A man claiming to have witnessed something very strange and unusual in the sky above Beeston approached me and said that he had taken some pictures of an object he had seen, and if I could help to offer an explanation as to exactly what this object was. The time of the sighting was between 2000 and 2020 hours on Sunday the 16th of April 2000 near Beeston in Cheshire not far from Crewe, the weather conditions were dry and the lighting was as to be expected just before dusk with the sun setting. The witness was in the area taking photographs of wildlife and also near by Beeston Castle, he was using a Cannon SLR camera and a 400 speed colour film. He claims that he saw this very bright light in the sky "pulsing" and apparently changing shape, and although he could not guess the height and distance from himself he was able to get some photographs of the object and some trees in to try to show some perspective. He witnessed this for about 2 minutes and managed to take several photographs the object then seem to vanish. 

I attach two reports that we have received from the Yorkshire area for 13 February 2000, with the informant's details blanked out to protect their confidentiality.

We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised military aircraft, which as you know from previous correspondence, is our only interest in these matters.



The decision whether to file an airmiss report or not is exclusively the pilot's and rests entirely on his/her subjective assessment of the circumstances. This is because it is very difficult for someone on the ground, even for experienced observers, to estimate the absolute and relative heights and speeds of the aircraft, especially when the aircraft concerned are some distance away.
