## Prepare to enter the Twilight Zone — you may see a saucer

SNODLAND could have had the strangest tourists of the season — aliens.

A couple from Townsend Road believe they saw flying saucers hovering over the North Downs on two nights this week.

Sue Nye and her husband Geoff first saw two saucers over houses towards the North Downs at about 10pm on Monday night.

Mrs Nye said: "We watched them for a little while and they went away. A couple of hours later we saw one again. It had flashing lights and kept turning round as if it was watching something. We watched it for about an hour."

The next night the couple say they saw the strange shapes again. This time there were three.

A spokesman for Rochester Air-

port said no reports of UFO sightings had been reported to them.

But according to Nick Pope, of the secretariat to the air staff at the Ministry of Defence, there have already been 60 reports of UFO sightings in Britain this year.

## KENT is preparing for royalty and looking forward to a visit from the Princess of Wales in October.

The Princess's agenda on October 21 begins in the morning when she opens the newly-built Paula Carr Diabetes Centre at the William Harvey Hospital in Ashford.

Then it's on to Aylesford for the official opening of the Heart of Kent Hospice.

In the afternoon the princess arrives at Tunbridge Wells to open the Royal Victoria Place shopping centre before visiting the West Kent branch of RELATE at Sevenoaks in her capacity as patron of the organisation.

The Paula Carr centre, at the William Harvey Hospital, was set up in memory of Paula, 12, of Orton Way, Willesborough, who died of diabetes in April 1988.

A £250,000 trust fund was launched in March 1989 by Cllr John Simpson who was Deputy Mayor of Ashford at the time.

### Approval

Mr Simpson, also a diabetic, started the fund to build the centre for more than 4,500 diabetics in the South East.

Thanks to various fundraising schemes from local people, the centre was finished last September.

Mr Simpson said: "We are all thrilled that the Princess is coming to officially open the centre. It's a tremendous honour for Ashford."

"I believe the people that have worked so hard to get this scheme off the ground deserve this, it's the highest honour that can be given."

Janet Carr, Paula's mother, hopes to meet the Princess.

She said: "It really is marvellous that she is coming to visit us, it really wasn't expected at all. It proves something good has come out of Paula's death."

The Princess is set to give the Heart of Kent Hospice at Aylesford the Royal seal of approval by performing an official opening ceremony.

The Princess, who is known to take a great interest in the hospice movement, is expected to spend some time chatting with patients when she visits the unit at Preston Hall, Aylesford, to unveil a plaque.

Matron Linda Hodgson said she and the unit's staff were thrilled to hear about the Royal visit, which had been arranged by the hospice's patron, the Viscountess Monckton of Brethley.
