This is to inform you, that is affected of focal epilepsy and he underwant surgery on 5/6/64. Unfortunately, it was not possible to cbtain a completely radical result from the procedure and he was advised to continue taking medication. He has been taking a rather high desage of anticonvulsant drugs, which as you know may some way interfere with the normal thinking process and make the patient rather drowsy and slow.

It is possible that this medication may be erranged in the future so that less interference may appear. I am giving you this information because of the possibilities that it may relate to his difficulties in education.
