1. During 4 through 10 December 1964, Howard A. TRECKLER and AMNIP-1 were in Madrid in connection with reference operation. On 6 December, AMNIP-1 went to visit a cousin of his wife after which he was to meet TRECKLER at 1900 hours in the cocktail lounge of the Hotel Castellana Hilton.

2. AMNIP-1 arrived in the lounge at approximately 1200 hours in the company of the relative he had been visiting, and immediately upon entering the lounge he was accosted by AMILASH-2 and AMILASH-3, acquaintances of his from past years. AMNIP-1 took them and the relative to a table where they had few drinks. Although TRECKLER was present in the lounge, he was not exposed to them. The group departed after approximately an hour. In a brush contact, TRECKLER instructed AMNIP-1 to report promptly anything of significance which might occur during the balance of the evening. At 0330 hours on 7 December AMNIP-1 came to TRECKLER's hotel room and reported the following.

3. AMILASH-2 and AMILASH-3 stated they were interested in establishing contact with KUBARK. AMILASH-2 gave as the reason for his not contacting AMNIP-1's initial contact with him in Paris in March 1964, that he had been waiting for his father and wife to get out of Cuba. His wife is now in Spain and his father is in New York City. AMILASH-2 said he had sent his father to ZMETAL to contact AMNIP-1 but that his father had been advised AMNIP-1 was unavailable at the time. AMILASH-3 stated he was no longer under a cloud with the Cuban government as the Ambassador in Paris had put in a good word on his behalf with President OSVALDO PIRES.

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AMAS-2 and AMAS-3 were seen at the Hotel Intercontinental in Paris on 6 December. They were accompanied by AMAS-1.

b. AMAS-2 said he was aware AMAS-1 was working for TECUMBLE and that he had visited him in Paris recently. After his reputation had been建立, totally by the Cuban exile community, AMAS-2 expressed a preference to work for KUBAK or through KUBAK's offices from another area. In addition, AMAS-2 stated that if something big was in the offing in Cuba he would be able to go back for a short time preceding the action but that on the whole he probably would not last.

c. AMAS-1 told AMAS-2 and AMAS-3 he would meet them for breakfast on 7 December at the Castellana Hotel in Madrid while they were in Spain. AMAS-2 and AMAS-3 agreed to do anything on their behalf. After meeting with the TECUMBLE advised AMAS-1 to tell them there was nothing at this time but that he would let them know if anything developed. AMAS-1 advised them that this was done away with the impression that AMAS-2 and AMAS-3 are opportunists, only looking for money, and not worth the time and effort of him doing.

d. One evening of 7 December, TECUMBLE and AMAS-1 were caught together walking along Avenida Jose Antonio by AMAS-2 and AMAS-3 when the latter pair got out of a taxi enroute to a movie. TECUMBLE drove off and walked along while AMAS-1 spoke briefly to them. No further contact was made with AMAS-2 or AMAS-3 during the rest of the trip.

e. During their initial contact, AMAS-2 asked AMAS-1 if he was aware that Felice MONTENEGRO Chasp was in Algeria with a Cuban Trade delegation and whether he knew MONTENEGRO personally. AMAS-1 replied in the negative to both questions and said that the only MONTENEGRO he knew was a Cuban V.A.C. member, Negro, a former associate in the Cuban C-2. AMAS-2 stated that he and AMAS-3 had lunched with the delegation this day.

f. The following items of interest were gleaned from AMAS-1's conversations with AMAS-2 and AMAS-3.

a. Felipe LLAUDI Hernandez was in Paris recently after attending a three-month training course in the Soviet Union. (LLAUDI is a Cuban Intelligence officer in the International Section of the Direccion General de Inteligencia (DGI) and is known to AMAS-1). Reportedly in attendance with LLAUDI at this course were Manuel PINERO Losada ("Parachoja"), the Chief of the DGI, "Papo" (LNU) and another unknown person. LLAUDI bragged about having been in conversations with the head of the KGB. LLAUDI was supposed to travel to Algeria, then return to either Paris or Madrid. (TIA [redacted] reported this from another source in [redacted] 3017, 8 December 1964.) LLAUDI and Segundo PEREZ Alvarez were in Canada a few months ago.

b. Segundo PEREZ Alvarez is currently in Paris. He was replaced in his position in the Cuban Foreign Ministry following a nervous breakdown.

c. "Pao" IGLESIAS Parino (probably Felice MONTENEGRO Parino, a

Minister of the Interior, 1930-1933. In 1933 he was appointed Minister of the Interior, and he remained in this post until 1936. He was succeeded by General Francisco Franco. c. ~~CO~~⁰² WALT-1 is in hazard and will do nothing for income.

6. All D.L.C.-I.I. banks in the lower grades of the Cuban Government.

Mr. Luis Alberto Angel de Q. INQUIZIZ, the Director of Cuban Railroads, was recently in Madrid and Paris. He is a member of the Cuban Security Service (not specified whether it is CSC or DSC) and a good friend of FIDEL CASTRO, Cuban Minister of Transportation.

In addition, Silvio CASTILLO and Miguel GUITART were supposed to travel from Cuba to Paris, from where they wanted to travel to other parts of Europe. CASTILLO was described as a negro anti-Communist Captain in the Cuban G-2 who is now a member of the DSE. He was reportedly trying to pass himself off as an anti-Communist in order to infiltrate Cuban exile groups. GUITART was described as a former Captain in the Cuban Army and a radio to Eligio AMELIEINAS Delgado, Vice-Minister of the Armed Forces.

On the evening of 7 December, AMNP-1 managed to meet AMSPOKT-1 and ALWHIP-1, old friends of his from pre-Casino days. Apparently, AMSPOKT-1 was not yet aware that AMNP-1 had defected, for in the initial portions of their conversation he tried to recruit AMNP-1 for KUBARK. Following this meeting, AMNP-1 inquired of TRACLEEN as to the status of AMSPOKT-1 and ALNP-1 via 2-vis-2-vis KUBARK. TRACLEEN answered truthfully in replying he did not know and attempted to fend off further inquiries from AMNP-1. What followed was a classic example of the Cilia circle of infiltration through association. AMNP-1 has been asking KUBARK to let him contact ANLASH-1 in a recruitment pitch and Headquarters has been sending off AMNP-1 for obvious reasons. AMNP-1 asked why we could not go to Paris to pitch ANLASH-1 and was stalled again by TRACLEEN. In his conversation with AMSPOKT-1 and ALWHIP-1, AMNP-1 discovered that they had recently been in Paris. From this, AMNP-1 deduced that (1) AMSPOKT-1 and ALWHIP-1 were twin old friends of ANLASH-1 and had been in Paris recently while ANLASH-1 was there, (2) AMSPOKT-1 and ALWHIP-1 were apparently working for KUBARK, (3) KUBARK could not let him attempt a contact with ANLASH-1, (4) therefore KUBARK was already in contact with ANLASH-1 via AMSPOKT-1 and ALWHIP-1.

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
