Dear Section 40

Thank you for your letter in which you asked for the Department's views on the incident at RAF Woodbridge in December 1980.

You may find it useful if I explain that the sole interest of the United Kingdom Ministry of Defence in reported sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) is to establish whether they have any bearing on the defence of the country.

The only information we have on the alleged "UFO sighting" at Rendlesham Forest in December 1980 is the report by Colonel Charles Halt, of the United States Air Force. We are satisfied that the events described are of no defence significance. I can assure you that there is no question of attempting to cover up any incident or mishap, nor are we attempting in any way to obscure the truth.

I recall you also asked when you telephoned me if I could give you the number of reports we have had of 'sightings'. During 1985 the Ministry of Defence received 160 reported sightings of aerial phenomena or 'UFO's', the majority of these being in the Welsh, Yorkshire and Thames Valley/London areas.

Up until the end of March this year we had received 39 reports. I trust that this information is of some use to you.

The object was also picked up by the near by civilian Airport radar, but a later report said that the object was infact a beam from a lighthouse, but radar dosn't pick up beams of light. Who ever gave that story to the news paper reporter I'm sure he could have made up a better story than that.

I would be very grateful if you could tell me the truth behind the artical. The only reason why I bring up the matter after so long is because a friend only just showed me the said artical.

# NO HOAX SAYS THE AIR CHIEF

THERE has been no hoax, says the man who was in charge of the USAF base at Woodbridge at the time the UFO came down. The wing commander, now Brigadier General, Gordon Williams, said back home in America: "I recall Lt-Colonel Halt's report.

## Silence

"I don't know exactly what happened. It is all there." "He is not a man who would hoax the British Ministry of Defence or the American Air Force Department." At Woodbridge, all enquiries run into a wall of silence. USAF Capt. Kathleen McCollon, chief of the public affairs division at the base told solicitor Harry Harris, a UFO investigator from Manchester, in a letter: "I was not an eyewitness to the events you say took place, and do not know of anyone who was."

Shown Colonel Halt's report later, she admitted: "Yes, something did happen and it is detailed in that document." She declined to amplify the report.

Radar operators followed the program as it flew over the East Coast until it disappeared. In London, the Ministry of Defence declined to lift the veil, although the USAF said its official reports had been sent there.

## EVIDENCE

The Colonel sat in my office and was a very warm man. The first I knew of these events was when he came to me and related that he had seen a glow that had well and respect him and fully believe he was telling me the truth. In 20 years of service to the RAF that must have been the nearest I have ever been to a UFO. Until that day the Colonel came to my office I would have scoffed, but not now. I have a completely open mind. It was never seriously thought to be an aircraft in difficulty other than the whole rescue fleet would have been put into operation. That did not happen. 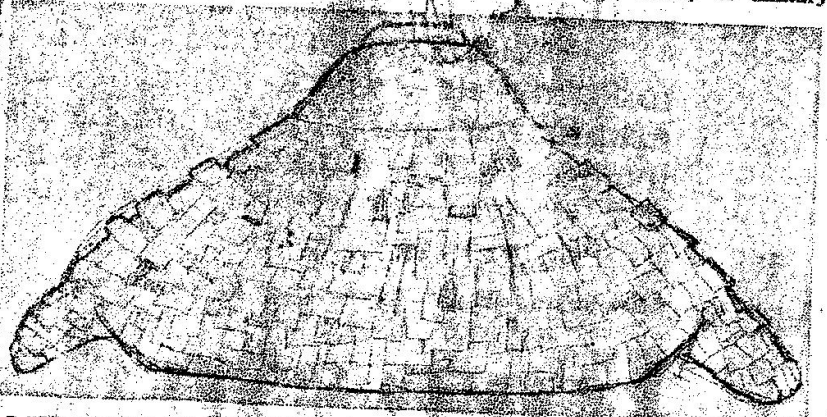

PRINCE Charles is at the centre of a bizarre UFO mystery.

The Prince had a close encounter during a flight home from the United States last week.

The pilot of his RAF VC-10 dipped air traffic control to say he had been startled by a "glowing red object" in the sky.

Incredibly, **FOUR** other aircraft reported sighting the "UFO" over the same stretch of the Irish Sea.

And an air traffic official

at Ireland's Shannon airport said: "The pilot saw a bright flash in the sky.

"An immediate check was made on all aircraft, but none was missing.

"Whatever the pilot saw, it certainly was not another aeroplane."

A Ministry of Defence spokesman confirmed.

Prince Charles's pilot did report seeing a bright flash, but we are satisfied there was no danger to the Prince's aircraft."

UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS - CENTRAL TELEVISION INTERVIEW

1. My staff spoke to you on Friday evening about a request from Central Television to conduct an interview with a member of MOD, preferably a Minister, for inclusion in a 45 minute piece on UFOs which they propose screening in "Central Weekend", a 1 1/2 hour current affairs programme shown on Sundays in the Central TV area. The producers are, as yet, unsure of the actual date of the broadcast. We promised to let you have fuller information about the programme when it was to hand.

2. The programme will be based on a series of interviews interspersed with film, taken from public roads, of some MOD establishments which are assumed to be of significance in UFO circles. Interviewees will include Lord Hill-Norton and an ex-MOD employee **Section 40** **Section 40** who worked at Boscombe Down during the 1950's and who claims to have seen a UFO in 1952. You may wish to note that, because of his official status at the time, **Section 40** has been in touch with this office, independently, about taking part in the programme. We have advised him that, as a private citizen, the decision to take part must be his own but that the MOD would have no objection to him doing so.

3. The proposed interview with Minister(DS) would last perhaps 15 minutes which, when edited, will provide 2-3 minutes of TV time. The interview would take the form of specific questions upon which we would, of course, provide briefing. The questions are expected to include: our explanation of the strange phenomena which occur in the sky; the seriousness with which MOD treats reports of incidents; whether MOD is the sole authority in Whitehall which receives reports or whether they are passed on to another more clandestine organisation; and the incident in December 1980 at RAF Woodbridge. Central Television have indicated that the interview can take place at Minister's convenience but they would preferably wish it to be within a fortnight.

4. We have sought the views of CPR's organisation on this topic and they recommend Minister should take part. To refuse to do so would only add to speculation that the MOD has something to hide on this particularly emotive subject.

5. I would be grateful to know if Minister(DS) is content with the proposal that he should appear on the programme.

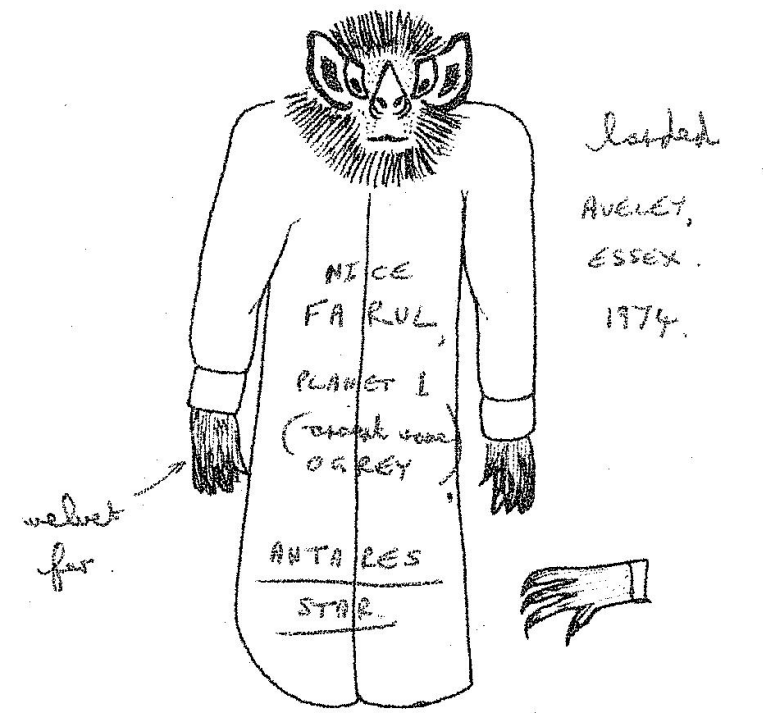

is about 3ft. 6ins on the ground. It is soft, with a surface of small "bubbles" that support the body. Like most other things in the craft it is grey in colour. The table is supported on an hemispherical pivoting support. On the left-hand side nearest the examiner is some kind of long control box from which the "pencil" instruments are obtained.

As far as John can recall there are 3 fingers on each hand. The skin is very pale, almost translucent.

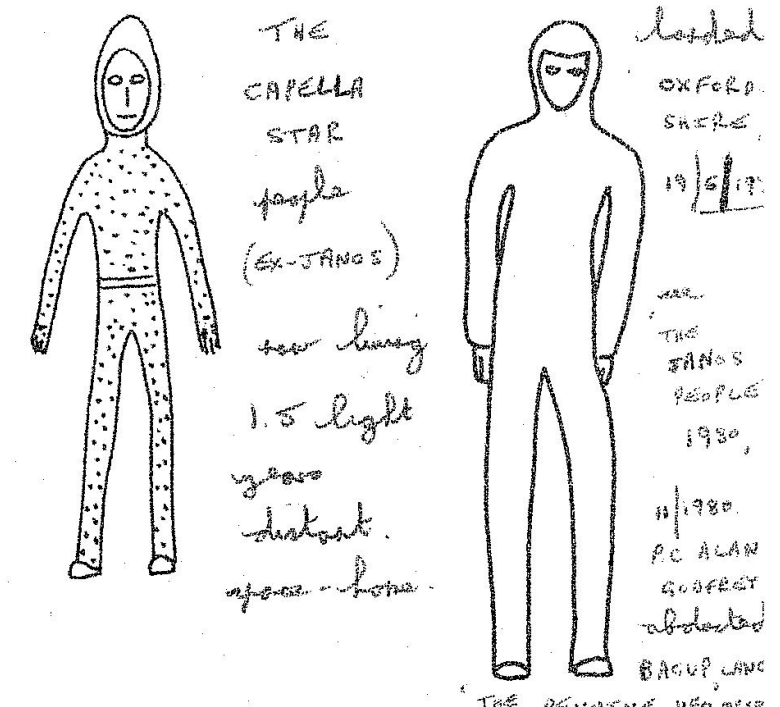

When John has swung his legs over the side of the table, he starts asking questions, all of which are answered. At one point he asks: "What do you do when you're outside the ship?"

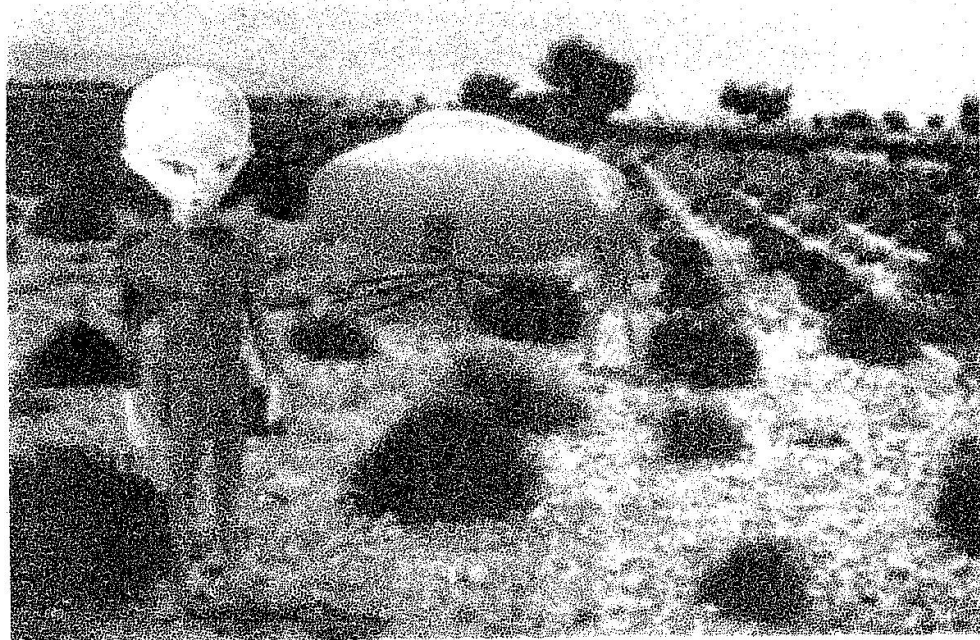

high - the size of a smallish car. It was standing on six legs connected to a central pivot, and had a door and a transparent dome: M. Masse likened it to a monstrous spider. At first he thought it might be a helicopter, since they frequently landed on these fields: but he quickly realized this was no such thing. Then he saw two creatures bending down as though examining his plants: since his crop had recently been damaged by unknown vandals, he moved forward angrily.

He was about seven metres from them when one of the figures turned and pointed a pencil-like object at him, taken from a holder at its side: Masse found himself halted in his tracks, unable to move. The two figures stood watching him, but did not seem hostile; they seemed to be discussing him. They were about one metre tall, dressed in close-fitting grey-green clothing, with no headgear. Their heads were about three times the size of a human head, in proportion to their bodies: they had large ears, high cheeks, lidless eyes, no chins, and round holes for mouths.

The two beings returned to their machine; the door closed, the legs whirled and retracted, and the machine left the ground silently. When it was between fifteen and twenty metres away, it suddenly vanished. About fifteen minutes later feeling returned to Masse and he was able to move again: he worked until between 7.30 or 8 am, then went back to the village, where he told his adventure at a cafe. Being known and respected in the neighbourhood, his story was taken seriously and thoroughly investigated both by the police and by private UFO investigative groups: though some contradictions were noted, no reason was found to doubt his story, and some confirmation was obtained from other witnesses which seemed to support his claim. Physical traces were found on the site, which persisted and affected future crops until the field was ploughed over. Masse also suffered from psychological effects - he slept inordinately and experienced dreams of a psychic character.<sup>56</sup>

In selecting these examples, I have deliberately chosen relatively simple and unsensational cases, occurring to ordinary people in the casual course of their daily lives. None of these people was particularly interested in UFOs; they were not deliberately looking for them nor, so far as is known, were they subject to any other kind of delusion or preconception. In all six cases, the sighting came as a total surprise, to which the witness had to adjust while in the course of doing something quite trivial - going to bed, returning home, doing the daily work. In each case the witness responded with emotions ranging from mild puzzlement to complete bafflement; in each case subsequent investigation, while it has failed to discover the true explanation, has also failed to show that the witness in any way misreported the incident. In short, these things seem to have taken place as described, for all anyone can show to the contrary.

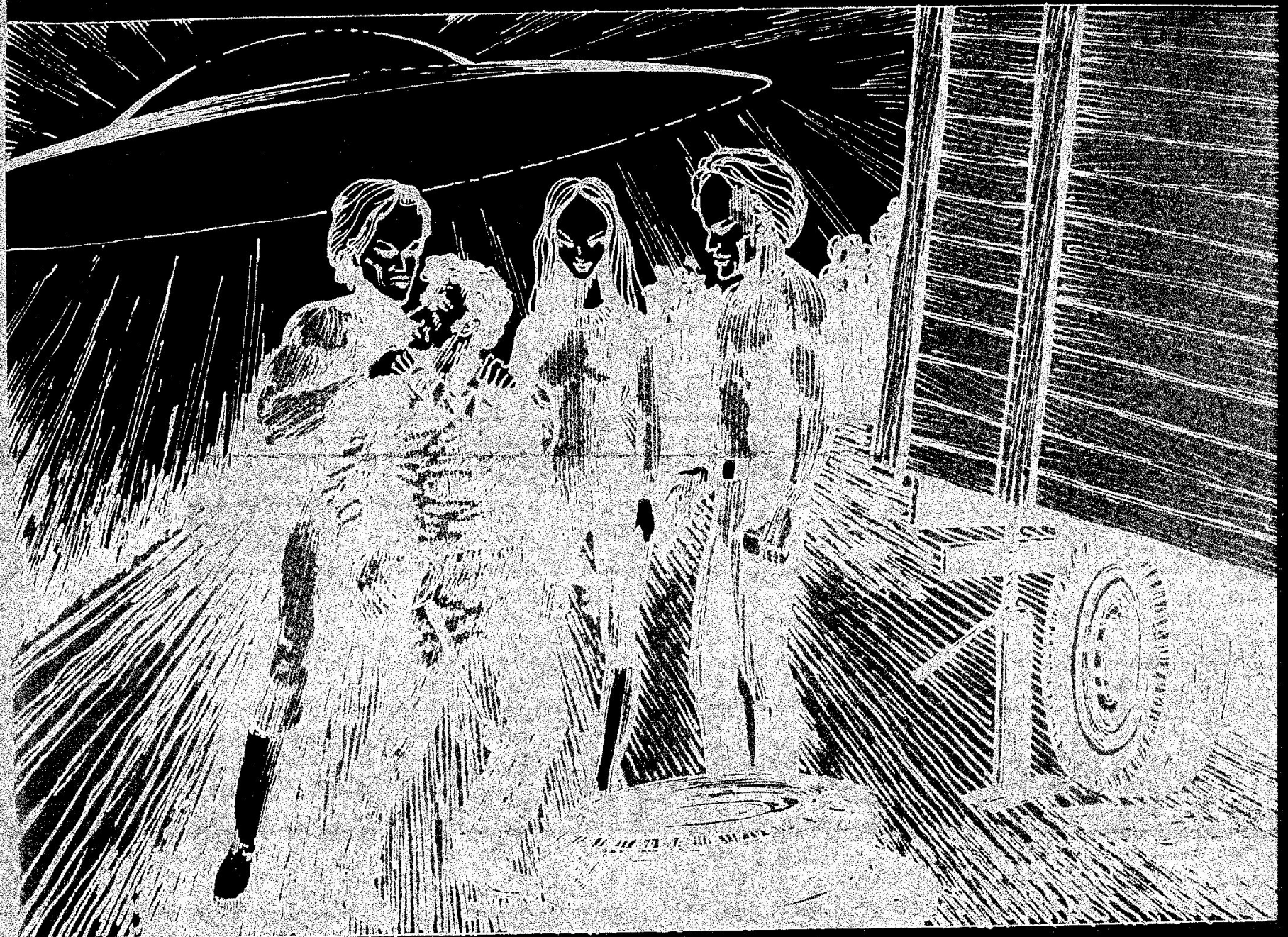

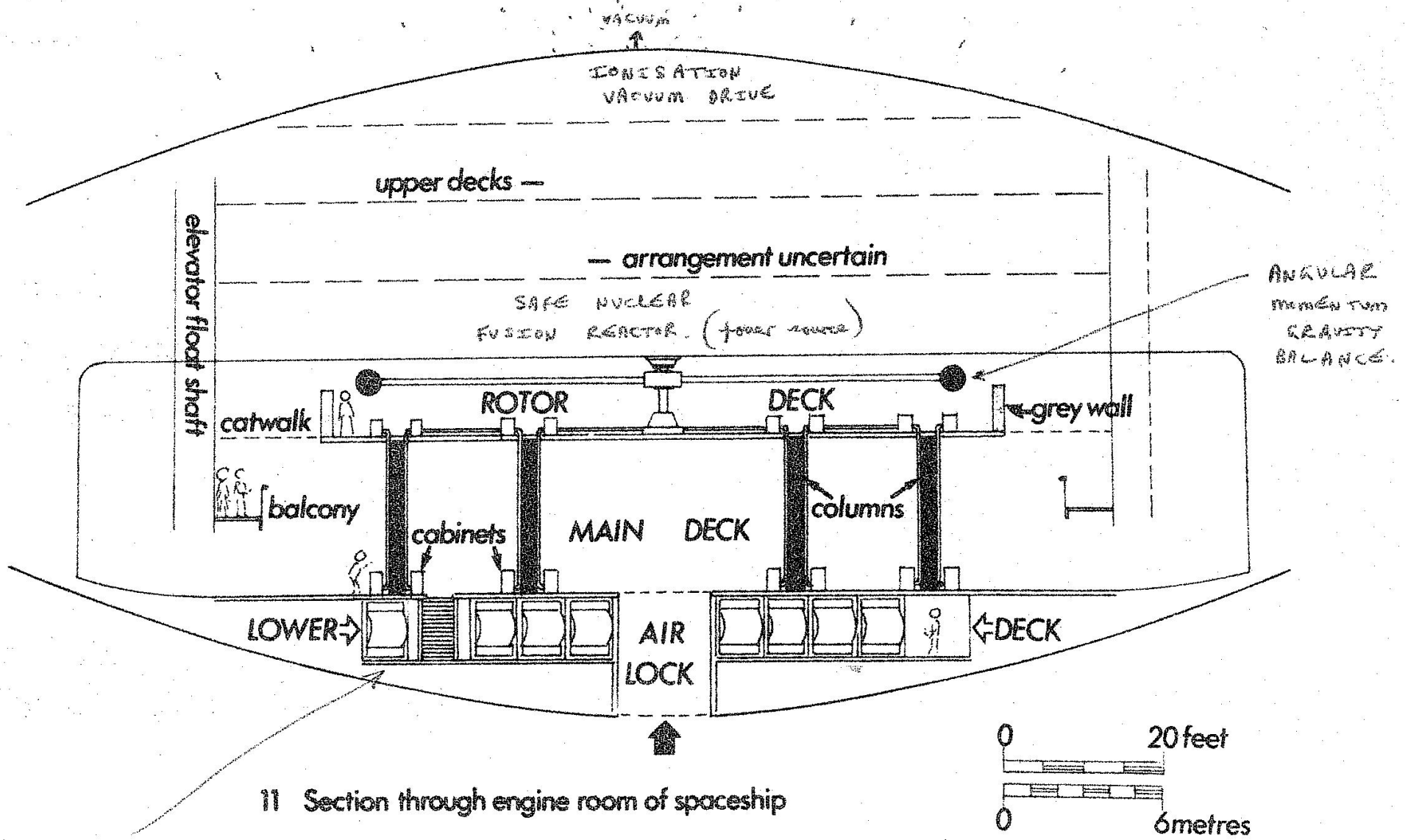
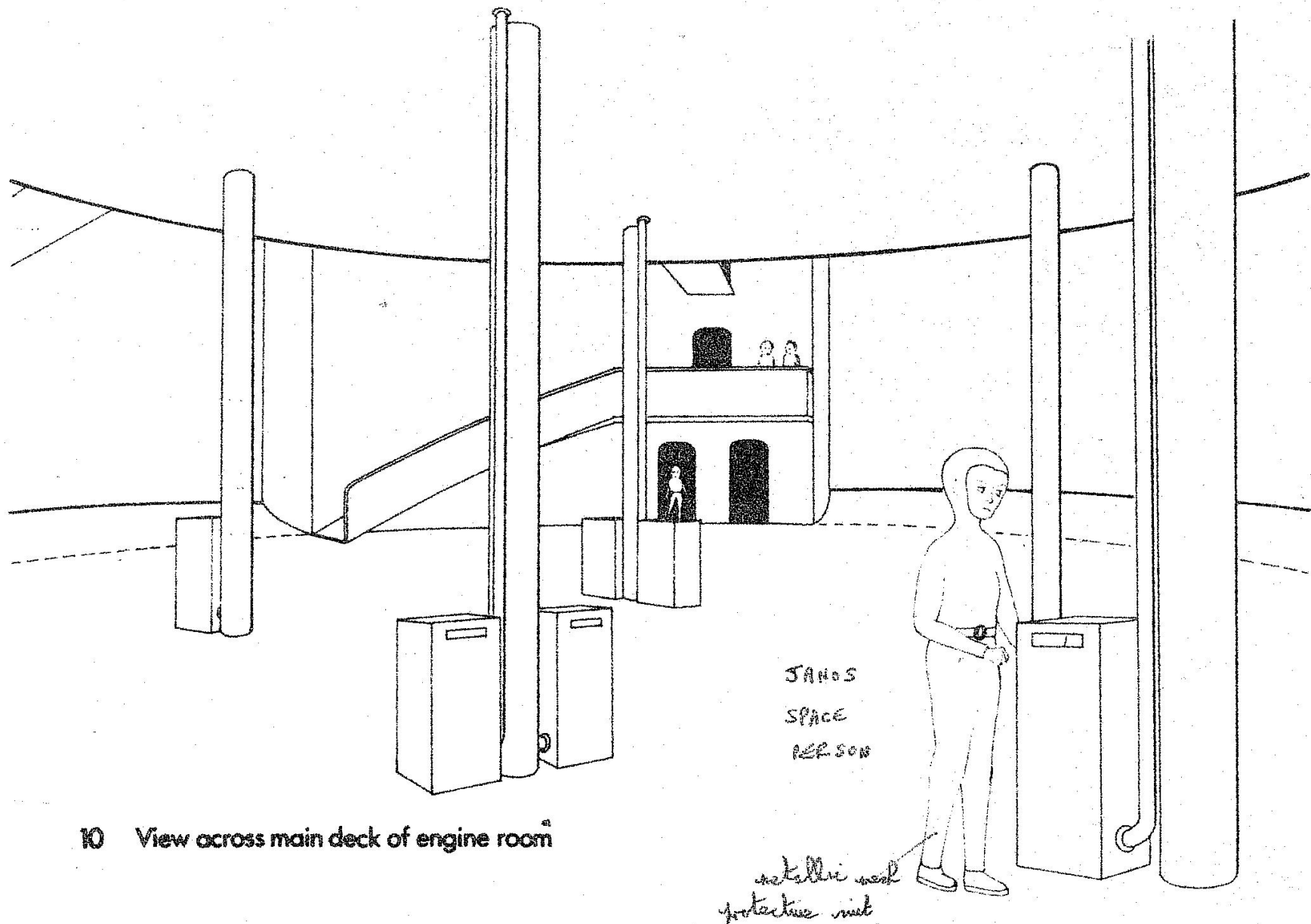

# Star Wars? A load of old UFOs

## I don't believe in radioactive giant rabbits

IT IS there in black and white, an official report signed by a US Air Force Colonel saying that unidentified flying objects had been sighted by his men in Suffolk in late December 1980.

Needless to say, people wondered whether I had gone barmy three years later when I published the report by Lt Col Charles Halt, deputy commander of the USAF base at RAF Woodbridge.

The authorities today are still saying nowt or denying all, but they cannot magic away that official report by Lt Col Halt — later promoted to full Colonel and made commander of the East Anglia base. So he wasn't barmy!

It was unearthed under America's Freedom of Information Act as part of a remarkable investigation carried out for the past five years by three British women who refuse to be put down by officialdom.

Jenny Randles, director of investigations for the British UFO Research Association, and her two helpers, housewives Brenda Butler and Dot Street, tell their story in a paperback called Sky Crash to be published on May 22 (Grafton £2.95).

It was their early investigations that got me excited in October 1983, particularly the report Lt Col Halt filed to his superiors about the strange events in Rendlesham Forest. He wrote on 13 January 1981:

1. Early in the morning of 27 December 1980 (approximately 0300) two USAF security patrolmen saw unusual lights outside the back gate at RAF Woodbridge. Thinking an aircraft might have crashed or been forced down, they called for permission to go outside the gate to investigate... the individuals reported seeing a strange glowing object in the forest.

an hour or more. The object to the south was visible for two or three hours and beamed down a stream of light from time to time. Numerous individuals, including the undersigned [ie Lt Col Charles Halt himself] witnessed the activities in paragraphs 2 and 3.

You might have thought that this sensational report would have set the rafters alight. Not a bit of it. The Ministry of Defence admitted unusual lights had been sighted, but said there was no explanation.

Naturally the scoffers had a field day. Most reckoned those strange lights came from Orford Ness lighthouse, five miles away, and that the indentations in the ground were made by rabbits.

Nobody has yet explained

to my satisfaction how light-houses manage to fly in a blaze of lights nor how rabbits give off radiation.

The three authors have also produced some fascinating supplementary evidence and Ralph Noyes, former head of the MoD department responsible for RAF intelligence, said in a statement: "We now have evidence — I blush to say about my own Ministry — that they have lied about this case. They have covered it up."

### Conspiracy

And so the conspiracy of silence continues, though these determined ladies have no intention of giving up their pursuit of the truth.

Their book raises some awkward questions about the USAF bases in East Anglia in view of Mrs Thatcher's decision to allow them to be used by F-111 bombers for the attack on Libya.

Quite clearly we have little control over the bases and, when something untoward occurs, lose no time in helping the US cover it up.

I do not believe that the UFO which disturbed the Suffolk woodland on that wintry night carried some spooky visitors from a distant planet.

No, the explanation is much simpler. A UFO it was — an American military spacecraft which had been on an illegal mission in outer space years ahead of President Reagan's beloved Star Wars programme.

**R**IGHT, fall-in, three ranks, you shower! I am riding my hobby horse. Bring back some form of National Service for the army of unemployed youngsters aimlessly wandering our streets.

Oh, I know all about freedom of the individual and suchlike, but can any of us who did our stint in uniform honestly say we did not thoroughly enjoy it?

I will not inflict you with such rubbish as: "It will make men of them" or "A bit of discipline will sort that lot out".

My experience in the Army was that it did neither. More important, it showed us how people from all parts of the country, of all classes, colours and religions, could live in harmony. It also gave us a chance to see the world beyond these shores, and taught us how to look after ourselves.

I hope the spirit of those times will be captured in an exhibition on National Service, opening at the Imperial War Museum in London next September. Altogether some 250,000 of us were conscripted between 1948-63.

What a laugh it all was. My post-bag suggests that others came away with the same impression.

Patrick Moore, from Bromsgrove, sends me a British Armed Forces 3d voucher (BAFs, we called them) with the comment: "I think I picked it up in Berlin or Nairobi... or was it Mauritius or Madagascar?"

Ah, sweet memories, he says. I'll second that.

Eric Firth, from Wilsden, Yorks, would not agree. He was a regular soldier who served 14 years, and reckons National Service was a waste of time, money, manpower and lives.

He writes: "Young men around 18 were plucked from their jobs, homes and loved ones, put into ugly, ill-fitting uniforms that made them resemble walking coal sacks, and dispatched to a variety of international destinations."

Well, you could say that. However, the youngsters I am talking about have no jobs to be plucked from. And that is the most dreadful waste of all.

## Saudis seek to offset British Tornado deal

From A Correspondent, Riyadh

Mr George Younger, the Defence Secretary, met Prince Sultan bin Abdul Aziz, his Saudi counterpart, yesterday to discuss Saudi proposals for British investment to offset the £5 billion Tornado fighter deal.

The investment programme would be similar to that imposed on a consortium of companies led by Boeing. The consortium had to invest 35 per cent of a \$1.2 billion contract to provide ground control for the airborne warning and control system (Awacs) jets sold to the Saudis by the Americans.

The difference is that the

US offset programme was stipulated before contracts were signed with private companies. No such prior agreement was reached before the Tornado deal was signed.

Mr Younger is expected to meet King Fahd and other important Saudi officials during his three-day visit, which may lead to another arms deal if a \$357 million (about £238 million) air-to-air and air-to-ship missile package fails to clear the US Congress. The Saudis may again look to Britain to fill the gap as they did when they bought the Tornados instead of the American-built F15 fighters they originally wanted.

## UK clinches Saudi deal

Riyadh: Saudi Arabia is considering buying weapons for its navy from Britain, after concluding a big aircraft deal with London, the defence minister, Prince Sultan bin Abdul Aziz, said yesterday.

"We are discussing the possibility of purchasing arms for the navy from friendly countries including Britain," the official Saudi Press Agency quoted him as saying after talks with the British defence secretary George Younger, Prince Sultan bin Abdul Aziz gave no details of the navy's requirements, but said that Riyadh had concluded final agreement on a £5 billion purchase of British military aircraft.

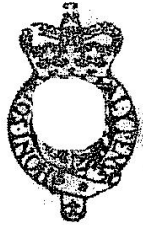
The deal, Britain's biggest export sale, includes 72 Tornado fighters, 30 Hawk trainers, and 30 PC Orion surveillance aircraft plus missiles, training, technical support and spares.

Prince Sultan said that some of the Tornado fighters had arrived in the kingdom and were due to take part in an air show today.

Saudi Arabia invited Mr Younger here to discuss final details of the deal, including a requirement under the Saudi "offset programme" that 35 per cent of the value of the contract be re-invested in Saudi Arabia.—Reuter.

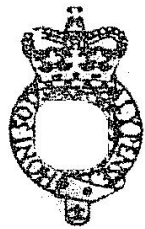
