#### L.U.F.O.R.O. DULLETIN

IS THERE A SILEMCE GROUP? For any years investigators have claimed that there is a group of individuals who stop the truth about UFOs from reaching the public. They are said to be responstible for the apparent Press censorship of genuine UFO sightings, and also for visiting individuals who claim to have "discovered" what UFOs are, and to have silenced them very effectively! Other investigators have their doubts, and deplore the infiltration of this cloak-and-dagger atmosphere into serious research. But perhaps recent political events have changed their minds.

On May 1st,1960, Francis Powers took off in a Lockheed U-2 aircraft on a flight of espionage over Russia. Later, Mr. Khruschev announced that the plane had been suct down but gave no details. The State Department in reply talked about an unarmed weather study plane operating out of Adana, Turkey, reporting oxygen trouble. It was possible, said the statement, that the plane continued on its automatic pilot for a considerable distance and accidentally vio-

-lated Soviet air space.

Mr. Khruschev then a nounced that the pilot of the U-2 was "alive and kicking" and had admitted that he was spying. The version put by the Americans was a complete lie, and the men that put it out counted on the pilot being dead, he added. The State Depart—nent's next statement, contradicting their first, was authorised by President Eisenhower. In effect it admitted that the plane was spying, and that similar flights had taken place over the last four years. "I doubt that President Eisenhower knew about or approved this flight" said Mr. Harold Stassen, former disarrament advisor to the President. Mr. Khruschev also made similar statements. In fact it had been admitted that no specific order for the flight had been given by President Eisenhower; however, he accepted full respons—ibility for the flight — to do otherwise would be to admit that he was not in full control of his country.

Fear for the forth-coming summit conference was justifiably expressed, for Mr. Khruschev thoroughly exploited the U-2 flight, and refused to continue the Summit talks unless President Eisenhower apologised for the flight, premised it would never happen again, and PUNISHED THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FLIGHT! Frestanct Eisenhower

found the ultimatum unacceptable. . The Summit failed!

Mr. Allen Dulles gave evidence at the Senate Foreign Rel-ations Committee inquiry into the Surgit failure. He is Director
of the Central Intelligence Agency (CTA) and many believe he was
responsible for the flight of the U-2. Mr. Khruschev has repeatedly sated that those responsible for the flight should be punished

and still infers that President Eisenhower knew nothing about the flight. Is it possible that the spectacle hade out of the U-2 and the deliberate act of Mr. Khruschev to upset the Su mit were designed to stir worl outcry to oust Mr. Dulles from his post and deprive the CIA of its powers? This theory was made even mor pl--ausible when a few days later I read that the Soviet Government newspaper, "Izvestia" had accused Mr. Dulles of plotting with the Fascists during the war. It claimed to have documentary evidence, and said Dulles's hands are stained with the blood from the handshakes of Hitler's and Himmler's envoys. This helps us to under--stand the role Dulles is playing today, continued the newspaper. During the war he was an accomplice of Himmler and in the postwar years he is continuing Himmler's cause of ant-Soviet provoc--ation. was this attack heant to make him even more unpopular, or was it purely coincidental?

Perhaps at this point we could ponder over a few questions which perhaps time will answer:

(1) Is the CIA the silence Group? (2) Does it investigate UFOs, and does it dictate what the Press can print about them?

(3) Does Khruscheve believe that there cannot be world peace

until the CIA is disposed of?

(4) Will the Summit failure cause the CIA to "fold-up"?

(5) Will we then hear more about UFOs?
FURTHER CONFIRMATION: - After this editorial was written the foll--owing evidence came to hand. The Surmit inquiry revealed that the CIA had operational responsibility for the overflights! Dulles as director is one of these directly responsible! The London Evening Standard (June 8th 1960) reported an interview wath Mr. Cyrus Eaton, a powerful North American Industrialist who has been trying to build a pridge of peace between East and West. Asked why he thought the Summit talks had broken down he replied:

"In my opinion, there was a great influence prought to bear on President Eisenhower after his neeting at Camp David with Mr. Khruschev. I think at that time there was an honest desire to

reach an understanding."

"BUT THEN PRESSURE WAS BROUGHT. THERE WAS THE ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION. THE PENTAGON. THE C.I.A. - THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY. ALL PEOPLE WHO HAVE A VESTED INTEREST IN KEEPING TENSION SETWEEN THE EAST AND THE WEST."

CIA INFORMATION: - The first Director of the Central Intelligence Agency, was Vice-Admiral Hillenkoetter who became Lirector on May 1st, 1947, (about the time UFOs became NEWS). Mr. Allen bulles was his deputy from 1951 to 1953, when he became Director. <del>-</del> · o 0 o -

## AIR FORCE TREAT UFOS AS SERIOUS BUSINESS

The National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena, NICAP) in America, recently revealed the existence of new Air Force regulations regarding unidentified flying objects. The new regulat--ions were issued on December 24th 1959, by Major General E.O'Keefe acting inspector general. They brought up to date all previous ones. He is reported as saying:-"Unidentified flying objects - sometimes treated lightly by the Press and referred to as 'flying saucers'must be rapidly and accurately identified as serious USAF business.

"Air Force concern with these sightings is threefold. First of all in the object a threat to the defence of the United States? Secondly, does it contribute to technical or scientific knowledge?"

Vice-Admiral R.H. Hillenkoetter (ret.), a NICAP board member and former director of the CIA, said in a statement that a photocopy of the inspector general's warning had been sent to the Senate Space Committee. He is also reported to have commented that "behind the scenes, high-ranking Air Force Officers are soborly concerned about UFOs."

The new regulations, issued to the operations and training commands in a pamphlet "Operations and Training" were under the heading "UFOs SERIOUS BUSINESS". Pentagon aides said the new regulations, covering seven printed pages, nude no substantive change in policy. The latest A.F. statement issued a few nonths ago said "no physical or material evidence, not even a minute fragment of a so-called flying saucer, had ever been found."

However, AICAP accused the Air Force of deception in public--ly describing unidentified flying objects as delucions and houses while sending private admonitions to its contants. NICAP is camp--aigning for the truth to be revealed at open hearings, and have received support from many politicians.

# LUFORO'S FIRST CAXTON HALL MEETING

On Saturday 21st May, AUFORO held it's first public meeting at the Caxton Hall in Aondon. The meeting was very well attended, and we were very fortunate to have as our speaker Mr. G.F.N.Knewstub of the Eritish Flying Saucer Bureau. ### MORE COMMENTS HIGARDING AN INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION

We have published the letters and comments of a number of researchers in recent bulletirs regarding the proposed Federation. We continue here with a quote from the Editorial of Saucer Forum

for August 1959.

In the current issue of 'Sausers' Max B, Miller reviews the present position of Utology. He is backed up, in the magazine, by an article from the late M.K. Jessup, and, in both cases, the conclusions drawn are not very optimistic. I am in agreement with both writers when they say we can only progress by working together, and with facts not rumours.

"Googeration is the keynote of success. There are hundreds of UFO groups throughout the world today, but these are independent bodies not affiliated to any one international organisation. Many are doing excellent work, but, I feel that much work is being duplicated, and too many appear to be flying off at a tangent. What we need is a common policy. Many groups freely exchange information but this could be carried much further for the benefit of all.

"I suggest that a start be made by each country putting its own house in order. This could be achieved by a series of conferences starting with county or state conferences and building up to a

national conference.

"As I said in the last esue, everyone thinks theirs is the right approach; in a world wide organisation there would be sufficient researchers to thoroughly investigate every approach.

"I would like to see the kind of relationship established, similar to that which exist in Amateur Radio, with its enthusiasm

and friendly cooperation,"

My group feels that your scheme for an "International" federation is most admirable, but would prefer to be associated at this stage with a purel- "British" federation. Not from any false sense of nationalistic pride, of course, but purely on the grounds that no truly representative nationalist group exists, either in this country or any other.

It does seem that Britain could again show the others how it's done" by forming a workable representative Eritish Council of all UFO researchers, - co-opting under one banner representatives of all other existing groups (without having them lose their own local identity, or privately held views and policies). It is time we had such an organisation in this country; the resultant possibilities of such a British Council would be greater than any of us could envisage at this time.
