George Myers, leader of the Black Power group in Ringston, said that he had met/Dr. Donald Duncap and other Black Power supporters from Brown's Town who had plans to attend the presentation of the Marcus Garvey Prize for Human Rights to Mrs. Martin Luther King on 10 December and during the function distribute pamphlets protesting against the award being made to her late husband instead of to Marcus Garvey.
