Министерството на външните работи на Република България поднася своите почитания на Посолството на Азербайджанската Република в София и в отговор на негова нота № AZN/039/15, от 11 февруари 2015 г. има честта да го уведоми, че прелитанията във въздушното пространство на Република България и кацането на територията на страната на 02 март 2015 г., от самолет В 747-400 (reg. 4K-SW008 or sub. 4K-SW888/ VQ-BVB/VQ-BVC, call sign AZG 9431/ AZG 9432), собственост на азербайджанската авиокомпания "Silk Way West Airlines", свързани с реализацията на позициониращ полет по маршрут Баку-Бургас и на товарен полет с продукция за нуждите на отбраната по маршрут Бургас- Кабул се разрешават с дипломатическо разрешение № 194-17.

Полетите трябва да се реализират при стриктно спазване на правилата и процедурите за извършване на полети във въздушното пространство на Република България, регламентирани от българското законодателство и публикувани в "Сборника за аеронавигационна информация и публикация на Република България-AERONAUTICAL INFORMATION PUBLICATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF BULGARIA (AIP) и допълнително публикуваните NOTAMI (NOTAMs) с цел актуализирането на аеронавигационната обстановка.

Дипломатическото разрешение е валидно 3 часа преди и 72 часа след заявените дата и часове за прелитане/кацане.

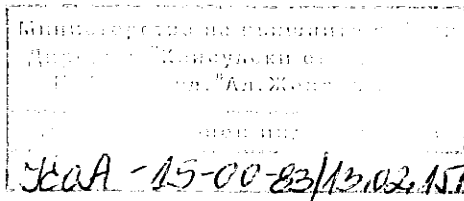

EXEMPTION FOR TRANSPORTATION OF DANGEROUS GOODS BY AIR

Referring to paragraph 1.1.2 of Chapter I of ICAO Doc 9284 AN/905 (T.I.) and paragraph 1.2.6 of Section I of IATA DGR the Directorate General "Civil Aviation Administration" of the Republic of Bulgaria hereby grants the following exemption for transportation of dangerous goods by air:

FLIGHT DETAILS:

FLIGHT NUMBERS: AZG 9432

DATE OF OPERATION: 02 March 2015

SHIPPER: Arsenal J.S.C., 100 Rozova Dolina Str., 6100 Kazanlak, Bulgaria

CONSIGNEE: Afghan National Police


PACKED ACCORDING UN INSTRUCTION 141

CONDITIONS OF EXEMPTION:

- The Dangerous Goods must be packed in accordance with the relevant Packing instructions of ICAO T.I. and any applicable Supplement thereto.
- The Dangerous Goods category compatibility requirements must be strictly observed.
- Loading and unloading operations under this Exemption must be conducted only at a location, specified by the relevant Airport Authorities.
- The acceptance, loading, unloading and stowage of the said Dangerous Goods must be carried out in compliance with ICAO T.I. and any applicable Supplement thereto.
- All loading and unloading operations must be suspended during thunderstorm.
- Control over completion of shipping and other documents for the transportation of this Dangerous Goods, verifying the compliance of the cargo, packing and marking with ICAO T.I. requirements and other necessary activities must be conducted by certified personnel of Silk Way West Airlines.
- It is recommended during the flight to avoid routes over densely populated areas.
- In case of any unscheduled landing at airport out of the specified flight route, the crew of the aircraft must immediately inform the responsible Airport Authority about the nature and quantity of the transported Dangerous Goods.
- In case of any emergency situation onboard in connection with the transportation of this cargo by air, the crew of the aircraft must follow ICAO Emergency Response Guidance for Aircraft Incidents Involving Dangerous Goods (Doc 9481).

- Any Dangerous Goods Accident or Dangerous Goods Incident, involving the transportation of this cargo by air, must be immediately reported to the Civil Aviation Administration.
- No persons shall be carried on board, other than members of the flight crew or employees or agents of the shipper with functions, related to the safe transportation of the said Dangerous Goods.
- This Exemption is revocable by the Civil Aviation Administration, if necessary for safety reasons.
- The crew of the aircraft must be provided with written instructions, stating the conditions and limitations of the operations being conducted.
- The crew of the aircraft must have relevant training course on safety measures for transportation of Dangerous Goods.
- The insurance cover must be adequate to convey this nature of Dangerous Goods.
- This Exemption in no way affects the need of obtaining any required authorizations from the competent authorities of the countries of origin, transit and destination.
- All other regulations (marking labeling etc.) of the ICAO T.I. (resp. IATA DGR) remain unaffected.
- A copy of this Exemption and all relevant documentation concerning the transportation of the said Dangerous Goods must be carried on board during the flight.

THE EXEMPTION SHALL BE VALID FOR THE PERIOD: 02 March – 02 April 2015
