



## Enlightening news on that mystery

THE mystery of the strange, eerie lights spotted along the coast of Norfolk has been solved.

Dozens of people inundated the police, RAF and the Evening News with tales of whirling lights and UFOs appearing everywhere from Great Yarmouth to North Walsham and the Broads.

But the explanation is a more down-to-earth — new laser lights on the roof of a Hemsby amusement arcade!

Keen-eyed readers helped us trace the answer to the Hemsby area. Keith Bush, of Marham, told us: "You can see the lights clearly from here when the clouds are right."

Terry De'ath, owner of the Las Vegas arcade, has admitted that his lights, installed with permission from the Civil Aviation Authority, have caused all the fuss.

"They can be seen five or six miles away, and it has put us on the map," he said.

The Feek family, of George Pope Road, Catton, say a daily tirade of abuse, threats and violence has left them living in fear.

Mrs Feek's husband, Shaun, 27, said: "We've spent our last money on a minibus. We watch it all the time. If that gets damaged we'll have nothing."

Neighbour Liz Burne claims to have suffered similar abuse. "I can't let my children out to play in the garden anymore," she said.

Violent threats assaults on the Feek children — Joanna, seven, Roseanna, three, Shane, seven months — left the family ~~terrified~~ housebound. 106/1

Constant noise in smashing windows anonymous phone added to their misery.

"We've complained to the council and turned off services and the Citizens' Bureau," said Mrs Feek. "No one can help us."

She added that a booklet on tenants' retained information comment: "The council will tell us tomorrow if we can move in." Mrs Feek. "If we can't know what we'll do."

Alison Smith, Norfolk Council housing information officer, said: "We have given the Feeks a lot of advice on what action could pursue their case."

Michael Harvey, 64, from Scottow, near Coltishall, was flying the single-seater glider when it suddenly dropped, hit an electricity pole and crashed into a cornfield.

the accident, which occurred shortly after 4.30pm.



It then disappeared & we continued to just get on with the evening.


