Dear Sir,

Acting on the advice of Section 40 author, I am writing to tell you of a sighting I had last week which he said would possibly interest you.

My occupation is that of Section 40 and I am currently seconded to the Prison Service. I work in the Section 40

On Tuesday, 15th November, I was in the Probation General Office which is located in the administration building known as The Facade. Norwich Prison occupies a position on Mousehold Heath about a hundred feet above the level of the City. The building faces W.S.W. directly towards the C.E. Cathedral.

At approximately 4.15 p.m. a member of the Support Staff asked me whether I could identify a row of bright lights to the West. Together we looked at a map of the City and concluded that the lights were on the ground in the vicinity of the University. They appeared to be the kind of lights used on a sports ground. My colleague had not noticed them before.

The next day, Wednesday, I was in the office, the time being approximately 7.45 a.m. I looked once again at the map of the City and having done so went to the window to see whether I could identify where it was that we had seen the lights on the previous day.

The morning was exceptionally bright, the sky clear of cloud. The air temperature was mild, there was little, if any, breeze. There was no haze over the City.

While I was searching the sky-line to the right, or W.N.W., my eyes were made conscious of a light to my left, two lights in fact. I enclose a sketch I made a couple of minutes later which will give an idea of the position of the images in relation to the spire of the Cathedral. The sketch is made sight-size.

At first I thought the scene was ordinary enough; the rising sun was already strong and it seemed that I was seeing two hot air balloons, formed from a silvery material. They were identical

in size and perfectly round, about 1/4" to 3/8" diameter. They appeared solid, faced directly to the sun I neither expected to see nor did I see any lessening of reflected light to the edges of the images and so they appeared not to be spherical. Neither of the images showed any movement during the minute or so that I observed them.

I noticed that there were no baskets beneath the balloons and although they appeared to have little altitude I saw no bursts of flame as I should have expected. The brightness of the light coming from the surfaces of the objects made it impossible for me to estimate their distance.

There was neither sight nor sound of aircraft, neither was there, after the images ceased to be visible, any cloud or indication of their presence. The objects appeared to be substantial, to be reflecting light and not emanating it.

Without the objects having moved in relation to the buildings beneath them, after about a minute they both vanished in an instant; they did diminish in intensity of light or size but vanished from view. *not*

The windows to the office had been cleaned two or three days before the sighting. There was no light on in the office and neither was any of the office equipment switched on. What I saw was not a reflection on the window from within the room.

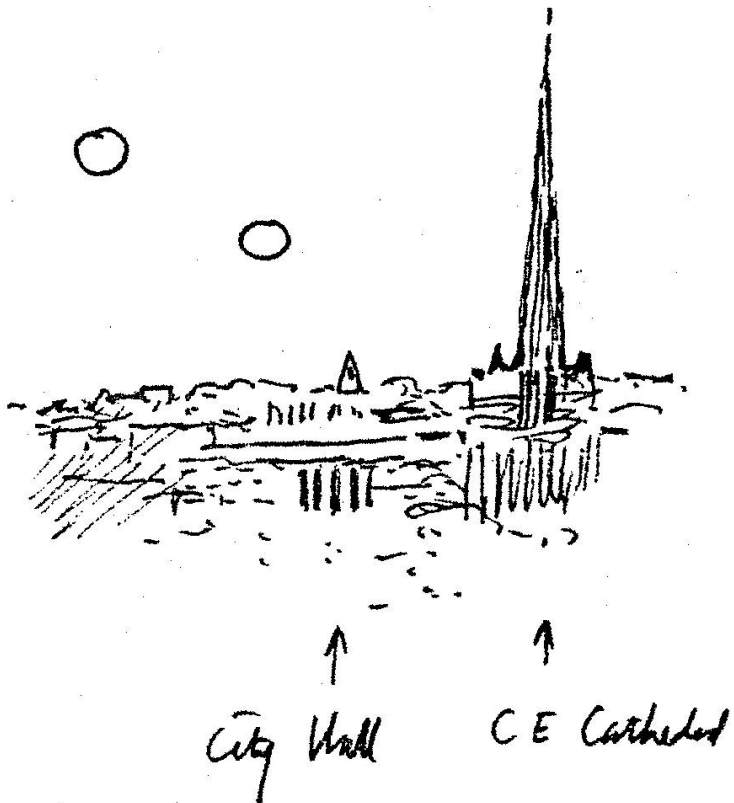
The sketch was made immediately after I saw the images and drawn from the same position in which I had stood. At no time while watching the images or objects did they make any kind of movement.

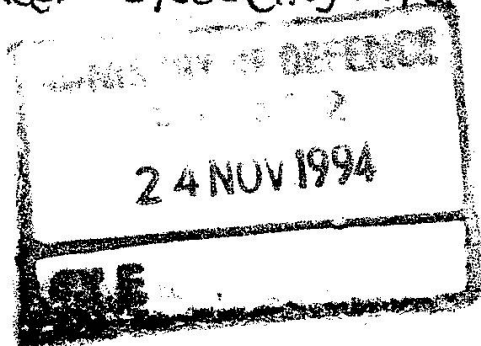

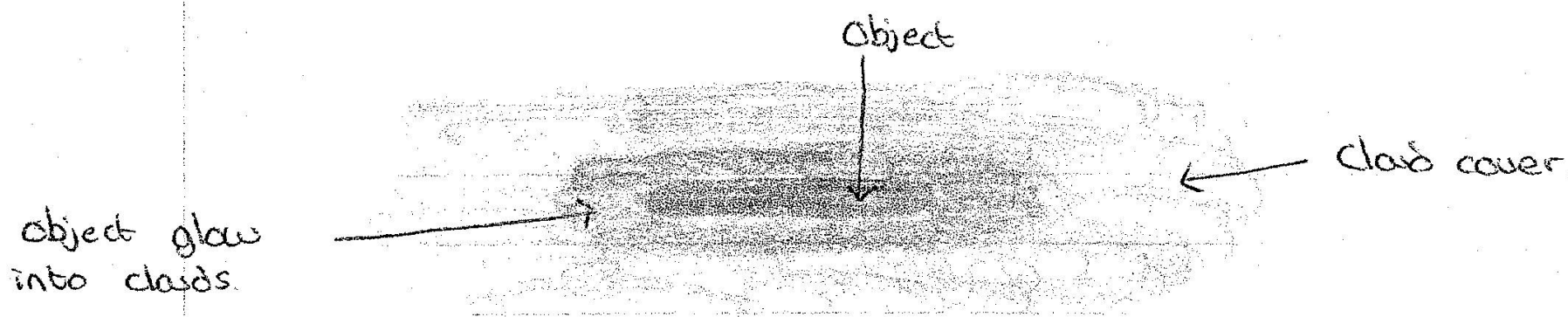

A group of us from the Barrack Block at RAF Brawdy were called out late at night to man up 4 tonners and head for the Black mountains, to guard the crash site of a Tornado aircraft. All of us were split into shifts and formed a guard perimeter around the site.

In the early hours of one morning I was on guard, the wind was blowing, and I decided to shelter in a small dip in the ground out of the wind.

I noticed about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles away in the thick blanket of cloud, a red glowing disc-shaped object, stationary. I had no binoculars and so observed with the naked eye. The glow of the object penetrated the immediate cloud around it. I watched it for about 30 minutes, and then like a light going off it vanished.

The object did not re-appear to my knowledge. I thought of telling someone, but left it as I considered it un-important.



Please note that the object was in the clouds, but the shape could be made out.

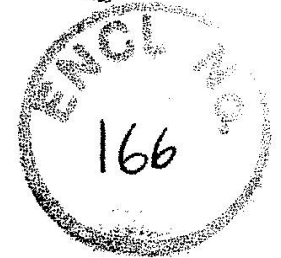

I am sorry to bother you once again on reporting such minor or trivial matters as these, but I felt urgent to write to you once again!

I would like to report the following 3 highly unusual incidents that happened over my home area outside of the Town of Workington, Cumbria, the North West region of the country.

INCIDENT ONE:- DATE:- 15/NOV/94

TUESDAY, NIGHT, TIME:-

8:45, ATMOSPHERICAL CONDITIONS: CLEAR AT TIMES, I was looking out of our roof light window from where we can see all over the Solway, and Scottish Hills, and the water, in order to see if it was still raining, or not! I suddenly noticed a very powerful amber globe of light hovering low over the town area, I opened the front window to see if I could hear convt/

any aircraft noise, there was none to be heard at all. At first I took this light source to be the planet Venus setting low over the Horizon, but it was more over our Town area, and the light did not flicker as a star would! Then the dark grey clouds passed over the light, and then the light source just wasn't there anymore to see, it vanished! * (I have another local witness who observed this same 'odd light form' on Monday night, this week.)

There are no lighthouses on our side of the coast, I don't think! This was very unusual indeed!

there was no noise made at all!

* Also late last night, at 15/NOV/94, my Mother could not sleep much, so she walked passed the roof-window, when she saw about 5x high altitude aircraft about 40,000' F.T. up she guessed, these aircraft exhibited only one single 'Amber coloured' light, and they were very close together indeed! And we all wondered if this was natural for any aircrafts, or Military ones?

Please could you check if any highly unusual aircraft where about on those dates and times enclosed, and let me know as soon as is possible? As it is very important indeed, as I have to let a reporter know for the 'Times & Star' newspaper in Workington! (As two fisherman had seen something at 1:45 in the morning
