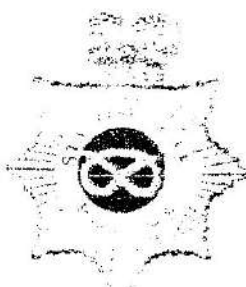

REPORT OF AN UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT

A. DATE, TIME AND DURATION OF SIGHTING

FRIDAY, 4TH MARCH, 1988 AT 20.00 HRS. FOR APPROX. 30 MINS.

B. DESCRIPTION OF OBJECT

TWO WHITE LIGHTS, THE ONE TO THE RIGHT BEING SLIGHTLY DIMMER. THE INFORMANT WAS UNABLE TO MAKE OUT THE SHAPE OF THE OBJECT BUT ESTIMATED THE DISTANCE BETWEEN THE TWO LIGHTS TO BE APPROX. 40 TO 60 FEET.

C. EXACT POSITION OBSERVED

THE INFORMANT WAS TRAVELLING IN HIS CAR IN THE BURTON ON TRENT AREA AND THE OBJECT REMAINED IN VIEW AS HE TRAVELLED ALONG THE A38 AND A5 TRUNK ROADS AND HE WAS ABLE TO PICK IT OUT WITH THE USE OF BINOCULARS FROM HIS HOME ADDRESS.

D. HOW OBSERVED

THE OBJECT WAS IN A WESTERLY POSITION

ORIGINALLY WITH THE NAKED EYE AND LATER WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF BINOCULARS. THE INFORMANT TOOK A NUMBER OF PHOTOGRAPHS OF IT FROM HIS HOME ADDRESS.

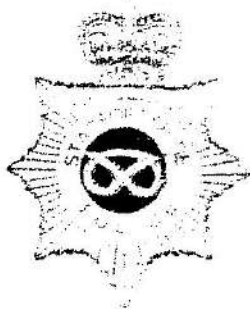

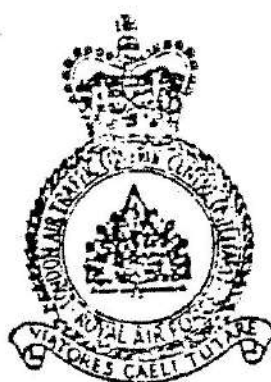

FO SIGHTING

Sub Divisional Officer, Bradford Central

At 1930 hours on Thursday, 18 February 1988 I was off duty with my wife and 8 year old daughter. We were travelling in my vehicle along Toller Lane, Bradford towards Bingley.

When approximately at the junction with Leylands Lane, my daughter remarked that she could see a star that was moving. My wife looked at the object and said that it looked like a line of shining white lights and was going in the same direction as ourselves. I leant across the car and saw the object myself. It appeared to be fairly high in the sky. I could see a line of white lights travelling at the usual speed of an aeroplane.

My family requested that I stop to look more closely and I decided to stop in Thorne Lane off Bingley Road. This road overlooks the whole area and judging by the speed of the object I thought I would get there before it did.

However, as I passed the junction with Haworth Road, my wife who had watched the object continually, remarked that it suddenly turned left and accelerated quickly away.

When I stopped in Thorne Lane some seconds later the object was nowhere in sight.

During the period whilst it was in sight I glanced at it on three occasions. It was the size of a small passenger plane and it was difficult to judge its shape. The line of lights suggested it was long and thin.

I could hear no noise over the car noise. It was observed with the naked eye and no photographs were taken.

The weather was dry and windy, there were a few clouds in the sky that were moving quite fast with the wind. The object flew over a housing estate the only large buildings would be the Bradford Royal Infirmary and Sharpe's Printers.

On first seeing the object it could have been an aeroplane even though we could not see any coloured lights but when the object changed direction suddenly and accelerated we were sure it was not.

I have attached a map showing where my vehicle travelled during the sighting. The dotted line is the approximate route taken by the object.

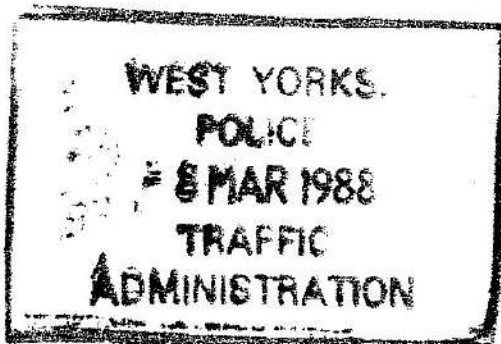

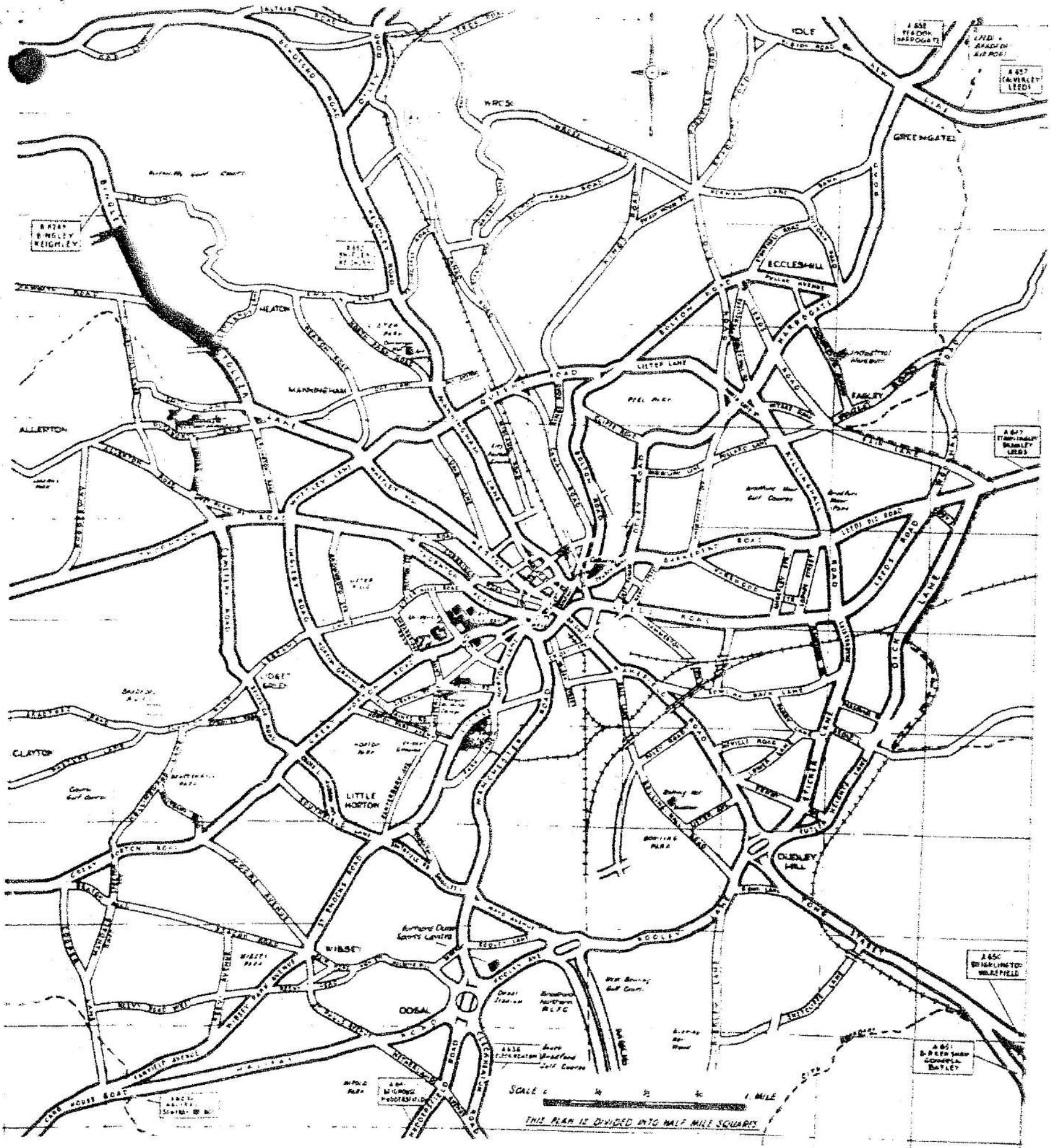

Cathedral Formerly (C3)
