Section 40 describes himself as a 'seasoned' cosmologist and has recorded sightings earlier. He also has access to radio receiving equipment and apparently monitors aircraft V.H.F. transmitters.

The informant has previous military service having served in the R.A.F. 1954-58. He states that he was a corporal and ~~served~~ served with aircraft crash rescue. During his R.A.F. service he says that he saw U.F.O's on Salisbury Plain.

The object was seen somewhere above the I.C.I. chemical works

in Huddersfield. The complex lies near the main Leeds Road from Huddersfield which itself is located in the valley of the River Colne, which runs in a north easterly direction from the town centre. The east side of its valley rises steeply from the valley floor to height of about 200' above it. The valley side lies immediately to the west of the chemical complex. Within the confines of this locality are 4 Gantries which hold the floodlighting for the adjacent Huddersfield Town football ground and electricity transmission lines traverse the area both on the valley floor and its sides.

with that of a medium sized passenger airline

After first sighting this object I immediately went and got my binoculars which I always keep next to the chair. I then went out of the front door and took a position up about halfway down the garden path.

I was now able to use the binoculars to gain a more detailed view of object. I could now see that it was in fact a wedge shape with the thicker end towards Muddersfield town centre and tapering to a point which was facing towards the I.C.I. chemical works on Leeds Road. The white lights which I had seen earlier had now apparently changed position. These positioning now was as follows two on the underside at the pointed end and one light above. Immediately behind the two underneath lights were 3 red lights which I could describe as being of high intensity and possibly of a fluorescent type. These were smaller than the white lights but I would say that they larger than an aircrafts navigational lights. Further behind these 3 red lights was another white light and a fifth white light was located on the upper side of the wedge approximately mid-way along its length. I stood and watched this with both my wife and daughter, the object appeared to move very slowly but smoothly over the half mile which is the distance from its original position and the I.C.I. complex. The object also maintained its altitude and at no time did I hear any engine or other noise coming from it.

My wife and daughter now returned to the sitting room but I remained outside and kept the object in view. The object now veered towards the south-east and its speed increased. It headed off in a steady speed towards Cooper Bridge and appeared to me to be following the electricity transmission lines. As I watched the object seemed to fade away into the distance until eventually lost sight of it.

I would say that the duration of the sighting was between five and seven minutes. The weather conditions were high altitude but patchy layered cloud. There was no rain and wind conditions at ground level were calm. It was dusk although

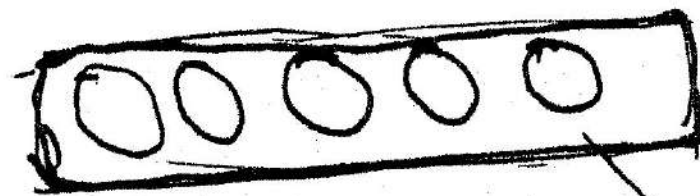
