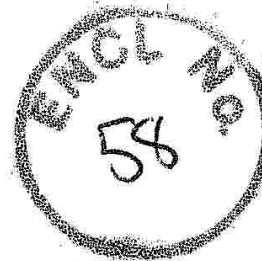

With reference to our telephone conversation of this morning I am enclosing a statement of the U.F.O sighting that I had on 7th Feb '95 and do hope it will be of some assistance to the Defence and security of our Country.

It would be helpful to me if you would confirm receipt of my letter and Statement as you will appreciate that after an experience of this kind I just want to forget about it and get on with my Life.

Thank you for your valuable help in this matter and I look forward to hearing from you.

Sighting.

INCIDENT - U.F.O. ~~Sighting~~. Hovering like bright Star. In field, Landed and taking off from field North of B.3108 on borderline Winsley/Bradford-on-Avon on North side opposite parking lay-by. Tuesday 7th. February 1995 at approx 10.17pm.

On Tuesday 7th February 1995 I left my house at two minutes to tenpm and walked through the village towards Bradford-On-Avon on B 3108. ~~It was a~~ very dark night very damp slightly misty night. On leaving the ~~lit~~ Area of Winsley I spotted a bright light in the sky (like a star but much brighter) hovering over the St. Lawrence School at Bradford-on-Avon. It did not move for some minutes and I thought Ah! That looks like the light ~~I have~~ seen on two other occasions last November and December and was puzzled at the time by how it could hover without noise and suddenly shoot off like a shooting star disappearing altogether.

I suppose I watched this light for three or four minutes listening for the sound of an engine and there was none. I walked along the path towards B-O-A with a high wall to the left of me which gets lower as you get near the Lay-by. Suddenly I saw the light streak across to the left and the light went out there was no sound. I continued to listen as I was walking along the high wall. As I reached the point where I could look over the wall I saw quite clearly a lit rounded cockpit with square windows at the back of the field exactly opposite where I was standing with my arms on top of the wall. Had there been anyone looking out of the windows I would have seen them it was so clear. There were four square windows and a half a window at each end as they curved around. A yellow light inside the cockpit. No sound.

I leaned on the wall watching and immediately thought Oh! a flying saucer. After about a minute the light went out. I waited a few seconds listening saw nothing until Suddenly I was surrounded by very powerful flashing multi coloured light. This was within a few feet of me over the wall the light was so strong I could see ~~no~~ shape or form under the light. Almost on a level with the wall were three flashing globes a few feet away and the strange red lamp was mounted on around pillar some ten inches tall and six inches in diameter, slightly to the right was a flashing Green (Pea Green) light and in between and behind these lights was a purplish violet light also quickly flashing. These flashing lights seemed to be mounted on top of something and all were on about the same level as the wall and my forearms.

The sky was completely filled with coloured light encompassing all my vision and lighting up all the sky. Added to this were ladders of whitish light streaking out from the centre of the flashing lamps straight up and outwards to about 45 degrees into the sky. These ladders of light were narrow and lacy or cob-webbed looking I thought this was a little bit of mist shewing this effect. I stood fascinated by this scene listened for sound but heard none but could feel a tremendous surge of energy emanating around me. No Noise no vibration just a sort of Charged atmosphere. Then after what seemed split seconds two or three motor cars went by on the road behind me (and they had to have seen the sky all lit up on the North side of the road) over the Wall but would not have seen the lamps themselves the wall being too high. I said "Damn" I will not now hear any sound now above the cars sound.

Suddenly the lights went out a split second of complete darkness, and then a bright white light like a big star appeared high on my left side and immediately in a second disappeared as a white dot

in the sky. I was annoyed that the cars covered any sound that I might have heard from the object moving off. I just heard a low drone which could have come from the cars disappearing down the road. Complete darkness I turned around in the dark and said out loud "God! Nobody will ever believe this. I was not frightened, just fascinated, it had all happened at such a speed. I immediately thought that whatever this was that their time span was very different to ours. I looked up and down the road and could see both the sodium lights of Winsley and the sodium lights of Bradford-On-Avon quite clearly and roughly equi-distant from the spot where I had been standing. I turned towards Bradford-on-Avon and when in the lit Area looked at my watch which said twenty-seven minutes past ten. I concluded my late walk and reached home just past elevenpm. (I often walk this route after supper but not usually this late).

On Wednesday I felt if I was to mention all this nobody would believe me and left it to Thursday evening to tell a group of Winsley people whom I was meeting. They took the news quite seriously.

I did phone the local Police but at two stations nobody was available at the time so I gave up that course of action. On Sunday afternoon 12th Feb. I walked to the spot where I had been the previous night which can be remembered by the height of the wall. I marked the wall with brown chalk and the kerb with crosses on the other side of the road in the lay-by. Sitting in a B.T. Telephone Van was an Engineer who told me that the previous week the telephone cable had developed a fault. I asked him exactly where he had located the fault and he showed me the spot which happened to be in a line with my marked location. He said when I told him that something had landed opposite that there could be some connection, and that B.T. were to replace the cable on Monday.

Sunday evening about 7 pm. I telephoned the Air Traffic Manager at Boscombe Down but was unable to speak to the duty Officer. I telephoned again later and spoke to **Section 40** who promised to report the sighting to his superior and contact me next day before 10.30am. No one rang so I telephoned The Air Traffic Manager at Boscombe Down **Section 40** told him about the sighting and he Promised me that he would immediately write to the Ministry Of Defence Department dealing with U.F.O. sightings. He said they might be in touch and I gave my telephone number. Having Hercules low flying aircraft flying low level over Winsley and also fighter aircraft by day and night I thought that what I had seen must be of the utmost importance to the various authorities from a safety point of view and that I should inform persons at the highest level as soon as possible.

I am prepared to give any help necessary to investigate this strange sighting and would ask if you would give me some reassurance that any action that you feel necessary will be taken. I do not wish the press to get involved the matter is too serious for that and I shall be more than happy to forget what has been a quite horrendous experience.

At 1956 hours on Wednesday 18 January 1995 a call was received at the Wakefield Area Control Room reporting seeing strange lights in the sky above Castleford. A command and control log was created, number 1728, and passed to the Pontefract Help Desk for action.

At 2030 hours the same day I telephoned the caller [redacted] [redacted] Castleford.

About 1900 hours on 18 January 1995 he and his wife [redacted] were leaving his mother-in-law's house at [redacted]

He looked up and saw two groups of lights in diamond shaped formations above the houses opposite. There were four or five lights within each group. He says the lights were bright but not dazzling, like tubes with diffusers over them.

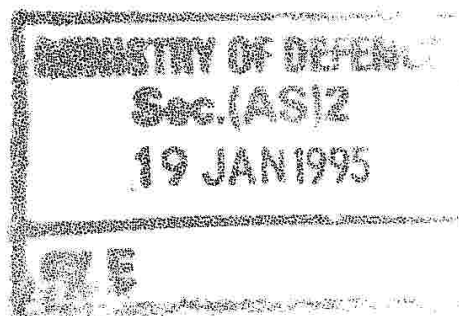
He states they were travelling fairly slowly from east to west, they stopped and the lights seemed to move about within the diamond formation before moving off at speed.

The objects gave off a yellow light, appeared round or oval shaped, and there was no sound associated with them.

At the time of the sighting the night was clear with good visibility and the caller estimates his angle of vision to have been about 60° observed with the naked eye for five to ten seconds.

The witness is unable to estimate the size of the lights as he does not know how far away they were from him.

In reply to your letter of the 6th June this ^{last} year, I would just like to say, after apologising for the delay in writing, that you possibly know that I have made three reports over the last six years.

My most recent sighting was in the same area, approximately a half mile from my home. One of these reports concerned a fast moving object which appeared to be under some form of control. As I recall one of the objects moved on a roughly S. East course, the other two in the reverse direction.

As regards your airship suggestion for my last

2.

sighting, I can only say it didn't look anything like the airships as operated by Section 40 which I have often seen overflying this town.

There was once a strange sounding 'aircraft' flying roughly the same course as the above, after nightfall, whose engine noise was reminiscent of a V1 flying bomb and which was at such a low level that the disturbance prompted me to go outside. I was just in time to see its navigation lights receding over the horizon.

These appeared to be showing the wrong configuration. I formed the impression that there was something most unusual about this plane, apart from its lights.

There are probably many sightings locally which have gone unreported locally judging from conversations I have had with people and as there have been several newspaper reports of similar sightings in the area, even going back to the 1950's, I am convinced there is something odd going on here. A re-examination of anything reported from this area could well lead to the evidence which has previously not been forthcoming.

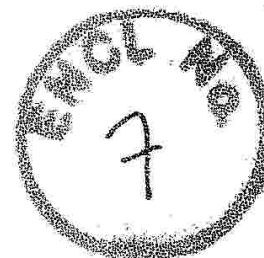

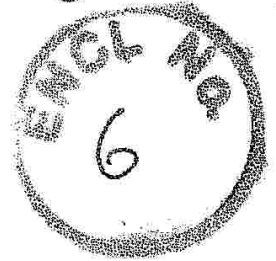

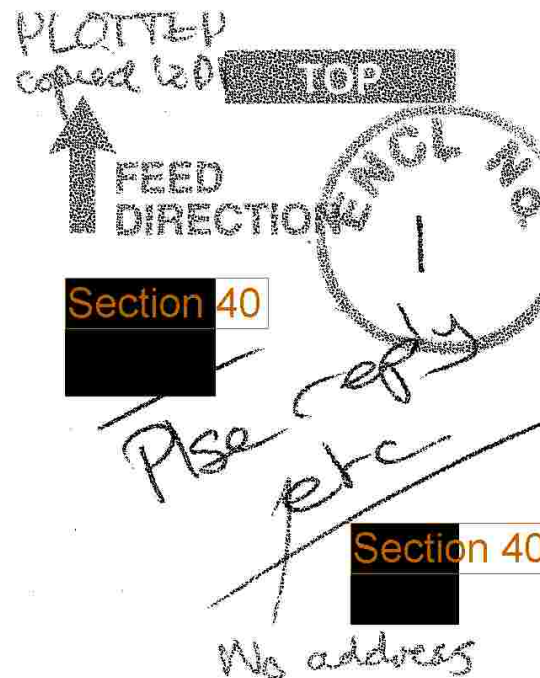
