

## **NEW JUNTA FORMED** BY FOES OF CASTRO

Formation of a Cuhan Revolutionary Junta to seek the overthrow of the Castro regime by Cuban exiles and rebels in China was announced here yes-

by Cuban exiles and rebels in Cuba was annunced here yesterday.

The junta includes two former officials of Premier Fidet Castro's regime-Raul Chibas, who headed the National Railway, in 1852, and Manuel Itay, former Minister of Public Works.

Two others have been underground coordinators of anti-Castro forces in Cuba—José Gomez Rodriguez and Rogello Cisneros. A fifth member is José R. Ean Martin, architect and contractor.

The new coalition, Mr. Chibás reported here, was agreed tipon last Sunday in Rio Cahas, P. R. One of its resolutions opposed a plan to retrait Cutans into the United States Army. The junta said this would "present a negative image in the struggle of the Cuban people against Communism" and "create a situation of dependence and subordination."

The best strategy, the junta declared, would be "the internal resistance of the people which will eventually produce a general uprisang."
