Dear Sir/Madam,

On the 26th of November 2001 a man and his wife witnessed a large orange ball hovering over South Elmsall, which is near Pontefract, West Yorkshire. The time he gave me was between 7.30pm and 8.00pm. He could not give me an exact time, as he was not wearing his watch. From his position, which was near Hooton Pagnal, which over looks South Elmsall, he said that he stopped his vehicle and watched this thing through binoculars for twenty minutes.

He told me that he could not see any more detail through the binoculars except that it was very large and brighter than a streetlight.

He then carried on to South Elmsall where he lives. When he arrived at home he saw it again quite close to his position above South Elmsall. He then observed it a further minute or so and then it moved away at high speed to the north. No noise was heard from the object. Cloud cover was a quarter. He says that he could see other people watching it from the street.

Could you please tell me if you received any reports of anything similar on that date?

Could you possibly send me details of any reports of unusual objects seen that day?

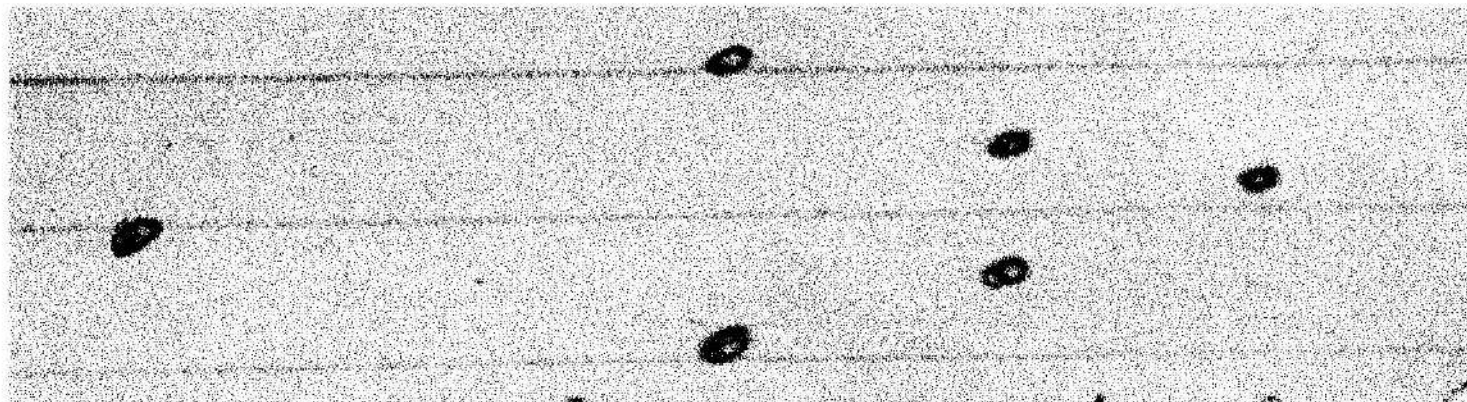
"I watched two lights, which were brighter than the surrounding stars, move close together. One was always on constantly, but then two lights appeared either side and would flash and appear to "dance" around the central light in various formations. On one occasion, several lights appeared either side of the central light."





At approximately 21.30, a greenish searchlight appeared, directed downward. It was illuminated several times for approximately 10 seconds and had a sweeping motion. From about 21.45 onwards, as the lights had come closer, I saw white search light beams between the lights, several times. The central light moved very slowly westwards in a pulsating manner and appeared to hover."

"At approximately 22.10, the searchlight came on again several times. It swept over the site where I was standing. At this point the lights were closer and S/SE to where I was standing."

I am writing with reference to your report of a sighting of an 'unidentified flying object' on 5 November 2001 which was passed to this office by the Aeronautical Information Service (Military) at RAF West Drayton. We are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, MOD does not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular observation, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for 5 November from Surrey. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.


