





Report Concerning Unidentified Aircraft.

Date, Time: 23/7/2001, c.11.00 am

The back garden at home, on the edge of Perton, 6 Location:

miles West of Wolverhampton, South Staffordshire (approx. 8 miles S-E of RAF Cosford, 23 miles N-W

Birmingham Airport).

warm and sunny, very clear; blue sky partly Weather:

covered with (low) slow moving cumulus cloud.

My Circumstances:

I was writing while sitting on a bench. I paused to watch a high-flying passenger aeroplane low-down on my left, travelling roughly in a NW-SE direction. I watched its vapour trail and then, after it had lost its vapour trail, continue until approximately overhead. I then noticed the second item as described below.

Setting:

I was immediately taken by this object as it was very different to the passenger plane. It appeared much lower as it constituted a much larger image size. It was nearly overhead when I saw it and, as it was coming towards me, had presumably flown from over the house. It appeared to be travelling very fast in a roughly North-East South-West direction. Unfortunately my siting was very brief, lasting perhaps only 3-4 seconds and ending as it disappeared above the cloud, but it was otherwise very clear and unobstructed.

Description:

My immediate reaction was of a rocket, which then changed to something resembling a large 'missile' (the former was probably more accurate). It was difficult to see detail because of the speed it was going. Its basic appearance was of a reasonably long and thin aircraft, of which only the body was really visible.

Initially I noticed the underside which appeared to have two outer parallel lines which appeared to protrude (or were simply darker), with it being slightly concave in the middle. It may also have been darker, possibly circular, at the far end. As it passed above me, and I saw it side-on, the sun reflected on its surface momentarily - an area of it glistened and appeared clearly metallic, but not coloured (it appeared dull or greyish overall). The reflection was not along the whole side but just in one small area (in the manner of sun on water).

It may have been uneven or had markings on its side but it was blurred and simply travelling too fast to tell. At no time did I notice any shape regarding either its nose or tail, or any signs of wings. All I was aware of as it entered into the clouds was its rapid speed.

Immediately afterwards I heard the distant 'rumble' and echo of the passenger jet, but this was not interrupted, magnified or altered by any other sound. I waited to see the object emerge from the clouds but did not sight it again. It left no trail and appeared to make no noticeable noise whatsoever.

It happened so quickly that I doubt whether anyone else nearby could have spotted it (including my parents who were working in the garden at the time).

Height:

This is difficult to estimate as I am not familiar with the height of clouds. The initial passenger plane, which flew across a clear part of the sky, was distinctly visible and not at the very high altitude of some aircraft. I can only describe the height of the clouds as typical for a warm summer's day.

My Conclusion:

Initially I thought of something like space-debris, but the aircraft appeared to be lower than this so this may not be the correct explanation. It appeared to be travelling in a line as an aircraft (ie., not up or down).

Mvself:

I am not a trained observer, although I look at the sky more than most. I have long been interested in astronomy and bird-watching. I have seen many types of aircraft; ie. an increasing number of passenger planes at home overhead, sometimes low-flying jets, as well as those from air shows at a nearby airbase. Unfortunately, I am not particularly familiar with meteorology. But this was very different to anything I have seen before.

I would like to inform you about a further two UFO sightings that we have received.

1st report is from Liverpool and is dated 7.7.01 time 17.00 hours:

It was around 5pm my wife & were walking with our two children, when I pointed out a plane to my 2 year old boy, following the vapour trail back in the sky, just stationary in the sky was what I can only describe as an orb (like the ones seen in Mexico), we watched it for about two minutes, when I said to my wife well go back to our house and get our camcorder, we rushed back, but by the time id got outside again the object was nowhere to be seen.

2nd Our witness was travelling along the A638 to join M1 at Junction 40 the date was 10.7.01 the time 8.10am and she made this report to us:

"As I glanced up I saw a commercial aircraft travelling at altitude in an easterly direction, (traveling away from me.) It was clearly visible, complete with vapour trial and it was being followed by a silver ball that I judged to be at the same altitude. I am sure you will agree that one report alone was interesting but now I have received three reports ALL that contain a silver ball or orb following various flights.




I wonder if you would be kind enough to help me identify a sighting of an unidentified flying object that I witnessed with a member of my family tonight?


Today's date is Sunday 8th July, the time 10.15pm. My location was in North West London, facing what I believe to be a westerly direction. I stood looking out of my kitchen window when I noticed what I first thought the planet Venus. It puzzled me because it was not in the position that I knew it should be, this made me stare a little harder at it. (Note – I used to be an amateur astronomer, so I am aware of the positions of planets etc.) I watched the object for a few minutes before I realized that it was actually moving. I quickly ruled out conventional aircraft because it was far to high and there was also no other flashing lights etc. There was also no sound. It was very similar to a satellite that flew over London a few months ago. The object was exactly like a star and moved very slowly, more slowly that the satellite previously mentioned. I also ruled out a comet because I have also seen them a few times, this was controlled and very near the earths upper atmosphere. I watched the object for at least 20 minutes before it finally disappeared in cloud cover. I also watched the object through a pair of binoculars and it was definitely not a star, I can confirm this by the distance it traveled in 20 minutes.

If you could investigate this for me, I would appreciate it. I checked online at http://www.heavens-above.com/ for possible NASA projects, comets or European rockets/satellites but none were visible over that section of the sky at that time


