<p>1. Appearing as part of Section 12 of the FPR on Mikhail Vasilievich MURASHOV (201-205150), forwarded with reference, are the following extracts. [REDACTED] Station would like to clarify some of the information previously reported by the station which undoubtedly has led Headquarters to the conclusion contained in the second paragraph immediately below.</p> <p>When told that Subject (Mikhail Vasilievich MURASHOV 201-205150) has been posted to Finland, Norway (a Soviet defector) commented that Subject (MURASHOV) would probably be responsible for penetrating the police.</p> <p>(This speculation by Source is probably not correct since this responsibility belongs to Peter Nikitovich SAVALEYEV, who arrived in Helsinki about the same time that Subject did, to replace Ivan Yefimovich SAVALEYEV.)</p> <p>2. Petr Nikitovich SAVALEYEV (201-140430), Counsellor of Embassy and head of the Press Section. SAVALEYEV filled the Counsellor slot vacated by Vasiliy Kirilich SOLODOVO (201-142338) who dealt with trade. He does not recall the Chief of the Press Section prior to SAVALEYEV's arrival, however, SAVALEYEV was NOT the replacement for Ivan SAVALEYEV (201-250447) as stated in [REDACTED] OFB#15447, 13 February 1962.</p> <p>22</p> <p>3. We doubt very much that SAVALEYEV was involved in police penetration. His contacts in Finland (also in Norway) were for the most part with the press ([REDACTED]-6610, 22 May 1964, etc.) and he circulated freely in that media. SAVALEYEV did not speak Finnish, despite the fact the [REDACTED] informed us he spoke fairly good Finnish ([REDACTED]-5447) which was probably an initial assessment on their part. 22</p> <p>4. PAVLOV was temporarily replaced by KGB officer Boris Vasiliyevich PERELETOV ostensibly assigned to the Cultural Section (OFKA-6493, 6 March 1964) who departed 31 March 1964 also because of ill health.
