

MEDIA INTEREST IN US - NORTHERN IRELAND AFFAIRS HAS REMAINED EXTREMELY HIGH. NEWS THAT PLANS WERE BEING MADE FOR PRESIDENT CLINTON TO LIGHT BELFAST CITY COUNCIL'S CHRISTMAS TREE PROVOKED A NEGATIVE RESPONSE FROM SOME UNIONIST COUNCILLORS WHO FAVOURED A PROPOSAL THAT CHILDREN'S TV CHARACTERS "POWER RANGERS" UNDERTAKE THE CEREMONY INSTEAD.

INTEREST IN THE FORTHCOMING PRESIDENTIAL VISIT

REMAINS HIGH.

SEPARATE VISITS TO US BY DUP LEADER IAN PAISLEY AND UNIONIST PARTY LEADER DAVID TRIMBLE GENERATED REPORTS RELATING TO UNIONIST OPINION OF US INTEREST IN NORTHERN IRELAND. REPORTS ARE MIXED, THE GENERAL TONE BEING THAT UNIONISTS REMAIN SUSPICIOUS OF US MOTIVES.

SEVERAL REPORTS SUGGESTED THAT US / PRESIDENT CLINTON HAD AN IMPORTANT ROLE TO PLAY IN PROGRESSING THE NORTHERN IRELAND PEACE PROCESS.

PRESIDENTIAL VISIT: BELFAST CHRISTMAS TREE LIGHTING

IRISH NEWS OCTOBER 24 REPORTED THAT PRESIDENT CLINTON IS TO SWITCH ON BELFAST'S CHRISTMAS TREE LIGHTS. QUOTING BELFAST CHAMBER OF TRADE CHIEF EXECUTIVE FRANK CADDY: "THIS IS TERRIFIC NEWS." THE REPORT ALSO STATED THAT IN ORDER TO STIMULATE CHRISTMAS TRADE THE MAIN CITY LIGHTS WOULD BE SWITCHED ON FROM MID-NOVEMEBER.

NEWS LETTER OCTOBER 26 REPORTED THAT "A ROW HAD ERUPTED AT BELFAST CITY HALL OVER PLANS FOR US PRESIDENT BILL CLINTON'S VISIT TO THE CITY." IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE COUNCIL HAD ALREADY MADE ARRANGEMENT FOR TV CHARACTERS POWER RANGERS TO SWITCH ON THE LIGHTS. IT WAS REPORTED THAT SOME COUNCILLORS EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE COST.

IN A REPORT THE FOLLOWING DAY THE NEWS LETTER WROTE: "SEVERAL COUNCILLORS ARE ANGRY THAT THEY ARE EXPECTED TO RUBBER STAMP THE PRESIDENT'S NOVEMBER 30 APPEARANCE, DETAILS OF WHICH LEAKED THIS WEEK."

QUOTING ULSTER UNIONIST COUNCILLOR JIM CLARKE: "I PERSONALLY DON'T THINK IT'S APPROPRIATE TO HAVE PRESIDENT CLINTON. TRADITIONALLY THIS HAS BEEN AN EVENT FOR CHILDREN AND I'M APPREHENSIVE THAT THERE WILL BE SO MUCH SECURITY...I ALSO DON'T THINK THIS IS AN EVENT THAT SHOULD BE POLITICISED IN ANY WAY."

THE BELFAST TELEGRAPH OCTOBER 27 CARRIED OUT A SURVEY AMONGST 27 SCHOOL CHILDREN TO DISCOVER WHO THEY FOUND MOST EXCITING: THE POWER RANGERS OR PRESIDENT CLINTON. THE POWER RANGERS WON BY 24 VOTES TO 3. QUOTING THE CHILDREN: "BUT SPEAKING FOR THE MINORITY DAVID MALLEN SAID 'I THINK IT SHOULD BE BILL CLINTON AS THE POWER RANGERS CAN BE QUITE VIOLENT.' ONE CHILD SUGGESTED A COMPROMISE WITH PRESIDENT CLINTON WEARING A POWER RANGERS SUIT FOR THE OCCASION.
