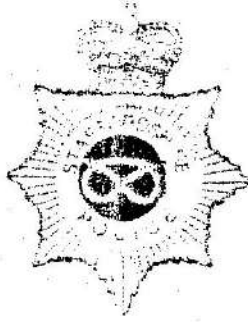

I am Section 40 of the above address. I work as a taxi driver for Section 40 who are based at Section 40 Hemsworth.

At 11.50 pm on Thursday 24th of March 1988 I was driving a taxi on the Brierly Road towards Great Houghton on the way to pick up a fair at Middlecliffe.

I was about 3/4 of a mile out of Great Houghton travelling at about 25 miles per hour as I was in no rush. As I looked in my wing mirror a bright light caught my eye off to my right. As I looked up to my right I noticed a very bright white-green light. At first I thought it was an airplane in trouble as it looked to be very low in the sky and I noticed two red lights to the side of the big light. I then slowed down to gain a better view of it at this point I could see a vague outline and more lights became visible.

At this point the lights had aroused enough curiosity for me to stop the car and wind down my window to gain a better view. I turned off the engine and switched off my lights by this time it was vertically level with me so I got out of the car at this point I'd say what I saw was about 800 yards away from me travelling in the direction of Thomscoe, South Yorkshire. As I watched the craft hover past me I made a diagram on a piece of scrap note pad I had with me.

The craft was a silver green metallic colour and was in my sight for about 10 minutes before fading away. The sky was clear with a slight breeze. I could hear a very slight low toned humming sound which faded as the craft passed over me.

The next day on Friday 25th of March 1988 I was back at taxi base on Lowfield crescent Hemsworth. At about 8.50 pm that night I went out to my car to pick up a fare.

As I went out the car the same bright white green light caught my eye again. I looked up and watched it for about 2 or 3 minutes as it grew larger.

At this point I went inside the house and got my aunt Section 40 out to look at what I'd seen. About 2 minutes later she came outside and saw about 1/4 of a mile away a form of elongated spinning top about the size of 3 times the size of a hot air balloon at this point my aunt ran back inside the house and I observed it for a further 10 minutes before again it faded away over towards South Morden. Again the night was cold, there was nothing obstructing my view of what I saw. I have not seen anything since and I worked until about 2 o'clock am today.

I am a full time store supervisor working at Section 40 at Aikworth.
 At 8.50 pm on Friday 25 March 1988, I was inside my house at Section 40 Hemsworth, when I heard my nephew Section 40 shouting loudly for me to come outside. When I went outside, he said "look up in the sky". I looked up into the sky in the direction of Hemsworth High School and I saw a brilliant white light in the sky, the light was slightly higher than an electricity pylon from the ground, although I was not able to estimate how far away the light was.

After watching the light for approximately two minutes, during which time the light appeared to be floating, I went into the house to phone up my sister, Section 40 who lives just around the corner, to tell her to look at the light.

Approximately one minute later, I went outside to see the light still in the same position in the sky, at this time I noticed that the light appeared to be attached to the base of a round object which was just visible below the level of the clouds, the object appeared to make no noise at all and the light did not throw a beam in any direction, I am unable to state the colour of the body of the object.

I watched the object hover in the sky for a further 2 or 3 seconds whereupon the object appeared to drop slightly down in the sky, before the object climbed higher into the sky before disappearing from my sight in the direction of Hemsworth High School.

I can say that at the time of the incident, the night was cold and clear, there was a slight breeze, and the cloud base was quite low, there was no obstruction in my line of sight of the object, and I observed the object for a total of approximately

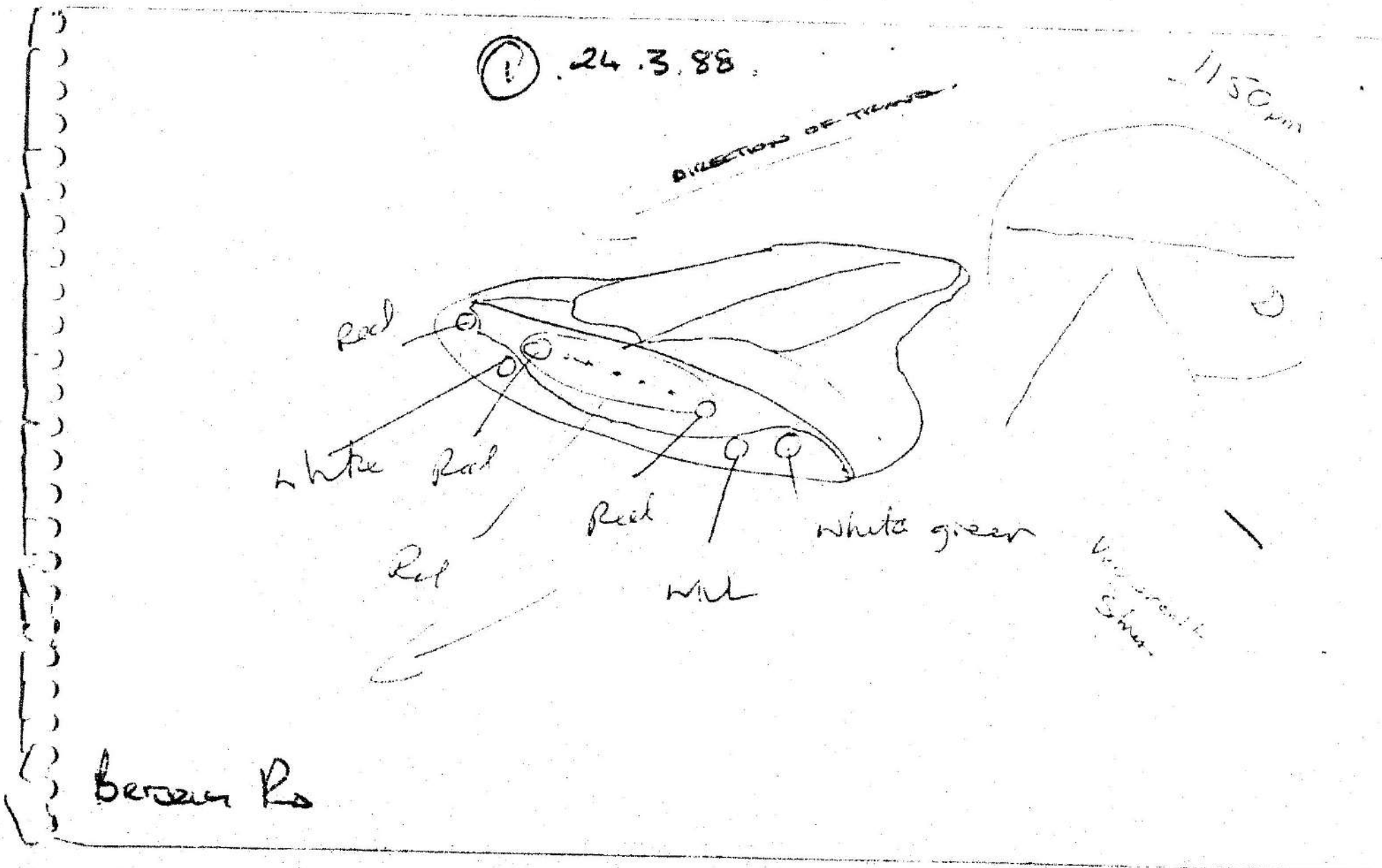

to 8 minutes, during which time the object did not move and was not obstructed in any way. It is very difficult to estimate the size of the object, but I would say that the part of it I saw was very big.

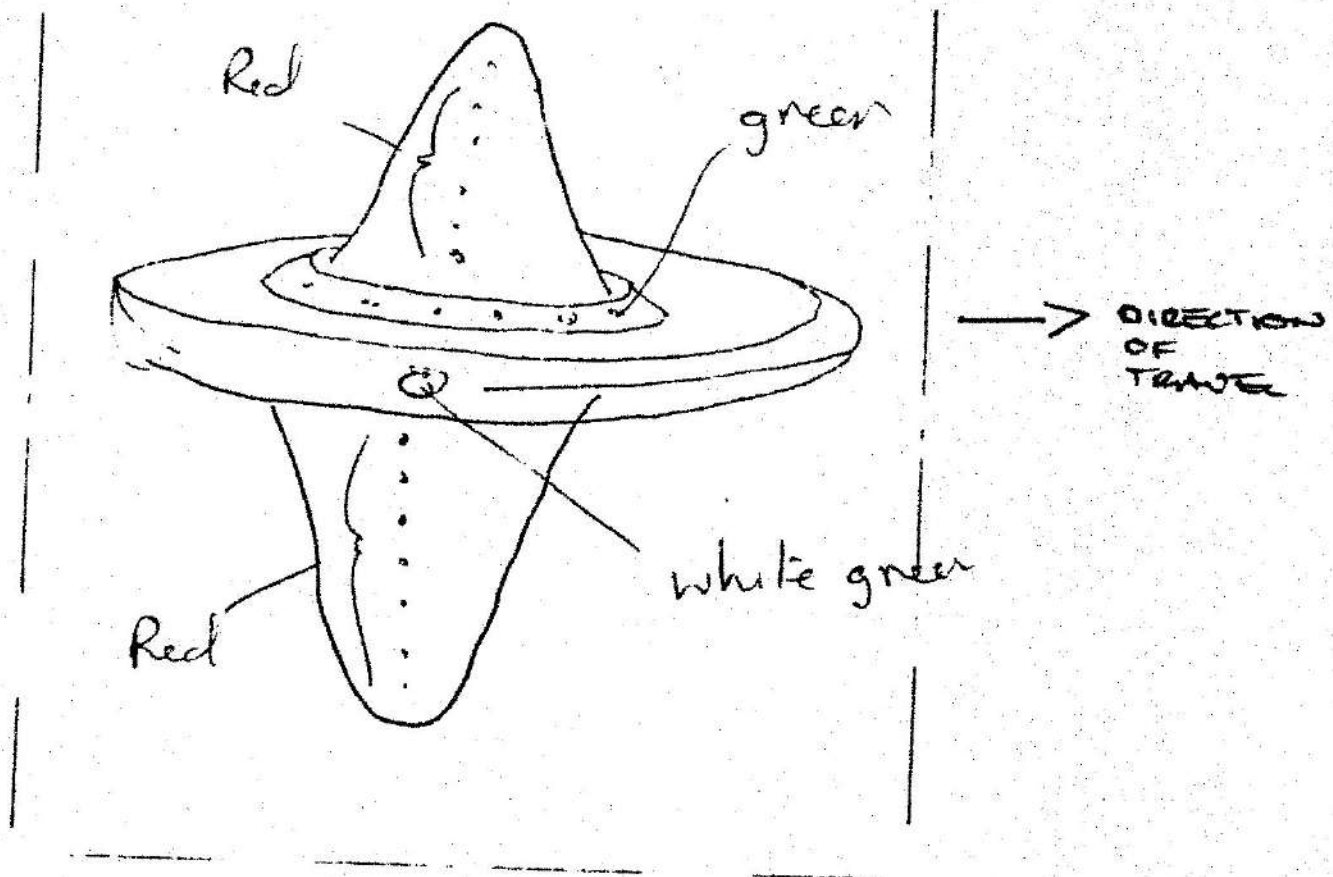

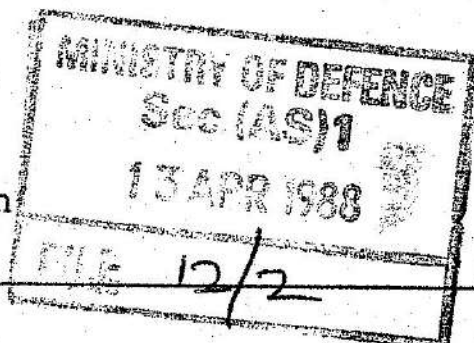

REPORTS OF UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT (UFO) - 30 MAR 88

1. The enclosed report refers to the sighting by **Section 40** of a UFO on 30 Mar 88 at Bircotes, near Doncaster.
2. You may wish to know that I have been approached by a local newspaper, The Rotherham Advertiser, who have received 3 other reports appearing to refer to the same incident. All 3 sightings made to the newspaper occurred on 30 Mar 88 between 0530 and 0535. The reports were as follows:
 - a. **Section 40** reported seeing a large, white light travelling very fast at 0530 at Brecks, near Rotherham.
 - b. **Section 40** reported seeing a white light the size of a football which landed outside his house at **Section 40** near Maltby at 0535. The object fizzled away on impact with the ground and left no mark or debris.
 - c. **Section 40**, reported seeing a UFO at 0530 over Rotherham whilst she was travelling to work.
3. In addition, the Daily Mirror newspaper contacted me on 5 Apr 88 in connection with recent UFO sightings in this area. The reporter, **Section 40** believed the sightings to be connected with unusual weather patterns in this area.
