

(Such differences reports could be dependent on the relative sharpness of eyesight of the witnesses --- and your current questionnaire doesn't ask whether glasses are usually worn or were being worn).

The timing of the event is excellent, beginning only 6 minutes after a predicted delivery from a sunset-orientated track, 54-degrees inclined. (See attached numerical computer output sheet).


By the way, I've recently taken the time to review my collection of those computer-processed runs which resulted in positive correlations with the Astronautical Model (which for the slowness of this response from accounts, in part, me). They cover the period 1950 to present day and there are 342 in total. 317 are British. Using my sort program, I've been able to identify the ground tracks most commonly followed by the hypothetical delivery/retrieval vehicles during that period of time. As you will see from the attached map, there are 26 of them -- ignoring those shown not listed; but the favoured ground tracks are linked with only 9 of the possible 21 'orbit' options covering these tracks relate to 293 British latitudes. Together, (92.4%) of the viable sightings.

The Glastonbury happening relates (time-wise and geographically) to the tracks labelled 54°/65°E (delivery) and 58°/51°E (retrieval) on the map.

Where tracks converge it could be expected that such locations might have the characteristics of 'ufocals'. 





- 3. As discussed therefore it seems more appropriate for CM to lead in replying.
- 4. For the record, we are not aware of any research into "antigravity" at British Aerospace Preston or elsewhere. As for "the enigma of the so called flying saucers" possibly Sec(AS)2a, to whom I have copied this correspondence, may have some views.







I have offered to do something for them for free to show them that I am legitimate in my yearn to work in National Security they can't even take the trouble to send me a security pass to do some research for them.

Will you try to resove this dispute, i.e. that they will at least give me a contact and an interview so that I may be of some value to the society, after all I have been wanting to do the job for twelve years and worked hard.

I take this opportunity to congratulate you on making the changes you did recently in reducing the size and capability of our defences; this will pave the way for a better, safer future, where peace will be the watch word and not war.

Your duty to our country is very demanding at best and I sympathise with you that often progress is difficult to forge, but for those who are willing to work for our National Security through a sense of loyalty and patriotism please let them do so.

I further, take this chance to wish you every success in implementing further changes to radically reform our defence, for a long time things have been running "unefficiently" with many people chasing paper in the MOD and you have weeded them out, good on you.

I wish there was more I could do for my country but if the Security Services won't even interview people before passing judgment, then I can't forsee that our projects of a sensitive nature will ever be secure. Too many secrets find their way under the door, I don't like that and I deerly would like to do something about it; sadly the people who could give me the opportunity are being difficult.

The research that I would like to access at British Aerospace at Preston in Lancashire concerns anti-gravity. The application could be made practical within the next thirty years, and I believe we may solve the enigma of the so called fling saucers simultaneosly.

You have always been a hard worker Mr. Rifkind, and so you can appreciate that it greaves me that I have worked hard and can't seem to embark on the career I am destined for.
