Headquarters Comment. In view of the origin of the information, it must be read with some reserve.

- 1. The Payetian firm, Al-Masir Trading Company, either may be collaborating with UAR intelligence or was established by the UAR Government to finance military intelligence operations not covered by the regular budget. The director-general of the firm, Lt. Colonel Muhammad Chanim, is an officer in the counterespionate branch of Military Intelligence, draws military pay, and does not appear to touch the profits of the company.
- 2. It. Colonel Chanim is rumored to have said he was instrumental in the organizing of the Beirut uprising for which purpose he used the name of Muhammad al-Masri. He has ministerial status and belongs to the inner circles of UAR President Jamal 'Abd-al-Masir. (His immediate superior is Abmad Khafafi.) Chanim maintains an account in his name at the Banque Genevoise de Commerce et de Credit. He traveled in Western Europe during Hovember 1959; was in Geneva, Switzerland on 1 November; in Paris on 5 November from where he went to Brussels after a few days.
- 3. The Al-Nasir Trading Company is chiefly engaged in the marketing of rice and cotton. Cotton exported by the company, on the basis of government allocations, is seven percent of the total Egyptian export in this field. The firm is represented in Geneva and Paris by the Elstern Company over which it acquired control for the purpose of cotton export. One of its managers is 'Abd-al-'Azim Husayni, who makes occasional business trips to Europe.
  - 1. Headquarters Comment. A report of early January 1960 from unother source and area reported that the Al-Nasir Trading Company was reportedly an Egyptian Intelligence cover firm and that its manager, Italianmad Thenin, had opened an account in the Banqua Genevoise de Commerce et de Credit. This report stated that Chauim had been in Geneva on 6 November 1959, in Paris on 11 November, and in Brussels on 17 November.
