"During the months of June, July and August, more than eighty seven Soviet ships docked at Cuban ports carrying men and war saterial, that included ground-to-air rockets, and guided missiles with a range of over 1,000 miles."

Rochs added that as the information was correct in the past, he believed the information was correct at the present time.

Rochs explained that the reports were honest, were not inflated, and are not being used for propaganda purposes.

3. In order to take advantage of Rocha's presence in Washington, Mr. Relms suggested that Rocha take the rest



of the morning with two specialists and pinpoint on a map the underground missile sites which they have been reporting. Rochs answered he would be glad to do this, but that he was not the best man for the job as it was Angel Losano, who is presently in Missi, who had previously worked on these reports and pinpointed the locations with his Agency contacts in Missi.
