1. A review of the Subject's file discloses the following information:

STATUS

In a markendom dated 27 February 1952, OFF requested a covert security clearance for the Subject's use. The Subject is described as President of a company which will provide decreditation in to a Contrast Agent of this organization. It is not expected that Subject will learn of the Agent's connection with this agency.

BACKERCOND

Subject was born & June 1921 at Paris, Texas, of native born parents. He straided hims school at Atlanta, Texas 1935-38; Texas State College for Women during the completion of Freshman year at college mid Yale University at New Haven, Gome, from 1939 to 1943, receiving an AB Degree in the latter year. Attendance at Yale University was interrupted by Subject's enlighted in V-7 Class, USNE, February, 1942. In November, 1943 Subject was assigned to NACIO at the University of Colorado, at Boulder. Subject is married to GAY NOW, daughter of former Louisiana Governor JAMES HOE. The Subject is presently associated with LIBERTY EXCADGASTING SYSTEM, Dallas, Texas.

CHAR FERTINENT INFORMATION

An investigation conducted in 1942 and 1943, by another government agency, discloses favorable information relative to the Subject and to his family in all respects except in one instance. This one instance is contained in a merorandum prepared by another government agency under date of 5 May 1943 which discloses that the Subject, while attending Navel Language School, had written a letter (addressed unknown) containing precisely the type of information which students had been warned should not be given to anyone outside of the school and that one student had been dismissed for such a violation, i.e. furnishing details regarding the number of students in the course, personnel and future assignment. The memorandum, containing the aforementional information, states that the only mitigating circumstance in this instance was that practically all of the information furnished by the Subject was false.

An investigation conducted by the Special Security Division, during April and May, 1952, at Dallas, Texas, was of a favorable nature concerning the Subject with exception to his business activities. The Subject is President of the Liberty Broadcasting Company which company suspended operations on 16 May 1952 and went into bankruptcy on 7 June 1952.

A former associate of the Subject -- associated since 1949 and employed by the Subject as of 1950 -- stated that the Subject's meteoric rise in the radio field (due to association with wealthy father and wealthy and influential father-in-law) was followed by a rapid descent and that fraud, duplicity, evasion, piracy (of baseball games) and lies were practiced by the Subject; that he enters into contracts with no intention of honoring his contractual obligations; and that his moral life, heavy drinking and extra-marital indiscretions have been questioned. The Subject is also given over to temper tantrums and has no consideration for others.

The Subject is presently suing organized baseball for twelve million dollars in an anti-trust suit charging thirteen major league clubs with having conspired to monopolise broadcasting in eleven state major league areas.

The Subject has no police record and his credit rating has been satisfactory to date but will, no doubt, be affected by the result of the present bankruptcy proceedings.

The results of the IID checks were entirely negative.

2. CONGLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION: Information from one informant, who has been associated with the Subject for approximately three years, reflects that the Subject has employed fraud, duplicity, evasion, lies and has failed to live up to his contractual obligations and that his moral life, heavy drinking and extra-marital indiscretions have been questioned. He is also subject to temper tentrums and fails to consider others. Stress is laid primarily on the Subject's use of fraud, etc.; his heavy drinking, which might tend to discussions of classified information, possibly in his possession, with unauthorised persons and the fact that he is apparently irritated when he does not have his own way. These characteristics would conceivably affect any contract or agreement into which he would enter with this agency.

In view of the fact that the Case Officer has advised that he would forward a memorandum cancelling the request for a clearance, no recommendation is believed necessary.
