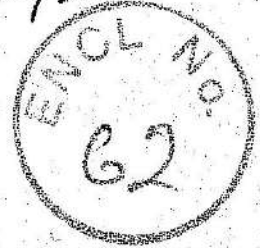

Any other pertinent info. I was sleeping lightly in my car when Section 40 woke me and asked me to look at the object he had been observing for about 5-6 min. It was roughly in the direction where the sky was lightening prior to sunrise. The sun eventually came above the horizon at 0455 hrs local (observed on video monitor) and could be seen through the haze by naked eye at 0510 hrs local.

The position of the object when observed corresponded roughly to other previous observers had reported lights above the horizon.
