And I ask for photostatic copy of the famous ufo-article published in RAF Flying Review July 1957 (it is an unofficial magazine, but it is in your library).

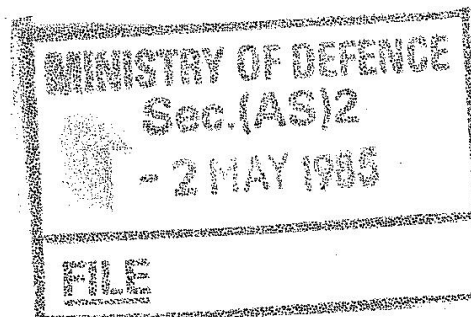
I have received similar help from other foreign ministries and I want this type of information for my private library. And I have been interested in ufo-problem for twenty years.

Dear Section 40

Thank you for your letter of 11 March 1985 addressed to the Secretary of State for Defence. We have looked into the sightings reported in your letter but have no records which would offer any explanation of what you saw. You may find it useful if I explain that the sole interest of the Ministry of Defence in reported sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects is to establish whether they have any bearing on the defence of the country.

There is no organization in the Ministry of Defence appointed solely for the purpose of studying reports of such objects, and no staff are employed on the subject full time. The reports we receive are referred to the staff in the Department who are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom, and they examine the reports as part of their normal duties. Unless there are defence implications we do not attempt to identify sightings and we cannot inform observers of the probable identity of the object seen. The Department could not justify the expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond the pure defence interests.

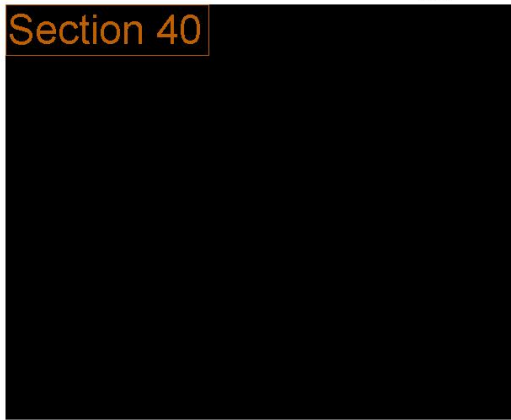

Were the U.S. Testing a new weapon or spy equipment?

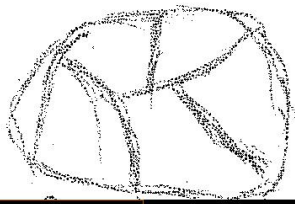

I am sending you information which I have investigated concerning UFO's that are operating from Lough Neagh. (Map inclosed).

I have been investigating from 1966 almost 19 years, from 1966-1968 I sent reports to a Section 40 at the MOD in 1968 I gave a talk on the subject to Group Captain Section 40 Co. (Aldergrove) and some of his staff.

Over the years the world press published reports of flying football size glowing white that followed aircraft, cars, people, OBJECTS. May I point out to you that this object is a decoy?

The main object is just above this craft it is around 20 feet in diameter and about 9 feet high it has a brilliant lit cabin,

It uses as a camouflage Invisibility if they are caught of guard.

It works just like switching an electric light on or off.

Also the lights on the craft work from right to left.

I found this out ⁴one February night of this year when I was tracking two moving white lights near Lurgan Golf course with a friend.

Suddenly I saw this round object above me about 50 Feet up hovering making no noise, I flashed my torch at it, at once it flashed on this football size white ball beneath it and made a dive towards us, it was then I saw this brilliant lit cabin as it was just going over our heads the main object just vanished only the glowing white ball could be seen.

Later that night I photographed two white revolving white lights that seemed to be attached till two invisible objects sitting on the golf course.

I would like to point out to you that I sent another different sketch of an object to RAF Aldergrove on the 27-11-84 the letter reference No is. ALD/525/PI.

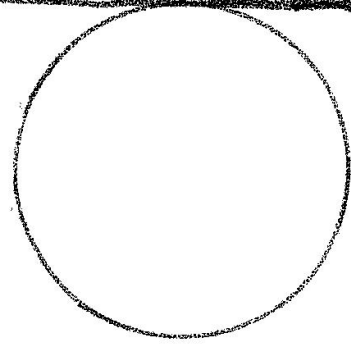
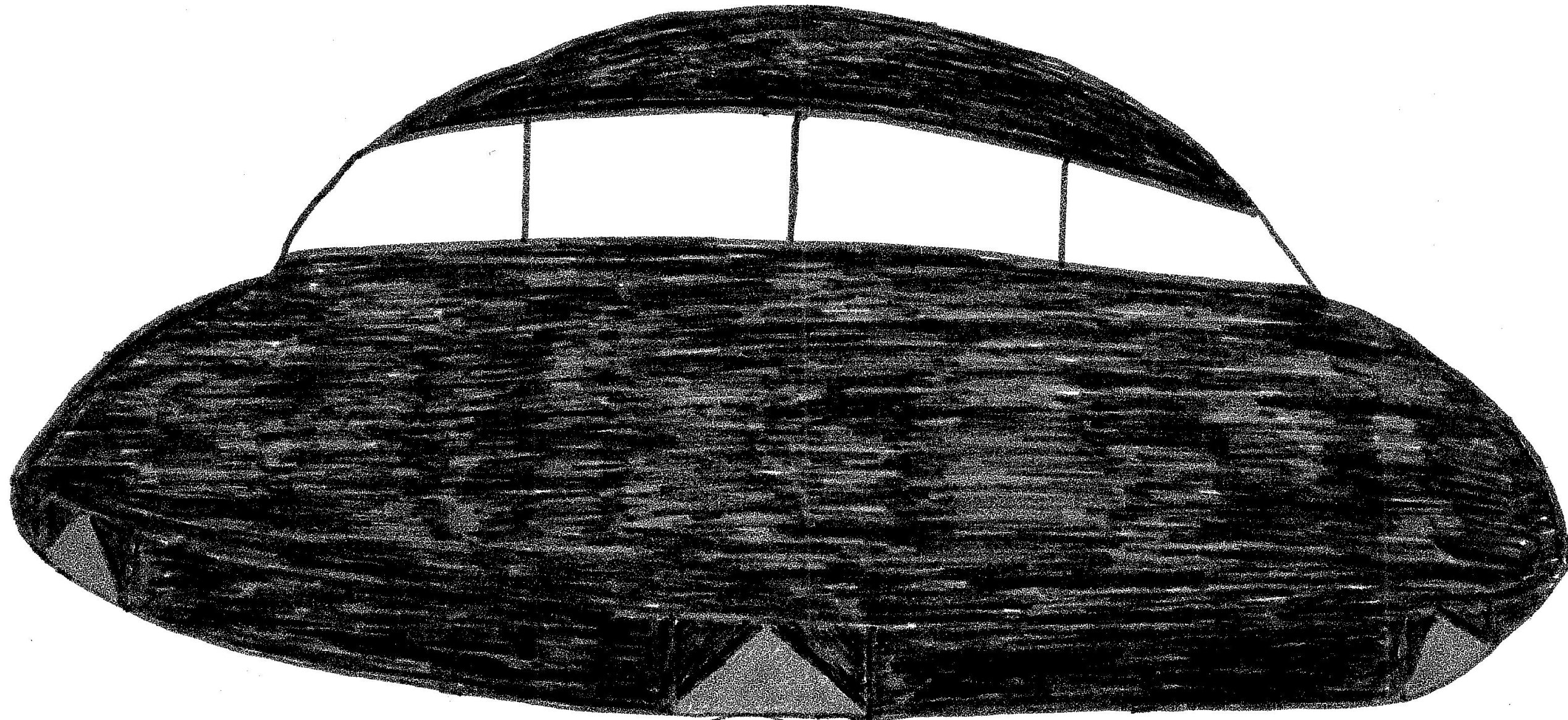

With regards to the above named subject and source. It has come to our attention that on the 19th June 1980 a Miss observed a large spherical shaped object heading out to sea at a slow speed. The object was seen for several minutes to display a pulsating red glow. The witness states the time was approximately 14.00.

REDACTED ON ORIGINAL

Miss failed to identify the subject image and therefore contacted the local police at Scarborough. At approximately 3.30pm, some 90 minutes after observing the phenomena, the witness was contacted by personnel at Fylingdales. They asked numerous questions in relation to the purported sighting.

We would be grateful for a copy of the report held by your base. Ministry of Defence policy is not to release 'UFO' reports due in the main for witness confidentiality purposes. However the witness requires no such assurance and therefore the non-release of this report would perhaps indicate one potential. RAF Fylingdales has the capability to track just about anything anywhere and one must presume the advanced system used by your base received a return from this target?

We would be pleased to forward a detailed copy of **Section 40** report, any information received will be used for research purposes only. Thank you for your time and we look forward to receiving your reply.

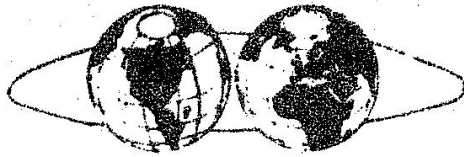

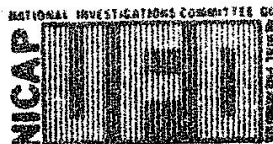
Perhaps this type of phenomena was natural? In any event we would appreciate some response to this request and any information held on this type of aerial phenomenon.

You may remember that I wrote to you in November 1983 about the reported occurrence of unusual events near RAF Woodbridge in December 1980. Your reply, D/DS8/10/209 of 20th March 1984, told me that the MOD saw no Defence significance in Colonel Halt's report of 13th January 1981. You suggested that the events reported by him probably reflected some entirely down-to-earth, but misperceived, phenomenon.

I am aware that DS8 has had several approaches on this matter from outside groups and individuals who possibly show more enthusiasm than judgement in the questions they press. I hesitate to place a further burden on the patience and courtesy of your Division. Nonetheless, there do remain some puzzling, and perhaps disquieting, features of this case on which I think it would be in the general interest to cast some further light.

I owe it to you to explain my interest. It lies in the following - not necessarily in the right order of priority !

First, as an ex-MOD chap, I have been asked from time to time by various bits of the media to comment on the Woodbridge affair. I have in fact done so on several occasions on local radio and on foreign television. One of the television programmes is now likely to be shown here before long and may excite some public interest. If I am invited to comment again, I would not wish to do so irresponsibly.

Secondly, I am publishing a book this June on the UFO phenomenon generally. My publishers are keen that it should say something about Woodbridge. I have already drafted a passage which reflects my own study of the case, and I am attaching to this letter the relevant extracts which deal with it. I do not, of course, expect you to comment on this (unless you wish to do so), but I feel it is no more than proper to give former colleagues some advance notice of what I am proposing to publish.

Thirdly, as the attached extract implies, I have come to the conclusion over the past year or so - somewhat reluctantly and by no means hastily - that something of importance (and something which is not illusory) underlies the persistent stream of reports of well authenticated occurrences, both in the UK and elsewhere, which can be loosely grouped under the UFO heading. Some of these reports reach the MOD from members of the public (and they doubtless also continue to do so from Service establishments as well); but a far larger number get no further than the local police, civil aviation authorities, or the amateur research groups. These occurrences may or may not prove to have any vital interest for Defence, and the Woodbridge case may or may not properly belong among them. But the sizable and persistent hard core of the more disquieting instances - particularly those in which there appears to be some degree of temporary interference with electronic equipment and/or minor damage to individuals and the environment -

seems to me to deserve closer and more expert attention in Whitehall than we are led to believe it gets at present. There is evidence that at least three other governments take the phenomenon seriously. A mass of documents released in the US under the American Freedom of Information Act shows a close and continuing interest by governmental agencies. The French agency GEPAN (Groupe d'Etudes des Phénomènes Aérospatiaux Non-identifiés) which was set up by the then French Minister of Defence in 1977 under CNES (Centre National d'Etudes Spatiales) remains in existence despite the heavy retrenchment in French government expenditure and continues to collect and analyse UFO reports country-wide. And there is a degree of recent evidence in the Soviet Press that the Russians take a close interest in the phenomenon through the Moscow Aviation Institute and (possibly) the National Academy of Sciences. Is it really the case that the British MOD takes no systematic interest (as distinct from dealing ad hoc with what are felt to be tiresome enquiries from the public)? If there really is no systematic study of the phenomenon, viz. something in the nature of a small expert committee in Whitehall or the placing of responsibility on a designated and expert directorate in the MOD, should there not be? Is there no liason with French and US agencies?

I hope that you will feel able to comment on the three questions at the end of the preceding paragraph. I ask them, not in any spirit of contention, but because I believe that we cannot afford to ignore a persistent phenomenon which other countries appear to take seriously. It seems to me to deserve systematic study within a Defence context, even if only to dismiss it in the end as trivial. I think you will know that there are others, whose judgement is to be respected and whose experience qualifies them, who take a similar view, Lord Hill-Norton among them.

To return to the particular case of RAF Woodbridge, you may already be aware that television documentaries of the occurrence have been made by two foreign companies. The programme made by Cable News Network is now likely to be shown in this country before long. I have not yet seen the documentary in full, myself, but I understand from the organisation that they claim to have established a number of facts which are very much at odds with the view that Col. Halt and other USAF personnel merely misperceived some phenomenon with a wholly conventional explanation (the Orfordness lighthouse, a satellite re-entry, a bright meteor). The following are among the more important points which Cable appear to be claiming.


1. Col. Halt adheres to the report of 13th January 1981, of which the MOD has a copy. He also confirms the authenticity of a tape-recording made by himself on site on the night of 29th December 1980 which tallies with paragraph 3 of his report (and in some respects goes beyond it).
2. Other witnesses to the events of 27th and 29th December 1980 reported by Halt have made sworn depositions.
3. Although not reported by Halt, there was an unusual occurrence near RAF Woodbridge on the night of 26th December 1980. An unidentified object in an area of Rendlesham Forest sufficiently worried USAF personnel to cause them to seek help from the Suffolk police. Police officers at Woodbridge (the village) have confirmed that they responded to this call, albeit without establishing unambiguous evidence at the site of the 'sighting' claimed by the USAF contingent which had been sent to investigate it.
4. There is evidence that RAF Watton (and perhaps other radar installations) had radar traces on at least one of the three nights in question of an unidentified aerial object in the area of RAF Woodbridge/Rendlesham Forest.
5. There is evidence that a 16mm cine-film was made at the site by USAF personnel on 29th December 1980 and was referred for study by the USAF headquarters in Germany.

In your letter to me of 20th March 1984 you said, "The Department satisfied itself at the time that there was no reason to consider that the alleged sightings had any Defence significance". You added, "I can assure you ... that there is no evidence of anything having intruded into British airspace and 'landing' near RAF Woodbridge". In the light of the research which Cable News Network claim to have undertaken I hope you will not think it unreasonable if I invite your replies to the following questions.

1. What steps were taken by the MOD when Col. Halt's report of 13 January 1981 was received in the Department ? In particular:-
 - a. What consultations took place with the USAF ?
 - b. Was any on-site investigation made by MOD or British Service personnel ?
 - c. Was any enquiry made to RAF Watton or other radar establishments for possible traces of an unidentified occurrence in the Suffolk area on the nights of 26/27, 27/28 and 29/30 December 1980 ? If so, what was the outcome ?
2. Is the MOD aware of the tape-recording which Col. Halt claims to have made on 29 December 1980 (and of which alleged copies are now in the hands of several members of the public) ? If so, what interpretation does the MOD place on this recording ?
3. Is the MOD aware of the cine-film allegedly made on site on 29th December 1980 ? If so, what interpretation is placed upon it ?
4. In the light of the answers to these questions does the MOD adhere to its view that nothing unknown or untoward intruded into British airspace in late December 1980 ? Is this also the view of the USAF ?
4. If this does indeed remain the MOD's considered conclusion, does the Department feel any disquiet at an apparent and persistent misperception of presumably innocent phenomena by USAF personnel based at an important installation in British territory and charged with military tasks the mismanagement of which might have grave consequences ?

I regret burdening you with these questions and with those contained in my sixth paragraph above. But I think they are potentially important, and I doubt that we have heard the last of them.

Yet the phenomenon is undoubtedly under study in at least some back rooms...
That air of governmental indifference is an assumed one...

From documents released under the Freedom of Information Act in America we have undeniable evidence of a keen interest in the phenomenon on the part of the CIA, the National Security Agency, and other government departments. The facts are meticulously documented in a recent book, CLEAR INTENT by Lawrence Fawcett and Barry J. Greenwood (Prentice-Hall, 1984). We know that the French government remains interested: GEPAN continues in existence despite ~~sh~~ingeing cuts imposed on many departments by the Mitterand government a little while ago (though we can only speculate on what use is made of its material by its directing body, the French equivalent of NASA). We know that the Russian Academy of Sciences regularly buys a surprising number of each issue of the most prestigious British journal on the UFO phenomenon (though its importation by ordinary Soviet citizens is forbidden!). We must strongly suspect - to put it no higher - that the British Ministry of Defence is taking a close interest in the phenomenon. As a former Ministry of Defence official I sincerely hope so! Anything which can enter and leave British airspace with impunity, land on British territory, leave confusing traces in our radar system, interfere with electrical and electronic devices, register itself on film and out-maneuvre British aircraft (and I think there is evidence for all these things) must surely be of more than passing interest to a government department which is charged with our defence. I hope I shall be thought to compliment rather than criticise my former colleagues and present acquaintances in Whitehall if I ruefully congratulate them on the suave effrontery with which they pretend to be taking no notice of the stranger occurrences reported to them!

A SECRET PROPERTY - Page 2 of extract

It grieves me to add that I think we have some evidence of direct and deliberate mis-statement on the part of the Ministry of Defence in at least one important case, the occurrence of strange events on two nights in late December 1980 in a part of Rendlesham Forest adjoining the USAF Base at RAF Woodbridge. We have the evidence for these events in a statement signed on 13th January 1981 by the then Deputy Base Commander, Lt.Col. (now ~~Brigadier General~~ ^{Colonel}) Charles Halt of the United States Air Force. This statement was not made public until 14th June 1983 when - following persistent pressure by the authors of CLEAR INTENT (see above) - its release was authorised by the USAF in America under the Freedom of Information Act. Whether this release was an inadvertency at rather low level in the USAF we may never know: despite the Freedom of Information Act, American agencies have proved perfectly capable (and often no doubt with good reason) of sustaining objections in the courts to the release of documents. There is certainly some evidence that Halt was not consulted about the release and that it somewhat dismayed him. Be that as it may, however, the letter of release included the extraordinary statement that the USAF had disposed of its own copy of Halt's report but that: "... through diligent inquiry and the gracious consent of Her Majesty's government, the British Ministry of Defence and the Royal Air Force, the US Air Force was provided a copy for you." The Ministry of Defence have confirmed in reply to a Parliamentary Question tabled by Major Sir Patrick Wall, MP, that a copy of Halt's report was indeed received by them. Yet we are told in a recent book - SKYCRASH by Brenda Butler, Dot Street and Jenny Randles (Neville Spearman Ltd., 1984) that the Ministry of Defence had flatly denied any knowledge of supposed ^{events} in Rendlesham Forest when enquiries were made to them in 1981, following strong local rumours of an extraordinary occurrence.

The Ministry of Defence may well have good reasons for withholding information about the Rendlesham incidents. As a former Defence official, I would not wish to press questions on any matter touching national security; and in those circumstances I would not be surprised if questions pressed by others were met by a refusal to reply. But I cannot help feeling that it is something of a lapse from the usual standards of a government department to issue a direct mis-statement. Concealment is one thing (and is often justified), false denial is quite another.

The RAF Woodbridge case of December 1980 strikes me as one of the most interesting and important of recent years, anyway in this country - perhaps the most significant military sighting (or supposed sighting) since the celebrated events of 13th/14 August 1956 near RAF Bentwaters and RAF Lakenheath (both of which are, by an entertaining coincidence, quite close to Woodbridge in that much-haunted county of Suffolk). Those who wish to study the Bentwaters/Lakenheath incidents will find descriptions of them in the books mentioned below. The RAF Woodbridge case is described at length in SKYCRASH (see above). It is also to be the subject of several radio and television programmes. Much was said about it in THE NEWS OF THE WORLD in 1983, mainly in its issues of 2nd and 9th October. Alone in Fleet Street, the then editor, Derek Jameson decided to give space to Halt's report; and Keith Beabey of THE NEWS OF THE WORLD pursued it vigorously in the face of the kind of ridicule which the "quality" newspapers seem to find it expedient to attach to this mysterious and persistent phenomenon.

It was the Woodbridge case which prompted me to take up a long-shelved intention to write a "UFO book". I have chosen, quite deliberately, to cast it as a piece of fiction. Fiction allows the imagination to range widely, and it seems to me that this can sometimes be productive in turning better-qualified minds to new aspects of a problem. A false hypothesis can often have as much heuristic value as a good one! It does, at the least, enable serious researchers to consider - and properly test - a new idea, even if only to throw it away when it fails to stand up to scrutiny. I am far from being wedded to the hypothesis on which A SECRET PROPERTY is based. The main object of the book is to entertain, and to do so in the form of a thriller. It most certainly does not reflect any inside knowledge or startling revelation on the part of a former Defence official. (If I had such knowledge, the Official Secrets Act would forbid me to reveal it!).

I will skip the introductions, as we both know who one another is. I apologise for placing several requests in one letter, but trust that you will bide with me.

1: RAF Woodbridge 27 December 1980: I realise we have discussed this matter at length, but a great deal of vital new information has come our way since concluding our book "SKY CRASH" last year. I would like to pose some specific questions to you:-

(a) What is your position regarding the involvement of the British civilian police in the taking of photographs of the landed object? We have excellent evidence for this, and presume that the British police would advise the MoD. If not, then why not?

(b) You have doubtless seen the extensive "smear" campaign being successfully waged by the British media (under whose guidance I wonder?). Eg "The Guardian", 5 Jan 1985. On this thesis a gross mistake was made (a lighthouse seriously misperceived, background radiation levels viewed as sinister, rabbit holes regarded as something else). Not only that, but this "evidence" was supported by the US deputy base commander and the UK base commander, whom 17 days later could surely have figured some of these cock-ups out. This grand blunder is then perpetuated over the course of years; the UK commander remains in charge, the two base commanders (US), at the time and subsequently, endorse all the evidence (we have it in writing) and the deputy commander gets promoted to base commander. Now regardless of what sort of MoD investigation into these events was (or was not) conducted this leaves one with a serious dilemma. If the "lighthouse/normal radiation/rabbits" theory is correct then all your strategic commanders at a NATO base (for which you certainly have jurisdiction) are incompetent dodos who might be expected to misinterpret Orford Ness lighthouse for an invading MIG jet, not have a clue whether they have been irradiated by an exploding neutron bomb, and waste a great deal of the war filling in bomb potholes made by the Rendlesham Forest wildlife! I think the people of this country might be rather worried if that were the case. And frankly, unless you can help us refute this lighthouse nonsense then we are just going to have to make sure the British people see this interesting paradox. Believe me we have people in the right place to make sure this happens! Comments please.

(c) Since it is vital to the theory that the date not be 27 December 1980, but 26 December, then have you any way of confirming or denying the real date? Of course the Halt memo to you says the 27th, but that is dated 17 days later and suggests that he just made yet another mistake. (In view of such a plethora of errors how could Halt possibly have merited a base commandership?) However, some sort of action must have occurred between 26/27 December and the 13 January memo; either at your end, elsewhere in government, or at the base. The correct date would have been essential to confirm or refute options (eg a spy-plane mission). So I am sure there are ways you can look into this. I am not asking for details - just a statement regarding your level of confidence in the Halt memo dating.

2: We are investigating an incident dated 2 August 1984 from Salisbury Plain, Wilts. This occurred at 23.00 BST and was reported by [Section 40] and family, of Bedfordshire. We have received excellent cooperation from them and from PC [Section 40] of the Kitchin police, who investigated the matter at their request on 3 August. The matter was reported to the MoD, as both witness and police affirm. We recognise that certain aspects of the case fit a military manoeuvre that was going on that night; although some puzzles remain. It would help us in our resolution of this case if you could offer any data you have at your end. I know you regard things as confidential, and that you have decided not to release data generally. I respect the reasoning for this. But here I am making a specific request with the backing of police and witnesses, so there is no real purpose in confidentiality. Any records you have for that event/or potentially related events on the same night would help.

3: Finally I am making a request for any information you may have regarding an incident which occurred around midnight on the night of 23-24 August 1984 in the vicinity of Ipswich. We have details of an in-flight collision between an aircraft and something (which at this point we have no reason to suspect is UFO related). The airport involved and the investigators of the accident have been helpful. But it would be useful to have any data which the MoD have at their disposal on this affair. If you have any reports of sightings around this time it would be interesting to know; although in this case there is more than a fair chance the source was not a UFO-related phenomenon.

I address my communication direct to [Section 40] or the current section head of DS 8, rather than [Section 40]. I know [Section 40] courteously asserts that he is the person we should communicate with, but with all due respect we have good reason for in this instance not doing so. No offence on [Section 40] intended. I am sure he is very able at his job. And our reasons for contacting [Section 40] direct are not personal.

I am writing in response to the letter received, dated 9 March 1982. As my information can no longer be considered as classified, I am now able to pass it onto you.

The letter that I sent to you, was only a small fraction, of the work that I had done on U.F.O. research. I was in fact in physical and psychic contact with an E.T. called Algar; whom I have had a relationship with since 1958, and it continued until 1981, when he was killed by another race of beings.

So to start at the beginning. I was seven years old, when I first saw traces left by a U.F.O. At the time I lived at Section 40 Glasgow. One Saturday, morning I had the impression that I should go out to the back, so much it was like an obsession (DIA 1). When I did go to the back, I found three indentations in the ground, they were in triangular formation. Each indentation was the same distance from it's partner, and they gave the impression that three large ball bearings had been dropped there. My first thought was that it was a U.F.O.; but I had never ever heard of U.F.O. or flying saucers, and yet the thought seemed normal to me, as if I used it on a regular basis. I told my father, who was rather quick at ridiculing and poo-pooing what I had told him. Anyway, a couple of months later, the first visit came from E.T.s, which was followed by a few more. They were of green gas which solidified when it came in from the passage way, which led to the toilet under the door, and the wardrobe, which was situated against the door preventing it from opening. (DIA 2). There was one which was green and very large, that had eyes all over it, this one came three times. Then there was a woman with very sharp features, and what looked like fat worms sticking out of her head, where the hair should be. The last visit from the large green thing happenend when my father tried to get into the bedroom, as usual I was against the door, with fear. My father was at the time, fairly atheletic and no weakling, but no matter how hard he pushed he could not get the door open; not until the large green thing had gone.

1959, I found semi-transparent, slug like creatures crawling up the wall on the opposite side of the back. At this period of time I was in with a band, especially, the lead singer Section 40 and the drummer [redacted]. Both of them saw the creatures. The end product of this was that we armed ourselves and started to shoot them, we used .22 air rifles at a range of fifty to seventy five yards. When we did kill them, they fell off the wall and took on the appearance of cement that had got damp and solidified. Quite often they would fall and appear to go through the ground leaving no trace at all. One day we found that we were unable to hit our targets, and we could see our shots pass through the targets, by the ricochete off the wall, and after that we found that it was a waste of time trying to shoot them, so we gave up as a bad job. (DIA 3).

I was stationed at Keogh Barracks - Sept. 1968 April 1969 - when I was in the R.A.M.C., and Algar was with me then, even in spite of other E.T.s going away. A strong bond was forming of friendship and trust. One incident involves telepathic contact, and that occurred, following an incident when I was unusually indecisive. It was when I was on guard duty, and I was asked if I would like the first tour, to which I normally said yes, but thank God I eventually declined, for the first one was critically injured with the pick elf he was carrying. It was on the basis of safety, that we were to go in pairs from then on, and it was under these conditions that I got a telepathic link with Algar. We were returning to the guard house after our patrol, and to our right was a field, which had lighting only on the road on which we were walking. Apart from the lighting mentioned, the field was totally dark. I heard only what I can describe as a whisper, and it was saying that someone was creeping about in the field, to the front and slightly right. I immediately looked in that direction but saw nothing. But as I had heard this whisper several times before, and it had proved accurate, I decided to follow it through. I sent my partner around the camp museum, which was situated about twenty yards behind us, and I went to a lamp, and prepared to go into the field. It was at this point, when someone came out of the dark. I then called my partner and after a few heated words, I convinced the stranger who had no i.d. on him, to accompany us to the guard house. (DIA 4).

The real work began in May, 1979, when my wife and I formed a team, and together we collected such data as:- what the different coloured lights on a U.F.O. means, how they manage to evade radar, what fuel they use and what it looks like, I have been to their bases which were in Wirral and Cheshire. There was a curious incident which took place over the river Mersey, by the Wallasey Town Hall. There were six U.F.O.s flying at speed up and down the river, when I noticed a black one was trying to manoeuvre the other six. Unfortunately, the black one was shot down, it hit the water in front of the Town Hall. As I was watching, the front end of the U.F.O. hit the water, then the whole U.F.O. disappeared; leaving the water to splash, as if done by an invisible entity.

In June, 1981, Algar, was ready to approach the government in person. I was over the moon with pride to be used as the medium between alien race and our own race. Unfortunately, another race of E.T. decided to attack Algar, and his team of scientists, and killed Algar and several members of his team. That of course was that. It was not until October, 24 1981, that they sent some one to dominate me by using threats, and eventually attacking me, the E.T. died during his attack on me. Since there have been four responses to my telepathic messages sent out, but two of those contacts have been lost. But of the two who are still in contact, one is a woman, but I am unable to give you her name. The other is a male and his name is Maloben, he says he comes from the Milky Way, and that his planet is called Platone.

I am intending to make contacts strong, and hopefully make a meeting between the alien race and our Government, with the information that I have now given you, I hope that you would reconsider sponsoring my research. The information that I have given you is accurate and truthful. Although there is lots more, I decided to give you what I thought was the most important to you.
