

FACTORS INFLUENCING

1. A KLADEL, described as his close relative to [redacted] Soviet spy, indicating he was a representative of U. S. Intelligence interests.
2. His requested asylum in the United States and did so by writing. In so doing and as a result of his detection, he demanded that he receive protection, which he was granted.
3. He has been proved beyond reasonable doubt to be a genuine defector and has provided actual and potential sources of valuable intelligence information, principally of a CI nature.
4. He is in the United States paroled to CIA; he has not yet been legally established for residence.
5. He apparently is convinced that both he and the information he has is of most exceptional value to the USG, has insisted on disseminating this with the highest levels of the U. S. Government, and has insisted on a very large sum of money and virtual carte blanche to use it for propaganda and political action operations directed against the USSR.
6. He has reacted with indignation to the suggestion that he be put on a salary of approximately \$1000.00 per month.

his property and recognize his value, apparently, by accept-
ing the same kind of demands he has made of the United States
Government.
