INTER-STATE - USA

On February 26, 1963, a confidential informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he has learned through [redacted]

that Joao Giro Varejao, President, Cuban Revolutionary Council, an anti- Castro organization, would arrive in [redacted] 1963, aboard Pan American Airways flight [redacted]. The informant determined that Varejao would be accompanied by one Luis Bottifil (phonetic). Bottifil was not further quantified to the informant.

In regard to the above, it is noted that on September 3, 1961, "The Washington Post Times Herald" on page A-13, carried an article concerning the planned merger of the Cuban Revolutionary Council and the Democratic Revolutionary Front, another anti-Castro organization. It was reflected in the above article that one Luis Botilloll was a spokesman for the Democratic Revolutionary Front. It is possible that Luis Motifil (phonetic), mentioned above, is identical with Luis Botilloll, mentioned in the newspaper article.

The position of [redacted] was verified through the "Diplomatic List", dated November, 1969, and published by the United States Department of State.
