

It was roughly in the direction where the sky was lightening prior to sunrise. The sun eventually came above the horizon at 0435 hrs local (observed on video monitor) and could be seen through the haze by naked eye at 0510 hrs local.

The position of the object when observed corresponded roughly to when previous observers had reported light above the horizon.
