1. FI/INT files contain 255 positive information disseminations produced by Project LIENVOY during calendar year 1962 -- 130 regular CS disseminations, 116 teletype reports on subjects of current or priority interest, and mine transmittals of official documents from Communist or leftist organizations in Mexico. LIENVOY reports provided information on the Mexican Communist Party (PCM), the Popular Socialist Party (PPS), the new but increasingly rewarful National Liberation Novement (MLN) an anti-US, pro-Cuba Communist Front, on other Front or leftist organizations, and on individuals active in these organizations. Among the persons of intelligence interest most extensively reported on were Vicente LOMRANDO Toledano, head of the PFS and an official in the World Federation of Trade Unions; Jorge L. TAMAYO Castillejos, an avowed Markist appointed to a government position; Braulic MAIDONADO Sandez, Communist former governor of Saja California; the former president of Mexico, General Lazaro CARDENAS del Rio, head of MLM; and General CARDENAS son, Cuauhtemoc CAMDENAS Solerzano. LIZEMOY provided also information on Mexican contacts with Soviet Bloc countries, with Cuba, and with leftists of other Latin American countries; on Communist and leftist publications; on Prensa Latina and other Cuban propaganda efforts in Mexico; on the reaction of Mexican and international Communists to the imprisonment of famed muralist David AIFARO Siqueiros, and their activities on his behalf. Valuable reporting in connection with President Kennedy's visit to Maxico was provided - Communist plans for sabctage, the Government's tactics to inhibit their fulfillment, and information on favorable reaction to the US President's speech expressed secretly by pro-Communist members of the MIN. Among the disseminations which had to do with Cuba, a number reported the transshipment of goods, a subject of special intelligence interest and one, which reported the views officials concerning the Cuban crisis, was described of high-level by CI's analyst as extremely valuable.

After about an hour both got in an automobile and continued to watch the building from the car, and from time to time appeared to be taking notes on the comings and goings of the installations, as well as making notes on the cars used by the personnel of the LF. The Traffic Department was staked out to determine who, if anyone, might show an interest in the names and addresses of the cars used by LP personnel. B. Changes.

At a yet to be determined date, it is planned to move the intercept center from its present location. Two reasons are behind this move:

Such equipment is now under consideration by KURIOT and when it becomes available, an amendment to this project will be forwarded requesting approval for the transfer of the intercept center.

C. Intelligence Production.

The activities report forwarded to Headquarters each month lists the intelligence reports received from this project. During 1962 there were 534 intelligence reports produced by this project which were forwarded to Headquarters through 1 December 1962. All of these concerned RFDM-6 reporting priorities and current requirements levied by Headquarters and the ODACID installation.

In addition, this project produces a large amount of information which is not disseminated on a current basis but is reported to ODACID, ODENVY and other ODYOKE agencies in reply to a steady stream of routine file trace requests. These file trace requests run into the thousands each month. It would be difficult to determine the exact percentage of the information produced by LIENVOY; but in many instances involving large portions of the file came to us through LIENVOY coverage.

D. Effectiveness.

The LIENVOY project provides the Station with a which is both effective and rapid as well as covert. The Station continues to receive the daily "resumen" highlights from the thirty (30) lines covered. A high percentage of current intelligence is disseminated from these daily reports. In addition, full transcripts are received on Soviet and Czech lines and on any of the thirty targets we may request. A good part of this is personality data useful only to KUDAPK and in some cases to ODENVY. In addition, the project provides a support mechanism for covering targets of interest to KUBAPK or other ODYOKE agencies.

E. Problems.

There have been no significant security, cover, control or liaison problems during the past year.

The total for the past year will be approximately US \$36,975.00.

2. For the next project year.

During the period 1 February 1963 through 31 January 1964, an estimated amount of US \$47,068.00 will be required with US \$18,210.00 to be spent from 1 February 1963 through 30 June 1963 and US \$28,858.00 to be spent from 1 July 1963 through 31 January 1964.
