**PRINCE Charles is at the centre of a bizarre UFO mystery.**

The Prince had a close encounter during a flight home from the United States last week.

The pilot of his RAF VC-10 radioed air traffic control to say he had been startled by a "glowing red object" in the sky.

Incredibly, FOUR other aircraft reported sighting the "UFO" over the same stretch of the Irish Sea.

**Visit**

An immediate investigation was launched—but no trace of the unidentified aircraft has been found.

Other explanations—such as meteors or debris from a satellite—have also been ruled out by experts.

Charles was nearing the end of a 12-hour trans-Atlantic flight after a five-

day visit to the U.S. when the incident happened.

A source at West Drayton air traffic control near London's Heathrow airport said: "The object was reported by five different aircraft, including the Prince's.

"The pilot described seeing a red glowing object. The light from it lit up his cockpit.

"We just don't know what it was. It's a complete mystery."

And an air traffic official

at Ireland's Shannon airport said: "The pilot saw a bright flash in the sky.

"An immediate check was made on all aircraft, but none was missing.

"Whatever the pilot saw, it certainly was not another aeroplane."

A Ministry of Defence spokesman confirmed: "Prince Charles's pilot did report seeing a bright flash, but we are satisfied there was no danger to the Prince's aircraft."

UFO expert Tim Good, an author and lecturer, said last week: "It may not be pure coincidence.

"It is likely that any creature from outer space that is more advanced than us would be aware of the significance of a Royal flight."

And former diplomat Gordon Creighton, the editor of Flying Saucer Review magazine, said:

"I've no idea what this object could have been, but it would be wrong to dismiss it. There are beings in space watching us very closely."

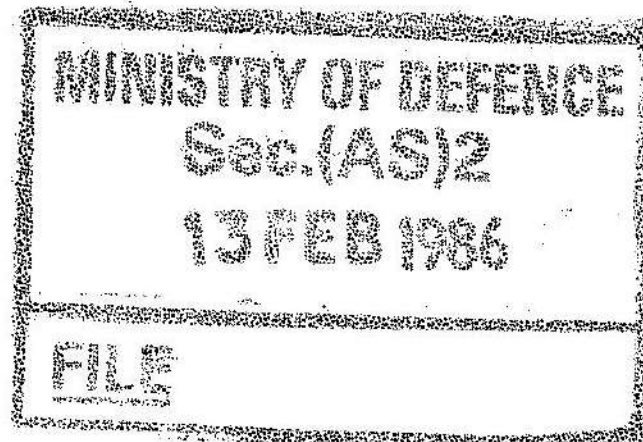

I live at the above address but on Saturday, 16th November 1985,  
 I was visiting my mother and father at **Section 40** Cowcliffe,  
 Huddersfield.

**Section 40** is situated at the top of a hill and overlooks the valley in which Huddersfield Town Centre is situated. Directly across is a range of hills that make the opposite wall of the valley. Slightly to the right is Castle Hill. The house faces South. There are no nearby objects.

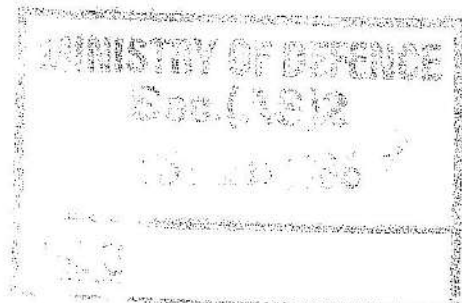
About 8.20 pm on this day as a result of something my mother said I looked towards the window and saw in the sky about an angle of 30 degrees above the eye level, two bright lights close together like car headlights. The objects were brighter and larger than the stars but not as large as a full moon. They were the brightest things in the sky at the time. I could not tell if these lights were attached to an object because the lights were too bright.

When I first saw these objects I was indoors looking through the window. The objects were at first stationary.

The lights appeared to be beyond the opposite valley wall. I opened the window and the lights were exactly the same when I had first seen them.

The lights stayed stationary for about four to five minutes. After this time the lights seemed to move directly towards me. The lights did not seem to get bigger or brighter but seemed to move at a very fast speed, quicker than an ordinary aeroplane would travel when seen at their normal height. The movements lasted about one minute and then stopped. They appeared to stop over the town centre of Huddersfield.

The two lights then zizzagged to the left and then to the right. The objects then disappeared just like switching off a light.

There was a thin streak, weak light left in there place. This was not like the after image you get after looking at a bright light.

At no time could I see any object attached to these lights. The two lights stayed close together in relation to each other. The total duration of this sighting lasted about 8 to 10 minutes.

The weather during the sighting was fine. There were few clouds in the sky.

I have not seen anything like this before or since.

The lights suddenly started moving at what appeared to be a terrific speed straight towards us, the lights got larger and brighter.

The lights reached a point I would estimate to be over Huddersfield town centre when the lights suddenly moved slightly to my left and then back to its original position and then slightly to the right. These movements were very jerky and sudden and the distance moved on each occasion was not very great.

At this point I went out into the garden and observed the lights from a standing position and listened for aircraft noise, but there wasn't any.

The lights then got really bright in the sky and then suddenly the lights disappeared as if they had been switched off, leaving a pencil line of light across the sky, East to West.

From first seeing the lights and its disappearing I observed it for approximately ten minutes in total from different positions and on each occasion I was stationary. I did not use any binoculars or telescope but just used the naked eye.

I do not wear glasses and have excellent eye sight.

I, nor any of my family, had been drinking prior to the sighting.

My house is situated on a high hill to the north of Huddersfield town centre with no objects or buildings to block our view over Huddersfield town centre and the hills to the south.

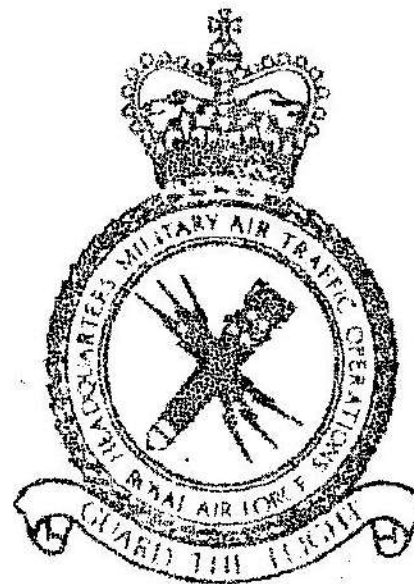

About 0110am on Saturday 4th January 1986 I was at my home address when I let the dog out into the front garden. The dog had been out for a few minutes which is unusual at that time of night.

Section 40 I went into the front garden with my daughter, Section 40 15 yrs, and my son Section 40 12 years, to look for the dog. We had been stood in the garden for a approx two minutes when I saw a red coloured ball shaped object appear in the clear night sky from above my house and travel at a very fast speed towards my house. Suddenly it disappeared from sight, but not behind any object or over the horizon. It just disappeared. The object was very high in the sky and the object was much larger than aircraft landing lights or similar objects. There was no noise whatsoever. The object was in sight for approx three seconds.

We all saw the object and continued to look into the sky. It was a very frosty and cold night and the sky was absolutely cloudless. We did not see anything for five minutes and so returned to the house. Due to pestering from the children we went back outside onto the adjoining Section 40 playing fields about 1.20 am. We had been looking at the sky for about five minutes when we saw another similar object appear from the sky about where the first one had disappeared. It went at great speed again and great height back towards the house. Again it was red and it just disappeared, again not behind any object or the horizon.

We studied the sky until 0230 hrs and in all we saw 11 (eleven) of these objects. The first two were as described, red, and the next nine were silver coloured and, I think, possibly a little smaller in size than the first two. This could have been because they were higher.

They always seemed to appear from the general area in which the last object had disappeared. There was approximately a five minute gap between the disappearance of one object and the appearance of the next and each sighting lasted some time between two and three

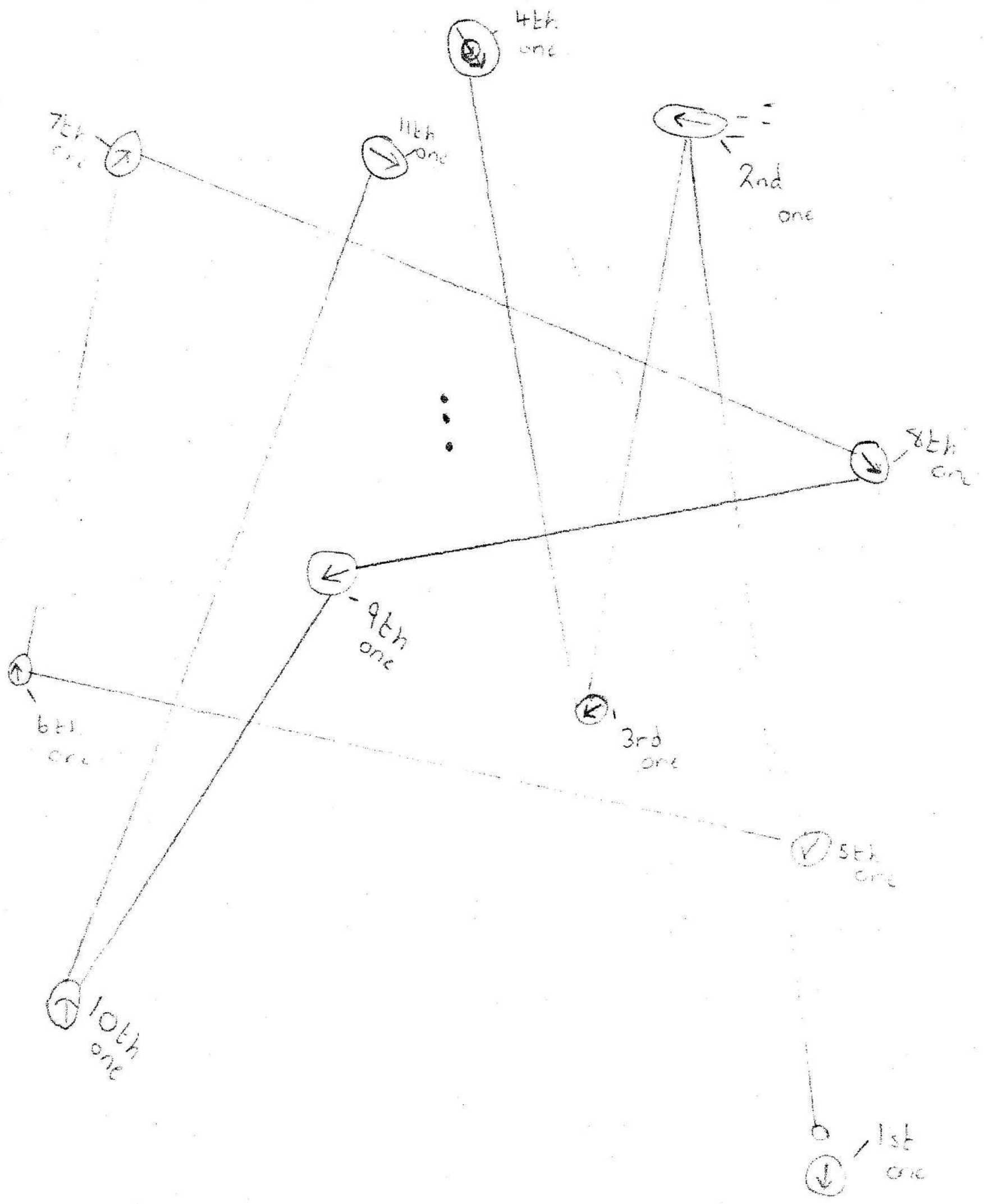
seconds. After the 11th object had been seen we waited approx 15 minutes but sighted nothing else. we returned to the house and I kept looking out of the window but saw nothing else.

All three of us are absolutely certain about what we saw. I had not been drinking or using any medication or drugs. It is the first time that I have seen anything of this nature and can say that it was not like anything else I have seen before or can explain.
