





First it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so. As a result we are unable to assist with your particular query.

With regard to your particular observation, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for 14 January from anywhere in the UK. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised military aircraft.

During a press launch of the Federation of the University of Surrey and the University of Surrey Roehampton being held at the head office of HEFCE (Higher Education Funding Council of England) the following photograph was taken by Section 40 for the University of Surrey Students Union using a KODAK DC120 Digital Camera. No flash was used.

The photograph was taken through a window and held approx. 2 ft from the window surface. Upon return to the University I noticed that this photograph had an object within that appears to be floating in front of a cloud in the centre of the picture. After enlarging the image on computer it was obvious that the object is sitting in front of the cloud formation as the clouds rise behind the object - which itself is flat and reflecting the sunlight that is shining from behind the photographer (as you can see the shadow of the building in the foreground.) I have no recollection of faults in the window that could have cause such a prominent mark on the picture - no does that camera use convention developing methods to scratch or mark the film or print.

We are stumped. We will be running a story about this in our students newspaper in a weeks time. Any comments would be interesting.

My colleagues and I at The University of Surrey have decided to send this to you for your thoughts.
