SIGHTING OF UFO's

Sub-Divisional Officer, Holmfirth

The attached statements relate to sightings of a flying object which was of such a nature that it was not readily identifiable. It was seen at approximately 6.55 am on Friday, 27 November 1987.

The first informant is a [REDACTED] Section 40 [REDACTED], an [REDACTED] Section 40 of [REDACTED] Holmfirth.

He was driving a motor vehicle along [REDACTED] Section 40 Netherthong towards Huddersfield Road when he observed a very brilliant spherical ball of white light motionless in the sky. It appeared to be 200/300 feet above the hill line at Farnley Tyas and was 1/2 miles away from him. It remained in position for 2/3 seconds, then moved slowing before accelerating at a tremendous speed creating a pinky orange firetail. It plummeted earthwards and dropped out of view behind the horizon. It was within his view for 10/20 seconds. Section 40 has drawn a sketch plan identifying the location.

The second informant is a [REDACTED] Section 40 [REDACTED] who is also a [REDACTED] Section 40 (at the same premises as [REDACTED] Section 40 of [REDACTED] Section 40) Almondbury, Huddersfield, who was waiting on foot in Southfield Road, Almondbury, when he saw a very bright round white light. It was moving when he saw it but not creating any noise and was only in view for 2/3 seconds.

Weather conditions were good in that it was a clear sky with dawn breaking although it was cold and frosty.

The incident was not reported at the time but statements have now been obtained and I ask that they be forwarded to General Administration at Headquarters for onward transmission to the Ministry of Defence, Duty Controller, Aeronautical Information Services (Military) R.A.F., West Drayton.

towards the direction of Huddersfield Road. May I say I know it

was this time because I had just glanced at the car clock as I

was waiting for the News headlines on the car radio at 7 am.

I ducked down slightly in the car in order to turn my car radio on.

I did this and again assumed normal driving position and as soon

as I did this I saw straight ahead of me above the hill - horizon,

a very brilliant spherical ball of white light, the object or

whatever it was at this time was motionless in the sky.

I would say that the 'object' was some 1 or 2 miles away from me

and appeared about 200/300 feet above the distant hill line,

the hill line I refer to is the hills at Farnley Tyas which

are to the right of Castle Hill as I was looking at it.

I continued to drive down the road at a slow speed, keeping my

eyes on the object. A few seconds later I saw the object begin

to very slowly move to the right in a horizontal plane and then

it suddenly accelerated at a tremendous speed in the same direction

as before. This created a pinky orange firetail which filled

the length of my windscreen. At the very last moment, it suddenly

veered in a downward path as if plummeting towards the earth and I suddenly thought, it's going to crash into the village of Stocksmoor, it gave that impression anyway. The object went out of my view behind the hill line and that's the last I saw of it. I would say I watched it in total for about 10/20 seconds.

I can say that for certain it wasn't the light from the top of Castle Hill, I could see this clearly also.

I am also certain that it wasn't a shooting star.

I feel quite sure having seen it that it wasn't just an inanimate object. It must have had some programming or intelligence to make it move in the way it did.

I cannot describe it further from where I was other than a ball of light, and in no way whatsoever was it an aeroplane.

The time in question when I saw the object was a very clear cold frosty morning with dawn just breaking. The sky was a very pale blue.

Having thought about the matter since, I feel that I ought to mention a felling I have had concerning the object and its possible reason for its stationary position when I first saw it and that is it appeared to be almost directly between the paths of two Transmitter masts. The first being the large Emley Moor mast and the second one is a small booster mast located in a field just right of Upperhag Road.

To assist I have drawn a rough sketch of the scene and area I have stated. I have signed the sketch at the bottom right hand corner,

At 6.55 am Friday, 27 November 1987, I was waiting in Southfield Road, near my house, for a friend to attend in his car to collect me for work. I was looking down Southfield Road, my friend drives up when he collects me, and over towards Lepton Edge which against the sky line forms the nearest horizon.

My eye was suddenly caught by a very bright round object, having the intensity of white light of a car about 50/100 yards away, shining white in colour. It travelled from my left towards my right in front of me and seemed to dip to the right as it went over the horizon. The horizon at this point I know to be about one mile distant from where I was stood. Altogether I saw the object about 3/4 seconds before it disappeared from sight.

It actually appeared to have been travelling in a line from somewhere over and above and behind my left shoulder to a point above and in front of my right shoulder as I was looking out, it travelling left to right but away from me at the same time.

There was no sound at all all as it passed or anything else other than it being a bright round white light. From where I was stood it was only just clearing the houses on the horizon left to right before it disappeared over the horizon.

The height of the object would be similar, I would guess to that of a light aircraft rather than a jet, perhaps  $\frac{1}{2}$ / $\frac{3}{4}$  mile up.

The object had a steady constant speed as it moved across the sky.

When I first saw the object appear at my left hand side field of view, I would say it was half way towards the near horizon, say about half a mile away, I only noticed it looking down the road, it looked as though it would have come into view from behind houses to my left hand side and out into the open sky.

The weather conditions at the time were clear, I could see other stars in the sky against the darker background with dawn still not breaking.


The only real landmarks around Huddersfield area, or near Almondbury, would be the Emley Moor TV Mast. The object would be heading somewhere to the left hand side of Emley Moor Mast (Wakefield side) and it passed.

I have an ex-service background, in that I was in the Royal Navy from early 1942 to 1946 working on Minesweeping and later Aircraft Carrier on general and technical duties and finishing as Steward.

I had no Flight or Air Traffic type training just purely Navy work. I mentioned it to the man that picked me up for work but he hadn't seen anything.

Whilst at work that morning, I found that someone at work had also seen the same or similar thing that I had seen. I didn't know he had reported it until the Police contacted me about it, via our Works Personnel Department.




