
Dear Sir or Madam:



Thank you for your letter of 8 November in response to my colleague, Section 49 letter of 6 November 2000.

Firstly, you question the meaning of Section 20 comment that we were satisfied that there was no breach of UK airspace by unauthorised military aircraft. It may be helpful if I explain that the integrity of the UK's airspace in peacetime is maintained through continuous policing of the UK Air Defence Region by the Royal Air Force. This is achieved by using a combination of civil and military radar installations, which provide a continuous real-time "picture" of the UK airspace. Any threat to the UK Air Defence Region would be handled in the light of the particular circumstances at the time (it might if deemed appropriate, involve the scrambling or diversion of air defence aircraft). From that perspective, reports provided to us of 'UFO' sightings are examined, but consultation with air defence staff and others as necessary is considered only where there is sufficient evidence to suggest a breach of UK air space. Unless there is such evidence we do not attempt to identify what might have been seen. It is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. Only a handful of reports in recent years have warranted further investigation and none revealed any evidence of a threat.

With regard to your comments about the reports you send to us, I can assure you that all reports we receive are examined in light of our limited defence interest.

You also mention problems you have had with your telephone line and mail, and believe this is connected to the Ministry of Defence and your interest in 'UFOs'. I can assure you the Ministry of Defence has no interest in your private telephone calls or post. You say you have contacted the Police and I suggest you pursue this matter with them.

Thank you for your letter dated 6th November concerning the matter of St. Anne's Hill, Egham, Surrey. Can I presume that the wording in your letter of "unauthorized military aircraft" to mean that you were aware it was there and that it had permission to use this air space or can you not comment on this either?

I am well aware of your policy and non-interest in the UFO phenomena in British air space, therefore in future would you like my organisation to report these to you as and when they are given to me? As it is at the moment, I have only sent you reports that have been unusual, if I were to send you all reports I get, you would be inundated with letters from me.

I would also like to ask the following question "Is it your department who would arrange phone tapping and mail interception?" Both I feel are currently happening to myself and my family. Today during a conversation with a friend our connection was cut and we were both unable to obtain dialing tone for at least 20 minutes. I have experienced echoing and clicks on my line when I receive incoming calls and also this happens when I make outgoing calls. For the last 3 years I have had my mail withheld, parcels and letters going missing or tampered with and have now involved the local police with this matter. There have also been occasions when strange vehicles with formally dressed occupants have been seen sitting outside my home and place of work. Once they have been spotted by me they usually drive off.

I am not happy about the intimidation in fact I am very angry that it is happening at all as my small UFO investigation group poses no threat to national security in any shape or form.

Perhaps you will pass this letter on the relevant department if you do not deal with this yourself, as I would be keen to hear an explanation as to why my address and phone number appears to be a target.



Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the UK from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting.

It may be helpful if I explain that the integrity of the UK's airspace in peacetime is maintained through continuous policing of the UK Air Defence Region by the Royal Air Force. This is achieved by using a combination of civil and military radar installations, which provide a continuous real-time "picture" of the UK airspace. Any threat to the UK Air Defence Region would be handled in the light of the particular circumstances at the time (it might if deemed appropriate, involve the scrambling or diversion of air defence aircraft). From that perspective, reports provided to us of 'UFO' sightings are examined, but consultation with air defence staff and others as necessary is considered only where there is sufficient evidence to suggest a breach of UK air space.

In your letter you also talk of problems you and other 'UFO' investigators/groups have had with your telephone lines and mail. As I have already described, the Ministry of Defence has only a limited interest in 'UFO' sightings. We have no interest in the private telephone calls or post of individuals interested in this subject. If you believe that your telephone calls and mail are being tampered with I suggest you contact your telephone company, the Royal Mail and/or the Police.

I would like to report 2 incidents that might be of interest to the MOD.

Firstly on Monday 30th Oct at approx. 9am my daughterection 40 aged 9 years) and myself witnessed a UFO over Plumstead in London. While I was walking my daughter to school we were in Herbert Road (Plumstead) and saw a descending glowing white sphere (similar to things our members have previously filmed.... See UFO'S Over London an Enigma Channel Video). This was observed in the direction of the Docklands City Airport. It was moving from West to East directly in line with the Docklands City Airport, but in my opinion probably within their aircraft's flightpaths. All aircraft into the Docklands City Airport come in East to West.... The opposite direction for a descending aircraft. Probably at an altitude of below 200' (below ATC ground radar). The object was about the size of a small pea at arms length, round, illuminated from within, (a sort of glowing white) and looked three dimensionally solid. It descended across the sky at a rate I would describe as slightly faster than the approach speed of aircraft into the airport, then it picked up speed rapidly & vanished behind a house. This interestingly enough is in almost the exact location of a large cylindrical UFO reported by several people (and data forwarded to your dept around 2 years ago). This in my opinion was no civilian aircraft, balloon, satellite, space station alpha, Venus etc etc... and as unidentified was in clear breach of UK airspace and possibly endangering civilian life in the vicinity of the Docklands City Airport. We are very sorry for the delay forwarding this to you, but there have been a few problems with weather & other things this end.

Secondly (8th Nov) today at about 1.25 while discussing a case with another UFO investigator that was reported to you, both our phone lines were cut off simultaneously. These were down for more than 10 minutes. The other investigator Section 40 of UPN Investigations Tel: Section 40 section 40 was also reported this matter to you and the Police. We were actually discussing a reply she had received recently from your department that appears to have been intercepted and rather poorly re-sealed etc (part of the usual intimidation techniques?). Perhaps you would like to shed some light on the heavy-handed surveillance we and other investigators are receiving? Interception Of Communications never answer the phone, when the phone does run through to their answerphone, they never reply & they have not replied to one letter in the last year, though promising to look into the matter in late 1999. Odd?





Anomalous aircraft 7 Miles North of Knutsford 21st October 2000 at 06:45

Dear sir/madam,

I am enquiring about an aircraft which was observed by a witness at 06:45 on the 21st October 2000 approximately 7 miles North of Knutsford services on the M6. I would appreciate it if you could tell me of any military aircraft exercises that would have resulted in an aircraft flying from West to East across the M6 at this time. The Merseyside Anomalies Research Association (MARA) has classified this aircraft as of unknown origin for the following reasons.


- 1) The aircraft was triangular in shape
- 2) It had 3 stroboscopes flashing in unison on each point of the triangular airframe.
- 3) It did not display red and green port and starboard lights.
- 4) It had what looked like a large fluorescent tube running almost the full length of the trailing edge.
- 5) It was flying dangerously low near pylons, (estimated between 200 and 300 feet).
- 6) The witness has a keen interest in aircraft and is familiar with most types of aircraft and therefore unlikely to mistake a conventional aircraft for what he saw.

From point 2, I am aware that many aircraft have 3 stroboscopes but it is unusual for them to flash in unison. From point 4, the witness and I are not aware of any aircraft with a rear light such as that described. From point 5 if the witnesses assessment of altitude is correct, then there would appear to be a danger to the public and the aircraft.

As stated in point 6, the witness has a keen interest in aircraft and has attended many air shows, the last one being the Royal International Air Tattoo at RAF Fairford in 1999. At this display, he observed the F117 stealth fighter and the B2 Spirit bomber, so he is familiar with non-conventional military aircraft shapes but insists that the aircraft he spotted fitted none of them. He has also stated that the altitude estimate comes from experience at air displays and describes the height of the display low passes as being similar to the height of the aircraft North of Knutsford. He also lives less than 2 miles from Liverpool Airport and is used to seeing low flying aircraft at night.

If you can either confirm or deny any military air exercises in the area around Knutsford, you would assist us greatly in our endeavour to classify this aircraft. In the unlikely event that you believe this to be an invasion of our airspace by a foreign power, we will supply further details and diagrams.
