As the former UK Head of Capability Building for CVE Strategic Communications at the UK-led Counter-Daesh Coalition ('The Coalition'), Rebecca is an experienced global practitioner, with over 15 years' experience managing and monitoring programmes, developing business and leading evaluations, representing organisations to governments, working on conflict and fragile states, human rights, strategic communication, P/CVE and capability building. Representing the UK Government, Arab Governments and UN agencies to International audiences, she has highly honed diplomatic and liaison skills and is a senior advisor to the government in the UK.
