I have to report that at 21.37 hours Sunday 7 July 1985 I was at Sowerby Bridge Police Station when I received a report by telephone from a Section 40 born 22.12.15 of Section 40 Rishworth, that at between 2.50 am and 3.10 am on Sunday 7 July 1985 he saw in an easterly direction from his house, at an altitude of 5° above the horizon a strong white light which he said was flickering and was travelling in a southerly direction towards Manchester.

I suggested to him that this may have been a sighting of an aircraft but he insisted that this was not the case. I therefore respectfully suggest that this report be forwarded to the Force HQ for the attention of Chief Superintendent, Admin and that he may feel it worthy of being passed to the Ministry of Defence Department S4F (Air), Main Building, Whitehall, London SW1A 2HB for their information.

This report was initially relayed to ATC Dunsfold by Section 40 fiancée who is a Section 40 employee at Dunsfold. It was not passed by telephone to AIS Military as I considered the time delay from observation to receipt of the report at Dunsfold would not constitute an 'immediate' report.

The Dunsfold radar controller on duty at the time of the reported observation does not recall seeing anything unusual on radar in the vicinity of Horsham at the appropriate time.

- B) Spherical, approx 30-40 feet diameter, with appearance of highly polished silver metal, with a protruding lip $\frac{1}{2}$ of the way from the bottom, this being mid grey in colour. The lower surface of this lip seemed to have a flat surface on the horizontal axis of the sphere, the upper surface of the lip seemed concave and faired in. The object emitted a throbbing double-beat sound somewhat akin to a ship's propeller. The object became silent before it was out of the audio range one would expect, as if the sound source had stopped.

- The object was seen from both indoors and outdoors, in a direction from the house of approx 330° through 260° . I was stationary on foot.
- D) The sighting was entirely by naked eye.
- E) The direction in which the object was first seen was approx 330° from the house. No landmarks available.

- G) Approx $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, no landmarks of use in this respect.
- H) The object moved in an arc from 330° to 260° (from observers position) increasing distance from the observer through this arc, and coming back towards the observers position, towards the end of the arc, visual contact was lost at this point, the object seemed to maintain a constant altitude.
- J) There was a white overcast sky behind the object at all times but visibility was very good and at no time was there any cloud or mist between object and observer.
- K) The only nearby site of the types specified is the airport at Gatwick.
- L) Air Traffic Control, Dunsfold Aerodrome, Surrey.

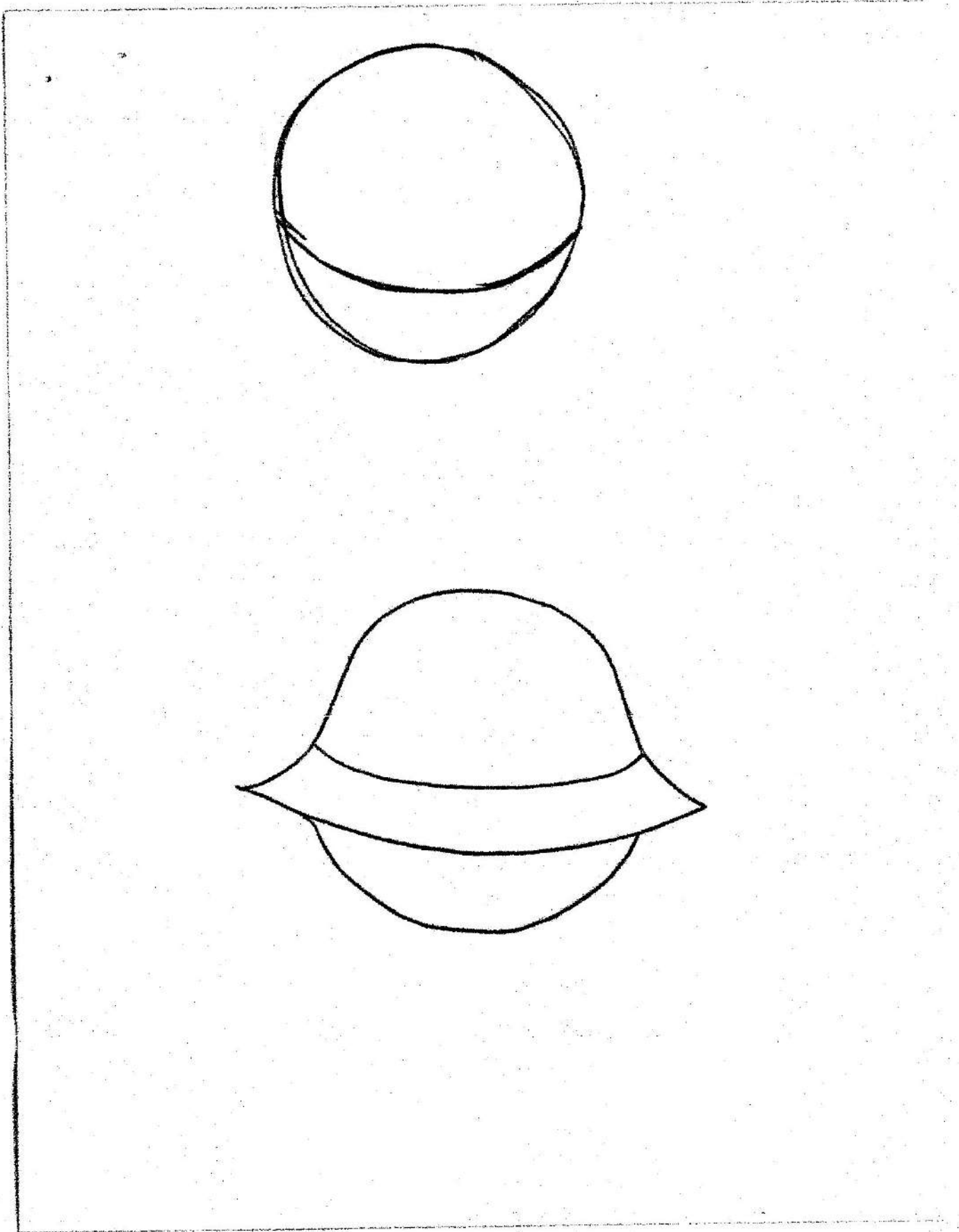

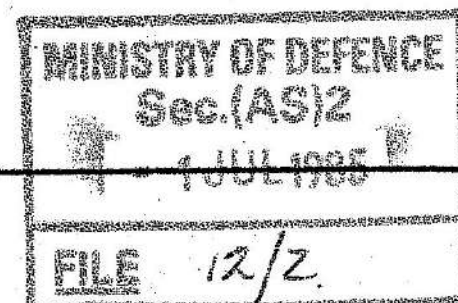
