On 5/5/59, ROBERT ARTHUR WILLIAMS, 4253 N. W. 2nd St., Miami, Fla., came to the Miami Office and reported that he had recently been propositioned by a Cuban who identified himself as J. SERGE BURRELL, of Miami, to conduct certain investigations for the Cuban Air Force Intelligence. WILLIAMS said he is employed as Assistant Collection Manager, Pan American Bank, and that in connection with his duties of recovering automobiles and collecting money borrowed, he has come in contact with many Cuban exiles and revolutionaries in Miami. WILLIAMS, a World War II veteran, stated that he would like to cooperate with the FBI in any way possible, but at the same time did not want to violate any laws of the U.S. XL(W)

During the succeeding few days, WILLIAMS advised he had been recontacted by BURRELL and had been introduced to ALONSO HIDALGO BARRIOS, Cuban Consul General, Miami; to Major MARCOS DIAZ LANZ, Inspector and Assistant Chief of the Cuban Air Force (FAR); to Captain FRANK FIORINI, an American, who is presently alleged to be working for the Cuban Air Force; and others. WILLIAMS identified photos of FIORINI and HIDALGO.
