



3. I explained our interest and role and said if any light was shed on his sighting then we would let him know. No evidence of defence concern yet.







1. At 2355 hours on Thursday 4th May 1995 the following named persons visited Chasetown Police Station, both in an agitated and distressed state reporting an alleged encounter with a U.F.O.

2. They were extremely excited and initially requested me to go outside and view a U.F.O. which was still visible. Myself and Sgt. [redacted] went to the front of the station. There was a red light visible in the far distance with white lights surrounding but these could quite easily have been a civil airline.

3. We returned to the Police Station and both youths attempted to convey to me what had allegedly happened. They stated that whilst walking up the Rugeley Road, Burntwood from the direction of the Nags Head Public House to Swan Island at approximately 2255 hours, at a point near the Fulfin School, they both experienced an intense heat. Their skin turned a glowing red. They then stated they saw a darkish silver inverted saucer shaped object in a field which was glowing red beneath, (brief drawing provided at time by Section 40 Appendix A). They stated the object was about four houses high in the sky and about forty foot away from them. They then, reluctantly, went on to state that a voice which came from a lemon like head, which appeared beneath the machine, said, "We want you, come with us". Both appeared upset and shocked and as it was increasingly difficult to obtain detailed information from them they were told to go home and write an account of what they thought they had experienced for our information.

4. On 5th May 1995 the attached written accounts of the 'encounter' were delivered to Chasetown Police Station, Appendix B from Section 40 Appendix C from Section 40

5. On 6th May 1995 the two informants were taken to the area and the exact location of 'sighting' pin pointed to P.C. Section 40 Enquiries locally reveal no further witnesses but a nearby resident stated a local farmer was crop spraying in a field at the material time. The farmer, Section 40 has been spoken to and confirms

the crop sprayer being used but stated he did not see any persons in the field, speak to anyone or see anything unusual.

He saw a craft hovering, it was bright electric blue in colour, but he ended up convincing himself that it was probably a balloon, once I explained that **Section 40** has balloon with lights inside. He wanted to take the details of BUFORA and Quest so I gave him their numbers.

For both instances, having explained our role and interest, I advised that if any information came to light from other sources, I would let them know.
