Prior to her departure from New York, June Cobb visited the Cuban Consulate in New York City as requested prior to her departure from New Name and Sevena. While there she was introduced to an American citizen named Dernie Brenner, a newspaperman from the Miami Beach Run. Brenner is a friend of Cobb's boss Juan Orta, the Administrative assistant of Fitel Castro. Brenner gave Cobb a note in an envelope that was sealed for delivery to Orta. Cobb opened the note and copied the contents which were as follows:

"Tell "O" that Harmy (Manuel) argues (vis.1) is "not, real vot". The Peds are on aim. Against the priest fin ered aim in Ashinston". "Menender in Eay wast works in the postoffice is being watched. There is a fed working right there in the post office with him. They have some letters marked just waither for him to open one. He's not. The State Department - - Also tell'em not to use those replicas of dollar bills the tourist healthent is using with something written on back".

""George Louthworth is working with the feds. I got him drunk with a "les" (lesbian) and a straight with anisome dicturer one night. He said he was going to put the shift to Tapt. Querra."
"Tell Doris dadrone who lives in 8 y 19 pt. building with a paby by Orlando dadrone that the feds are trying to get to her. Bidel brought her to Guba because she know some things she shouldn't know".

Burch: According to information given verbally by Harry Hermsdorf, when Igor went to the airport and approached Cobb, she waved him away. He waited at some distance while she scritbled away at the notes; she then folded them in a newspaper and left them for him to pick up. Harry did not say whether she walked away immediately after leaving the notes, or whether she folded them in the paper and then waited for the two supposed members of the Cuban Consulate to join her before boarding the plane.
