
In my opinion this kind of behaviour makes me wonder perhaps you know more mysteries then you make out to be or perhaps other reasons.


Well, I like to be open-minded in a balanced manner even after all the sweral UFO books I have read.

  2. The site, Grid Reference 346392 was a vergin, un-weather damaged, near ripe field of wheat. We found the following:
  - a. An exactly circular hole in the wheat in which the wheat had been laid flat in a clockwise twist 40 ft in diameter. (As if a plank had been put with one end at the centre and then swept round in a complete circle). There were one or two stalks of wheat standing which had sprung upright again. The wheat on the edge of the circle was completely upright and undamaged.
  - b. Four separate, smaller circles approx twelve feet in diameter, exactly similar to the larger one. These were set in a precise square, NORTH/SOUTH and EAST/WEST, with their centres 43 paces from the centre of the large circle.
  - c. There were absolutely no tracks in the wheat. To have set the holes in such a precise pattern manually would have required a tape measure or string, and the users would have been bound to leave tracks in the wheat.
  - d. All but one of the holes touched onto the main furrows in the wheat, and could therefore be approached from the edge of the field without leaving tracks. However there was no way of moving from one to the other without leaving tracks in the wheat, except by going some 200 yards to the edge of the field, and then back down another main furrow. One of the smaller holes was completely isolated.


### Founder's Day at Hordle House School

I have to report that at 21.37 hours Sunday 7 July 1985 I was at Sowerby Bridge Police Station when I received a report by telephone from a Section 40 born 22.12.15 of Section 40 Rishworth, that at between 2.50 am and 3.10 am on Sunday 7 July 1985 he saw in an easterly direction from his house, at an altitude of 5 above the horizon a strong white light which he said was flickering and was travelling in a southerly direction towards Manchester.

I suggested to him that this may have been a sighting of an aircraft but he insisted that this was not the case. I therefore respectfully suggest that this report be forwarded to the Force HQ for the attention of Chief Superintendent, Admin and that he may feel it worthy of being passed to the Ministry of Defence Department S4F (Air), Main Building, Whitehall, London SW1A 2HB for their information.

Dear Sirs,

I am writing to confirm the information I gave by telephone to the Duty Officer, RAF Operations, at approximately 0110 on Saturday 25 May 1985.

I reported that during a visit to friends at Cowley Hill, a little north of Borehamwood, Hertfordshire, I had seen - at some time between 2100 and 2130 hours on Friday 24 May 1985 - a triangular array of lights in the direction of Elstree. They appeared to form an equilateral triangle of white to yellow lights, self-illuminated, with the base parallel to the horizon, at an elevation of 30 to 40 degrees. I reported the azimuth as being about South East, but telephoned the Operations Room again at about 1730 on Saturday 25 May 1985 to say that this was clearly in error: the azimuth was certainly South West rather than South East.

I heard no sound and detected no movement in this array of lights. It appeared to be stationary in the sky below cloud cover which I estimated at about 10/10ths stratus. The sighting lasted for about 2 minutes, suggesting to me that I was not observing an aircraft in (for example) the Heath Row circuit.

I can make no estimate of distance. But the angular dimensions of the object were (approximately):-

- a. About one sixth of the diameter of the moon for each of the three lights (viz. five or six minutes of arc).
- b. About five or six diameters between each of the three lights, viz. each side of the equilateral triangle must have been of the order of 40 or more minutes of arc.

As a former member of the British Astronomical Association (which I only recently relinquished on moving to London, where telescopic observation is impossible) and as an ex-RAF navigator, I rather doubt that I am easily deceived by aerial phenomena. My distinct impression is that I perceived an event for which no rady explanation is possible in wholly conventional terms. Astronomical phenomena are, I think, ruled out by the extensive cloud cover as well as by the very regular, triangular formation of the three lights seen. And aircraft lights seem a very unlikely explanation.

In view of the impossibility of estimating a precise distance for the sighting, I was not able to answer the questions put to me by the Operations Room and again by the Duty Desk at the MOD Main Building, Whitehall, about whether the sighting was near to high-power voltage lines, bodies of still water or a local town. There is a reservoir near Elstree; high-voltage lines are endemic in Hertfordshire; and the county abounds in towns. But I can give you only the angular dimensions of the object(s) seen; and the precise distance must remain

a matter of speculation.


I would like to add that I was greatly heartened, as an ex-MOD official, to discover that serious attention is being paid to events in British airspace, not only by the Duty Desk in Whitehall but also by yourselves. I am most grateful for the courtesy with which my report was received. I am, of course, well aware that the Flying Complaints Flight has the thankless task of responding to members of the public who feel, rightly or wrongly (and perhaps often wrongly !) that uncovenanted military flying has taken place in their local areas. I would like to stress that I am most certainly not making a complaint. I merely hope that my own observation has contributed to your surveillance.

I would, of course, be most interested to know (within whatever limits of security you must observe) what interpretation is placed upon my report and what expert evaluation of it has been made of it by other authorities beyond your own unit.

However I am not asking for any classified information to be divulged to me, but I would just like to reassure Section 40 that they did in fact see something that was not a natural phenomenon (aurora, heavenly body etc.) but that whatever it was, it did not originate from a foreign country or indeed from outer space:

I would only add that the Section 40 are old friends of many years standing, and are most reliable and level-headed witnesses.

I would be most grateful for any reassurances along the above lines that can be given to me.

On the night of the I6th Feb. I985 I crossed our farmyard and happened to look up at the sky as it was so clear and the stars were very bright, the first time for several weeks. Although I am not familiar with the positions and names of stars, one very bright light to the west caught my attention. It appeared about six times larger than the brightest constellation that night and seemed to hover as if dangling from a string. About every five minutes the intensity of light increased and a red glow at the base seemed to increase. The green rays on either side seemed more definite. After two minutes the light would decrease and the colours fade.

I called my husband, who was quite sceptical until he watched it for a few minutes. He said it could only be a hot-air ballonn and the periodic red glow was the gas. I pointed out that there was quite a lot of wind and I did not see how a hot-air balloon could remain fairly stationary for such a long period. We debated the various possibilities and came to the conclusion that we were witnessing one of the mysterious UFO's we had previously ridiculed.

I first spotted it at 8. Iopm and continued to observe it until 8.45pm. At this time it seemed to move further away, due west and then suddenly accelerated at a high speed, gaining hight until it became faint and finally disappeared. This sudden move took place over a period of about  $I_2^1$  minutes.

I then phoned the Air base at Aberporth and spoke to the constable on duty. He phoned me back later to say there had been no other reports of such a sighting and there was no possibility of it being a hot-air balloon or a helicopter. The weather conditions were clear so it could not be confused with inclement weather conditions. The lack of other sightings could be put down to the fact that it was a bitterly cold night with sub-zero temperatures and few people were venturing out. We only happened to see it as we had to cross the yard, to the shed where we were lambing at frequent intervals.

The following night I looked for it again and observed it at 7pm. It was in the west and the light did not vary in intensity as on the previous night. The red glow at the base and green on either side were still visible. I did not call neighbours as I expected it to disappear before they could get here and they might have doubted my credibility had they arrived to find it gone. If moved very slowly across the sky towards the north, sinking lower on the horizon. It eventually became redder and disappeared over the horizon at 9.50pm. I rang the nearest neighbours at 9.30pm but they could not see it as it had sunk toolow on the horizon to be visible from their place. I reported it to Aberporth but once more they said they had not observed it. Our farm lies at an altitude of 650 ft in rolling hills where the visibility varies considerably between different farms. The colour was more intense than that from a plane and a larger of area of surrounding sky was lit up by it than from the lights of a plane.
