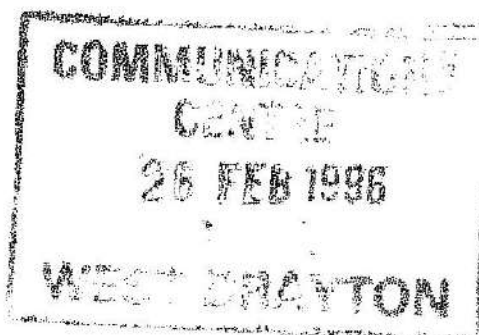

1. At about 22.00-22.15hrs on Sunday, 25 Feb 96, Section 40
Section 40 accompanied by her Section 40 daughter, was driving south from Aberystwyth on the A487 road. About half way between Blaenplwyf and Llanrhystud they saw a large pale (whiteish) light in the 11 o'clock position at an angle of 30-45° from the horizontal. The light was diffused or "watered down" and most unusual. It moved slowly from left to right across their path.
2. Shortly afterwards several white lights appeared from the area of the first sighting and proceeded to approach the car, passing over it very, very low ("skimmed the car") from right to left. These appeared to "become" an elliptical white light behind hills to the left of them which eventually went out. As the lights crossed the car the observers were looking up at, perhaps, an angle of 80°.
3. Section 40 seemed a very sensible and responsible person who does not believe in UFOs. However, neither she nor her daughter have ever seen anything like this before and, if we have an explanation, they would be interested to know.
4. The weather was cloudy at the time. Section 40
telephone number is Section 40. We have had no other reports of such sightings to date and I find it difficult to imagine the cause of this.

The gentleman reported the sighting over Felsted heading towards Braintree moving very, very fast and the white light appearing to "dodge and jink" about.
