

THE REPORTER STRESSED THAT SHE HAD WATCHED THIS BRIGHT LIGHT ON TWO SUCCESSIVE MORNINGS, UNTIL IT SEEMED TO REcede INTO THE DISTANCE, "LIKE A TINY SILVER BALL". SHE HAS CONTACTED A REPORTER FROM THE WESTERN DAILY PRESS, AND THE PAPER HAS PENTON A 'STILL' PHOTO FROM HER VIDEO FOOTAGE.

LOOKING FROM THE CONTROL TOWER AT BRISTOL AIRPORT, A BRIGHT LIGHT COULD BE SEEN TO THE E, HIGH IN THE SKY (APPROX 60° ELEV), BUT THIS APPEARED TO BE A BRIGHT PLANET OR STAR. A PHONE CALL TO [REDACTED] CONFIRMED THAT THIS WAS NOT THE OBJECT HE WAS VIEWING.



He also mentioned that he saw another UFO back in November at 2.00 am. The object had a bank of 3 flashing lights which changed from Red to Green to White. The object was very high (thousands of feet) and moved very fast in a jagged pattern — would travel very fast, stop, & then move off in a completely different direction. Object was seen from a car with three other witnesses.

I mentioned to him that the objects he saw last Saturday might have been airships — but he didn't seem to be too convinced. I said that we (that means you!) could check to see if any were in the area at that time & that we (you) would let him know. I also said that we could let him know if we had received any other reports. He asked if we could check radar tapes — I said possibly.

Could you get back to him next week? — I promised you would!

PS. I forgot to give him the names of the **Section 40** approved UFO groups — something else you can cheer him up with.
