Министерството на външните работи на Република България поднася своите почитания на Посолството на Азербайджанската Република в София и в отговор на неговаnota № AZ/N/747/17, от 10 март 2017 г. има честта да го уведоми, че прелитането във въздушното пространство на Република България на 22/23 март 2017 г. от самолет Boeing 747 (reg.VQ-BVB or sub.VQ-BVC/ VQ-BWY/ VQ-BVH/ VP-BCH/4K-SW008, call sign AZG 2124), собственост на азербайджанската авиокомпания "SILK WAY WEST AIRLINES", свързано с изпълнение на товарен полет с продукция, предназначена за от branata, по маршрут KJFK-UBBB (тех. кацане)-ORBI, се разрешава с дипломатическо разрешение № 194-54.

Полетът трябва да се реализира при стриктно спазване на правилата и процедурите за извършване на полети във въздушното пространство на Република България, регламентирани от българското законодателство и публикувани в "Сборника за аeronавигационна информация и публикация на Република България-AERONAUTICAL INFORMATION PUBLICATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF BULGARIA (AIP) и допълнително публикуваните NOTAMs (NOTAMs) с цел актуализирането на аeronавигационната обстановка.

**EXEMPTION FOR TRANSPORTATION OF DANGEROUS GOODS BY AIR**

Referring to Regulation (EU) 965/2012 CAT.GEN.MPA 200 (a), paragraph 2.1.2 of Chapter 1 of ICAO Doc 9284 AN/905 (T.I.) and paragraph 1.2.6 of ICAO Doc 9461 (T.I.), the Directorate General "Civil Aviation Administration" of the Republic of Bulgaria, makes known the following exemption for transportation of dangerous goods by air:

**PACKED ACCORDING UN INSTRUCTION 130.****CONDITIONS OF EXEMPTION:**

- The Dangerous Goods must be packed, marked and labelled in accordance with the instructions of ICAO Doc 9284 AN/905 (T.I.) and any applicable Supplement thereto. The Dangerous Goods category compatibility requirements must be strictly observed.
- Loading and unloading operations under this Exemption must be conducted only at airports approved by the relevant Airport Authorities.
- The acceptance, loading, unloading and stowage of the said Dangerous Goods must be in compliance with ICAO Doc 9284 AN/905 (T.I.) and any applicable Supplement thereto.
- All loading and unloading operations must be suspended during thunderstorm.
- Control over completion of shipping and other documents for the transportation of this Dangerous Goods, verifying the compliance of the cargo, packing and marking with ICAO Doc 9284 AN/905 (T.I.) requirements and other necessary activities must be conducted by certified personnel of the said Airlines.
- It is recommended during the flight to avoid routes over densely populated areas.
- In case of any unscheduled landing at airport out of the specified flight route, the crew of aircraft must immediately inform the responsible Airport Authority about the nature and quantity of transported Dangerous Goods.
- In case of any emergency situation onboard in connection with the transportation of this Dangerous Goods, the crew of the aircraft must follow ICAO Emergency Response Guidance for Aircraft Incidents with Dangerous Goods (Doc 9461).
- Any Dangerous Goods Accident or Dangerous Goods Incident, involving the transportation of Dangerous Goods by air, must be immediately reported to the Civil Aviation Administration.
- No persons shall be carried on board, other than members of the flight crew or staff of the shipper with functions, related to the safe transportation of the said Dangerous Goods.

This Exemption is revocable by the Civil Aviation Administration, if necessary for safety reasons.

- The crew of the aircraft must be provided with written instructions, stating the conditions of carriage of Dangerous Goods, and the nature and extent of the operations being conducted.
- The crew of the aircraft must have relevant training course on safety measures for the protection of Dangerous Goods.
- The insurance cover must be adequate to convey this nature of Dangerous Goods.
- This Exemption in no way affects the need of obtaining any required authorization from the appropriate authorities of the countries of origin, transit and destination.
- All other regulations (marking labeling etc.) of the ICAO Doc 9284 AN/901 (TSA) remain unaffected.
- A copy of this Exemption and all relevant documentation concerning the transportation of Dangerous Goods must be carried on board during the flight.

**THE EXEMPTION SHALL BE VALID FOR THE PERIOD: 22 March - 09 April 2001**
