Sir, The below person who is a retired police constable has reported that he observed an unidentified flying object pass over his house, (which is an end terrace in a good class area) twice at 7.25pm on Saturday 30th November 1996.

Section 40 was sober at the time, not on medication and is of sound mind and body, or appeared so.

The first sighting was of 8-10 seconds. The second sighting 5 minutes later was of a similar time span. The object was oval or spherical in shape, very large in size, much bigger than an aeroplane, hovering low in the sky with bright light shimmering all around it.

Section 40 viewed this with his naked eye whilst stood stationary outside in his rear garden facing South. The object some 4-5 miles away at first was steady then with great speed passed from his right to his left.

He went inside but was so amazed at what he saw a few minutes later went back into his rear garden. Again he saw this massive oval shimmering light in the position which he first saw it. Again it passed over him at great speed and then simply disappeared.

At the time of the incident it was dark, cloudy and calm. There are no objects of interest, Cathedrals etc, in the area. Section 40 has no unusual habits or mannerisms.
