Western Macedonia: Funding for corporate social responsibility projects to the areas affected by TAP - ERT Kozani links to full text in Greek

ERT (Greek national broadcaster; 13,000 on-line unique daily visitors) – Antonis Mavridis - 02.03.2016

TAP will invest €32 million in the prefectures of Western, Central and Eastern Macedonia and Thrace for corporate social responsibility (CSR) activities, became known during a meeting between Energy Minister Skourletis, representatives of TAP and of the three Prefectures. Western Macedonia was represented by Prefect Karypidis.

Out of the €32 million, €7 million concerns proposals for CSR in Kozani, Florina and Kastoria, €10 million for Central Macedonia, €10 million for Eastern Macedonia-Thrace and €5million will go to a "savings account" for the three prefectures. TAP, according to its design, will pass through Western Macedonia for 100 km, 230 km in Central and 228 km in Eastern Macedonia-Thrace. The four axes of the CSR programme are environment, education, professional training in the energy field, social-economic development, agricultural development and tourism, and quality of life.

Upgrade in the energy sector discussed at the meeting Skourletis-EBRD links to full text in Greek

Energy Minister Skourletis discussed the possibilities for Greece to receive funds for energy infrastructure projects from the EBRD during a meeting with top executives of the bank. He mentioned the recent developments in the energy projects, the goals of the ministry for fighting energy poverty, the decrease of prices for households and businesses and the reinforcement of the energy security.

Skourletis referred to TAP, IGB, the potential construction of the LNG terminal in Alexandroupoli, the upgrade of the LNG terminal in Revythoussa, the connections of the islands with the onshore electricity system and the plan of connecting Israel, Cyprus and Greece. He also underlined the expansion of the internal gas network, saying that the possibilities and potentials are immense. Greece is working hard on turning the country into an energy hub. Specifically, the planned TAP, IGB, a floating LNG terminal, upgrades to an existing LNG terminal, and electricity links with Israel and Cyprus, were

The Greek energy ministry had a delegate to the Southern Gas Advisory Council meeting in Azerbaijan. "The gas transportation from Azerbaijan to Europe, and possibly the future of alternative power sources in the Caspian Sea, essentially serves the objective of all European nations, the diversification of sources and routes of gas," said the ministry's general secretary for energy.

Gas: EU and U.S. distance themselves from Gazprom-DEPA-Edison deal links to full text in Greek

Speaking in Baku during the second meeting of the Southern Gas Corridor's (SGC) Advisory Council, U.S., EU and Italian officials distanced themselves from recent efforts to revive ITGI pipeline by Gazprom, DEPA and Edison. U.S. energy envoy Hochstein said that "the only way to resolve the EU energy security is through diversification. More projects that simply bring the same gas from the same fields to the same consumers, although through a new pipe, will not contribute to energy security". Hochstein also praised the SGC (TANAP and TAP) as the only way to achieve Europe's energy source diversification.

Vice President of the EC in charge of the Energy Union Sefcovic said that "what we have seen about ITGI is the announcement, so it is difficult to present a clear position at this stage. It is not clear where the gas will come from and what should be the route". State Secretary to the Italian Prime Minister De Vincenti emphasized the key role of Azerbaijan in diversifying Europe's energy supplies making Azeri gas supplies the number one priority. The energy landscape in Greece, Cyprus and Israel links to full text in Greek

Article provides an overview of energy sector developments in Greece, Israel and Cyprus. Greece and Cyprus largely play a supporting role in the region's developments, and should thus ensure that they can be successful at least in this regard (through ensuring that energy projects are not hindered by red tape and fostering regional collaboration) if they wish to become serious players.

TAP installation and route plans have been approved; it is a key project in the implementation of the Southern Gas Corridor; it can be linked to a number of regional interconnectors, including IGB, Vertical Gas Corridor and IAP. TAP and its branching interconnectors stand a better chance than most other planned pipelines for Greece as they are aligned with the EU's plans to reduce dependence on Russian gas. TAP and ITGI are clearly competitors, as they follow almost parallel routes and address the same clients, but carry gas from different suppliers. The West has abandoned Nabucco in favour of TAP, which "drastically reduces Europe and the Balkans' dependence on Russia" and "additionally makes Greece a central energy player in the Balkans". The pipeline's preparation, including expropriations, is moving ahead in Greek Macedonia and Thrace "despite some provincial reactions". All the evidence points towards the cancellation of a long-negotiated buyout of DESFA by SOCAR and (following EC concerns about the Azeri company acquiring undue market influence) one or more of European gas companies Snam, Fluxys and Enagas. Three main reasons are cited: a potential lowering of future gas grid usage fees sought by the Greek government which is significantly reducing investors' interest; the risks attached to the Greek market as a whole; SOCAR's own financial problems, stemming from low oil prices. Olive trees to be replanted. Ministry helps TAP links to full text in Italian

The Italian Ministry of Agricultural has saved TAP and all the companies that want to carry out public works in Salento. Olive trees along the route of TAP will be removed and then replanted, although they are full of Xylella (olive tree bacterium). Italian Minister of Agricultural Martina has signed a decree, published in the Official Journal of the government, saying: "The Regional Plant Protection Service may authorize the movement of olive trees for the realisation of works, declared as public". Now, TAP must only solve the problem concerning the verification of compliance with certain requirements of the region, before it can proceed with its construction, scheduled to be opened in spring. Emiliano supports TAP: "Gas instead of coal" links to full text in Italian

Apulia's Regional Council had a meeting in Brindisi to discuss the problems that beset the area. TAP has been frequently mentioned. As known, Apulia's president Emiliano has indicated Brindisi as a landfall for TAP, encountering strong resistance from institutions.

He has certainly not changed his position, insisting that: "Gas is the future that awaits us. It is the right fuel for the transition to new technologies that lower CO2 emissions. In addition, gas breaks down 100% of fine dust emissions of dioxin and this is definitely crucial for us. Italy has made a commitment to Europe towards "decarbonisation" (of steelworks IIva). With this in mind, we made a specific proposal to the government and we are now waiting for a response. Our plans include TAP's landfall in Brindisi, as long as the price of gas goes down to that of coal. One thing is sure: we cannot keep using coal for another 30years". <u>Baku asks, Europe responds</u> links to full text in Italian

The second meeting of the Advisory council for the Southern Gas Corridor took place on February 29. There are only a few statements from the meeting, mostly filtered through the Azeri press agency. The Italian government has provided no official statement, although the High Representative of the EU for Foreign Affairs and Security Mogherini participated at the meeting, while Baku noted that a final statement was signed by the participating governments, under the auspices of the European Commissioner for Energy Union Sefcovic.

Until now, only the European Investment Bank (EIB) is officially considering a loan of €2 billion to TAP. TAP Managing Director Bradshaw, also present in Baku, announced that the opening ceremony for TAP construction will take place in late May or early June in Thessaloniki. In Italy, there are still many press articles about the failing activities pf the Azeri Embassy, which tries to prevent the public event on violations of human rights in the country organised by Amnesty International in Rome. Therefore, Azerbaijan remains a bad partner of Italy in the European energy transition.

TAP, its environment model followed in Albania should also be applied in Greece links to full text in Albanian

The model followed in Albania by TAP in respecting the environment, culture and society should be also followed by Greece. According to the Greek local radio station Lehovo, the preparatory phase for the construction of TAP has shown its serious commitment to respecting tradition, cultural heritage and environment in Albania. One example is Vithkuq village in the Korca region, known for its tourist attractions. According to a representative of the village quoted by Lehovo, TAP expertise is to be trusted and have offered full cooperation to ensure the protection of archaeological and cultural sites. TAP will follow the same pattern and model, respect of environmental and social environment in Greece too. (Note: Lehovo radio broadcast was included in the monitoring report on February 10)

Albanian Oil and Gas Institute to be re-opened after 9 years links to full text in Albanian Top Channel (Albanian broadcaster; 180,000 on-line unique daily visitors) - 02.03.2016 Nine years after it was closed, the Oil and Gas Institute will be opened and redesigned due to the implementation of TAP in Albania, and it will include studies for all gas infrastructures. The reestablishment of the institution is part of the "Building high infrastructure capacities in the gas sector" project funded by the Swiss government with €6 million. The launch of the project was announced by the Minister of Energy Gjiknuri and the Swiss Ambassador in Tirana.

Gjiknuri underlined the importance of the Institute project for technical capacity building in the oil and gas sector in Albania since the country has suffered from a loss of these specific capacities during the last decade. Another important element of the project is to start the operation of Vlora thermal power plant (TPP) with gas and the feasibility study to be conducted for connecting the TPP with TAP. The project also includes a comparison of TAP agreements in Greece and Albania, in order to maximize the benefits for Albania. It seems that Russia is seriously concerned about the progress of the SGC and the competition with Azerbaijan in gas supply to Europe.

According to the Ambassador of Israel to Azerbaijan Stav, the Southern Gas Corridor (SGC) has a global significance as energy remains the major source that human beings are depending on. "We are watching with great interest the process of development of the SGC project. Israel will start producing gas for export in the coming years. Accordingly, an issue of Israel's joining the SGC project, especially TANAP, will be duly considered".

The private energy sector in Turkey is ready to support the Turkish government to enhance Turkey's energy market, said Erdal Aksoy, chairman of Aksoy Holding and of Turkish fuel retail company Turcas Oil. "In the last 10 years, Turkey's gas consumption increased to 50 bcm. Therefore, an increase in global gas production is an advantage and offers opportunities for Turkey".
