1. Attached herewith is Arthur J. RAHEY's contact report of a meeting with KARIZ on 22 August 1961. The purpose of this contact was to determine KARIZ's current relationship with the RIS, ascertain his future plans, and debrief him about his friend William Steinsmith, an American who lives in Copenhagen illegally, and who has written several pro-Castro articles for local newspapers. He is also known to maintain a contact since February 1961 with the local Cuban legation officer Gabriel Califora.
2. We have asked A SOURCE to question Steinsmith, determine the reason for his living here illegally (without residence permit) and obtain as much additional data as possible about his source of income, activities, and contacts here.
3. We will keep Headquarters advised of future developments. This case has been discussed with THE FBI representative from London, who suggested that Headquarters coordinate this case with NCIS in Washington.
4. Forwarded under separate cover are copies of KARIZ's consular file including documents concerning his newly acquired wife.

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The interest in STEINER was explained by our desire to find out why an American citizen resided in Norway illegally. After the telephone interview was told that he should not reveal our interest in STEINER TO ANYONE, and he promised to do so.

b) According to KAWER, William STEINER, age 27-28, is a native of New York. His parents reside in Bronx, but their address is not known to KAWER. He believes that the name is fairly rare and that it should be easy to trace their residence through the Bronx telephone directory. As much as KAWER knows, STEINER resided in New York (possibly at the City College) and in California (possibly at the UCLA). His major was journalism. STEINER is a free-lance journalist and lives or travels from the paper or magazine of his journalistic work. To KAWER, STEINER has no other source of income.

c) At the present time, STEINER lives with his girl-friend, Tulla ERICSEN, 21, at Borreby 2. He is definitely not registered there. STEINER came to Copenhagen about 6-7 months ago. Before that time he lived in Tromsø, Norway. He had a 1-year residence permit for Norway. As far as KAWER knows, STEINER had a residence in Scandinavian countries in due to his desire to be with his girl-friend. The latter is of German descent, but lives a longer time in the USA, where she married (final) STEINER, possibly a year, from whom she separated (but they are still not formally divorced). She has a daughter, 10 years old, from that marriage, who is with her mother. KAWER does not know anything about STEINER, except that he is an American citizen. Tulla ERICSEN left Norway to Copenhagen, allegedly to study clothing design, but at the present time she has no money to attend any school or courses. In general, the couple lives from hand to mouth. At one time during the last winter, when they passed through a particular hard period, they stayed with KAWER.

d) KAWER met STEINER in winter 1960/61 and has been seeing him fairly frequently since spring 1961. KAWER did not provide a clear picture of how he met STEINER, but in the beginning it seems to have been a casual acquaintance through "a friend of a friend or a friend". In spring 1961 KAWER translated one of STEINER's articles on Cuba from English into Danish as a literary exercise. As a result of this work, they got to know each other more closely, but while they can be said to know each other well, KAWER does not consider STEINER a really close friend. In general, STEINER is a quiet and reserved person. KAWER characterized him as extremely well-read, interested in politics and economics, politically "left of the center". The articles of which KAWER is most familiar with are, the African question, the USA (USA expressed an anti-American view), etc., more recently, Latin America. The article on Cuba was published in the Danish journal "Indsigt" (other articles were reflected in "Altveit" and "Information"). STEINER writes only in English. He does not know any foreign languages well and has written a matter of French and Spanish. His language "mother tongue" is English.

KAWER does not know much about STEINER's background. He knows only that prior to his return to Norway, STEINER worked in New York as a sort of clerk or messenger for the American television "station", "WNET".

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tion. KNAUER believes that STEINMETZ has not traveled extensively and it is possibly limited only to exile (when he studied in California) and Norway and Denmark.

KNAUER knows STEINMETZ only under this name and has never learned directly or indirectly that STEINMETZ could have used another name. He has seen an article written by STEINMETZ, which was signed by "STEIN METZ", but that seems to be only a spelling variation of the same name.

j) In connection with STEINMETZ's article on Cuba, STEINMETZ visited the Cuban Embassy. In this capacity he met and got acquainted with the Cuban Charge d'Affaires, Gabriel CALLEGARI, a very intelligent and brilliant young man; he is a very good linguist and knows English, French, Chinese, possibly some Portuguese. KNAUER himself was introduced to CALLEGARI and has met him at least 3-5 times. Initially, THE INRRA and KNAUER even planned to exchange some language lessons, but after two lessons their efforts petered out. GENE MA, according to KNAUER, is a 1% "fascist", strongly anti-American, but has some reservations concerning the Russians and Communism, at least in his utterances towards KNAUER. The nature of contacts between CALLEGARI and STEINMETZ is not really known to KNAUER. He does not believe that STEINMETZ, through KNAUER, serves as a rather independent person, performs any particular services for CALLEGARI and doubts very much that STEINMETZ gets any money from CALLEGARI. As stated before, STEINMETZ's material situation is very poor. The only material guarantee he has is an assurance from his parents that they will pay his passage back to the United States.

k) KNAUER stated that STEINMETZ plans to return to the United States within 1-2 months. He will probably go to New York.

l) According to KNAUER who is aware of the fact that STEINMETZ resides in Denmark without a residence permit, the only known reason for STEINMETZ's coming first to Norway and then to Denmark was his desire to be with his girl friend (Tulla ZEMANOVIC). At one point, STEINMETZ told KNAUER that since he was planning to go back to the United States pretty soon, it did not really matter whether he had or had not a residence permit. In short, vis-a-vis KNAUER STEINMETZ represented his illegal residence as a case of personal negligence and indolence and as purely connected with personal reasons.

m) Summarizing the somewhat impressionistic data on STEINMETZ, KNAUER stated that he considers the man to be "quite progressive", but not necessarily Communist. On the other hand, STEINMETZ is not a type to baffle easily and though KNAUER has been knowing him for quite some time, he cannot make the claim to know him well. However, KNAUER does not believe that STEINMETZ is on any one's pay roll.

5. COMMUNIST PERSPECTIVE

a) KNAUER discussed STEINMETZ fairly frankly and without any visible mental reservations, but he obviously did not provide a complete

Pictures of the men and their relationship. In all fairness to KAWER he is not a good reporter in general, is not a very keen observer, and is not always able to concentrate on the topic at hand. But from the tenor of the interview and KAWER's total lack of any serious orientation, it would be possible to assume that the questioning concerning SEDLICK was his father's personality. He does not seem to have any guilt feelings concerning his relationship with SEDLICK. It is very unlikely that the latter has been cultivating KAWER on behalf of the FBI, if it is assumed that SEDLICK had his contacts.

b) KAWER's financial status has not been clarified completely, but the gift of \$1,000 by his father in connection with KAWER's wedding and increasing debauchery from Germany does not seem to be unusual. In KAWER's description of his father's business, the latter has a small enterprise and is certainly not a wealthy man, but he has some modest means and savings.

6. Final instructions:

a) KAWER asked for instructions for the event of a contact by the Soviets and was told that if such contacts and attempts of contacts should occur in the United States, he would have to contact the FBI immediately.
